





How We Help Others

I am asked many times where we get our referrals. If a "neighbor in need" calls 211 and needs beds, appliances, or household items they are referred to St. Vincent de Paul. We are one of the few organizations that help with these items. We also receive calls from families, where they remember as a child that St. Vincent de Paul members came to their home, or that a relative or friend needed help also. The family then calls our Council office for Milwaukee where a staff member will take their information and request. The information is then sent to the Conference in their neighborhood for us to follow up with them and schedule a home visit. We receive six to sometimes ten families a week. We are one of the busiest of the 42 conferences for Milwaukee.

Many of our families wait until the very last minute to call us and some even apologize for having called. They are concerned that assisting them might deprive somebody "who really needs help". Some will call and only ask for beds for their children and when we ask the mother if they have a bed, their response is they only want help for their children. We explain to them we prioritize beds and will include a bed for them as well.

For each person we meet who tells us this, how many more are there who never call. It isn't that they are in denial about their immediate needs. They simply do not see themselves as "the poor" because their needs are only temporary. Many have told us they thought they could save enough each month and then could buy beds for their children. They sometimes choose to just "tough it out". Some of them finally called after months of sleeping on the floor and then will call when they realize they have had to pay other bills. Many times, we have needed to tell them about our donations from parishioners and can bring basic kitchen items and bedding.

It is our friendship, understanding, and advocacy that will make it clear to all that we are here for all of our neighbors. Unlike an agency, we don't ask the neighbor to "qualify" or prove they are poor enough to be deserving of help. No work of charity is foreign to the Society. Sometimes it is a handout, sometimes it is a hand up, sometimes it is a helping hand, but always it must be a handshake of respect, of understanding, and of welcome. Again, thank you for all the donations of needed items such as kitchen items or bedding. Almost every family we see is in need of these items. You can always drop them off at St. Hedwig's office during the week.


