Sister Parish: La Sagrada Familia



The comfort and confidence a well-constructed home with strong walls and a roof provides is incalculable and invaluable for many in our sister parish community. A home can afford a much-needed layer of stability to a family in which job insecurity, feeding children, and housing are basic issues to contend with. Providing homes has improved the lives of families in this regard. The need still persists and continues to grow. Previously constructed homes have led to direct and tangible benefits, such as bringing joy and pride to an elderly man who has planted a plantain garden next to his home. A family is adding a second level to their home for their growing children. Additionally, another home went to a family whose parents are both HIV positive, allowing them to be in a safe place and minimizing the chance of infections. The housing needs of the poor and vulnerable are basic yet go a long way toward providing security, self-confidence, pride, and happiness. We often think of warm-weather countries close to the ocean as paradise, but the reality is that in our sister parish community, a lack of good jobs to support a family and a weak social security system can severely stress a family already stressed by not having good and basic housing.

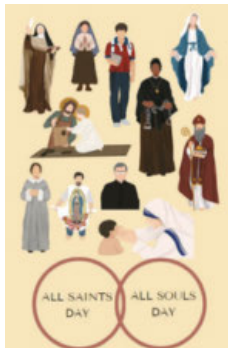

The Confirmation Retreat is coming up! Pray for our High Schoolers!

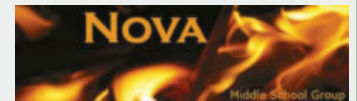

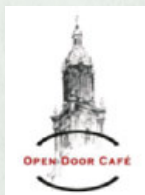

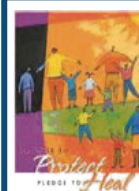
