Dear Sisters and Brothers,

This Sunday, we begin a five-week reading of the Letter of James. This book of the New Testament is actually less of a "letter" than it is a book of exhortations. It is similar in structure to the wisdom books of the Hebrew Scriptures. James insists that

belief and ethical living go hand in hand and that one cannot be part of a Christian's life without the other.

In today's reading, James writes that we should humbly welcome the word that has been planted in [us] and is able to save your souls. He then says, *"Be doers of the word and not hearers only, deluding yourselves."*

In James' view, a life based on following Jesus Christ is more than simply knowing the Scriptures (and, I think we could also say, the teachings of the Church). It is easy to memorize Scripture verses and passages, and we can all recite Church teachings we learned as children. While that is a good thing, James insists that we must put these into practice in our daily lives. This is not to somehow earn our way into heaven, as some believe. It is a response to receiving the word that God has planted in our hearts. God's word is alive, and it is the Holy Spirit who plants it into our hearts. The Holy Spirit teaches and empowers us to live out God's word.

Over the next five Sundays, I invite you to listen carefully to the second reading at Mass. Better yet, take your Bible off the bookshelf and read the entire Letter of James yourself. If you find one or two passages that lead you to reflect on how you live your life as a follower of Christ, you will begin to open yourself to the promptings of the Holy Spirit, and learn to follow Christ just a little more closely.

Family Formation

UPLIFT Families Registration is now OPEN!

"Uniting People Living In Faith and Truth" (UPLIFT) Families is a family faith formation (religious education) for children entering K3-8th grade and their parents/caregivers from the parishes of Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist, Old St. Mary, Our Lady of Divine Providence, SS. Peter and Paul, and Three Holy Women.

Children and parents/caregivers receive formation in community to equip the whole family to actively engage and live out the faith. Meetings are twice a month: late September – April on **either Wednesday evenings (5:30 – 7:30 pm) or Sunday mornings (10:45am – 12:45pm)**. An optional community meal is provided for all families to enjoy before the children go to their age-specific classrooms and parents engage in their own faith lesson.

Wednesday Program

- All formation will be offered in English.
- Optional community dinner provided from 5:15pm until programming begins.

Sunday Program

- Parent and some child formation will be offered in Spanish and English.
- Optional community light breakfast provided from 10:15am until programming begins.
- **Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS)** lessons for K3-K5. CGS invites children to encounter Christ through a Montessori-based learning environment.
- Childcare for children 3 years and younger will be offered.

Sacrament Preparation - First Reconciliation and First Communion

Sacramental preparation meetings and a retreat are offered for children in second grade (or older) and their parents/caregivers. Second graders prepare for both First Reconciliation and First Communion in the same year. If the child does not attend a Catholic School, the family will be required to participate in UPLIFT Families (Wed or Sun program) to support their faith formation, in addition to the sacrament prep classes and retreat. If a child attends a Catholic School, only the two sacrament prep classes and retreat are required.

The location of all UPLIFT Families classes will be at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist **Atrium**, 831 N. Van Buren St.

We don't know where this will take us but we want to make an invitation to anyone who has an interest in joining us in this endeavor. We will be reading, How to Avoid a Climate Disaster:

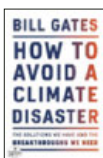
The Solutions We Have and the Breakthroughs
