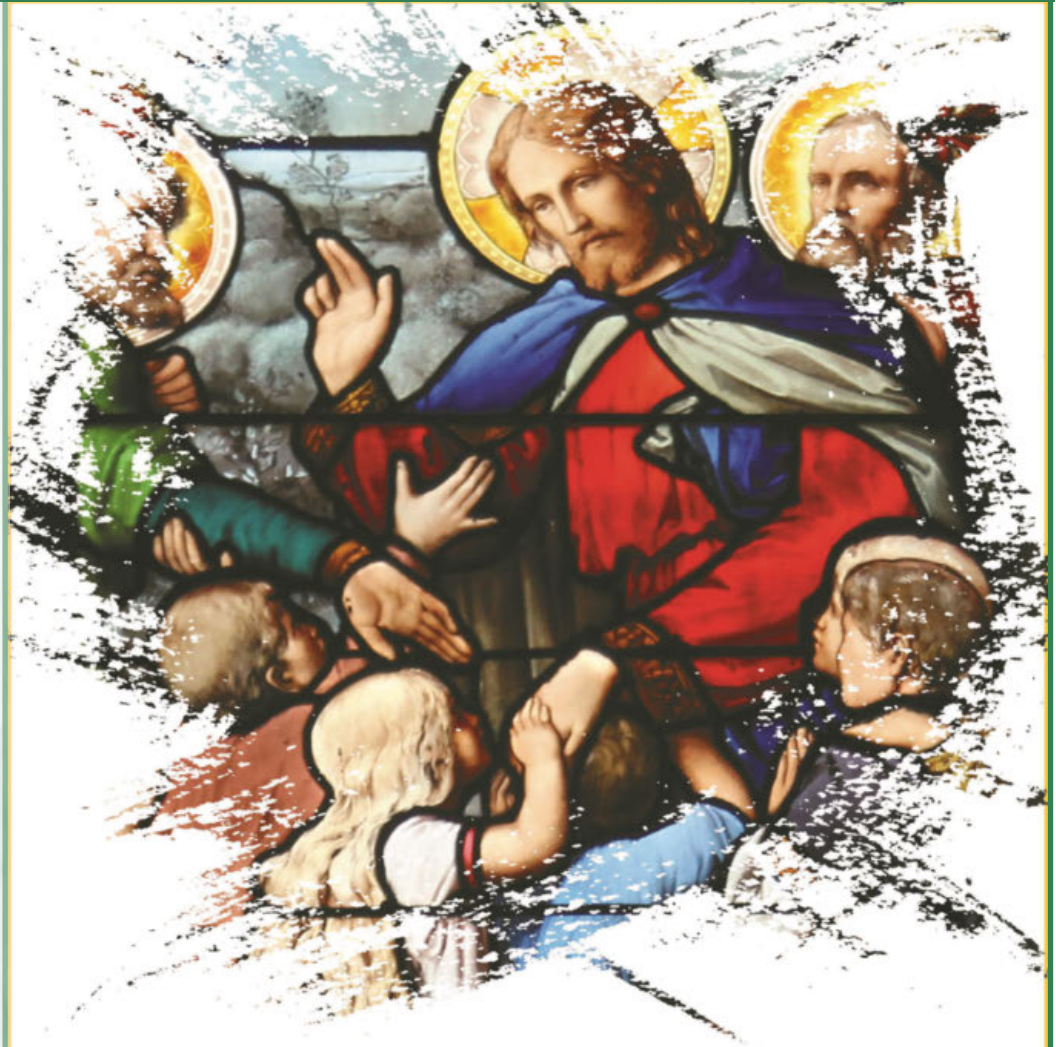

Dear Friends,

Jesus must have had his patience tried in this Sunday's Gospel as he finally reveals the course of events that will lead to his suffering, but also the glory of the Resurrection. As he talks about this great unfolding of the mystery of salvation, his disciples are arguing about who amongst them is the greatest. Man, talk about missing the point. I was taken back to coaches who said things like "There is no 'I' in team," and "All for one, one for all", and I wish the disciples, our ancestors in the faith, would have said - "We are with you, Jesus! Bring it on, and we will face it together!"

In a time of history in which cooperation and collaboration seem dirty words, and respectful dialogue and civil disagreement even worse, perhaps we are being challenged to start with small victories. Jesus faced the inadequacies of his first followers not with anger or disappointment, but as one more chance to teach his followers to become more child-like, not childish, more innocent and open, more part of a team and not operating with selfishness. Perhaps we can start with small acts of kindness even with those most different from us, and even most disagreeable to us. Perhaps the simpler and smaller, the more powerful in effecting real change for the better: not our plans, but God's plan of renewal for all! God's call of unity!

We are with you, Jesus! Bring it on and we will face it together!

Saint Vincent de Paul

History of the Saint Vincent de Paul Society

On September 27, we celebrate the feast of St. Vincent de Paul, the Patron Saint of the St. Vincent de Paul Society. Vincent was a priest during the 17th century well known for his compassion, humility, and generosity and is recognized as the "Great Apostle of Charity." His teachings about God's special presence in the poor are revolutionary even in our day. The St. Vincent de Paul Society was established in Paris, in 1833, as an organization of faith by young men and women who wanted to more fully live their faith. This year will mark the 179th year of the Society's presence in the United States. The first parish conference in Milwaukee was formed in 1848. The Society is represented by 45 conferences throughout our Catholic parishes. Essential to the foundation of a conference is a focus on the elements of Spirituality, Friendship and Service as inspired by the Society's founding members and patron, Saint Vincent de Paul.

We dedicate time to showing Christ's love to people experiencing poverty, suffering and need. We invite you to serve people in need in our parish area by joining the Society of St. Vincent de Paul and helping us to provide clothes, beds, bedding, appliances and household items. We invite you to see Christ in our 'friends in need'.

Beacon Moms and Bacon Dads Small groups starting in October!

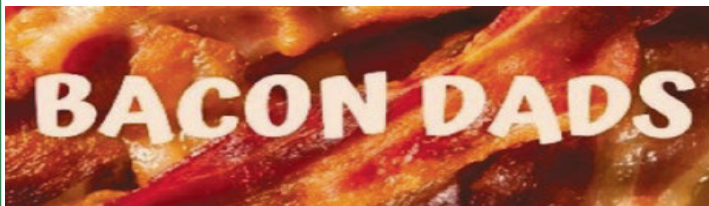

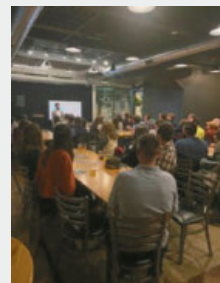
UPLIFT Teen High School Ministry Sign Up!
