

Pastor's Corner



Merry Christmas! Happy Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord!

As many of you know, I love the liturgy of the Church. When we hear the word "liturgy," we often think of Mass; however, the church's liturgy is so much more than Mass. Liturgy is the public work of the church, which includes Mass, the celebration of the sacraments, and the liturgy of the hours among other public

acts of prayers. The liturgy of the hours is the daily prayer of the church that clergy and many religious are required to pray. Some beautiful antiphons and readings come from the liturgy of the hours that many people never pray or hear.

Today includes one of my favorite antiphons of the year, which is prayed during evening prayer on Sunday night: "Three mysteries mark this holy day: today the star leads the Magi to the infant Christ; today water is changed into wine for the wedding feast; today Christ wills to be baptized by John in the river Jordan to bring us salvation." What a beautiful statement connecting these three great mysteries. Jesus reveals himself through these three events to show the world that he has come to bring us in communion with God. When we read the story of the Magi, the church invites us to not only think of this moment in Christ's life but to connect it to these other moments to allow Jesus to reveal himself in our lives as well.


I pray you have time in the remaining Christmas season to reflect on how the Lord reveals himself in your lives.

Centering Prayer is a Christian form of meditation that serves as a method of movement into contemplative prayer. It is a powerful way to open ourselves and invite the Holy Spirit's healing, support, inspiration, and guidance into our everyday lives, leading us to become better able to love, work with, and serve others.

Fr. Thomas Keating and two other Trappist monks, Fathers William Meninger and Basil Pennington, developed Centering Prayer in response to Vatican II's call to revive the contemplative teachings of early Christianity and present them in updated formats.

"Why on earth would they do that?" we sometimes ask ourselves after a home visit in which the neighbor in need explains a decision they have made which makes no sense to us. Perhaps they've used their last dollars to pay a past due cable bill, and the rent is due next week. Or they have used the tax refund on a new TV.

In their book, 'Scarcity', authors Sendhil Mullainathan and Edgar Shafir examine how human decision-making and abilities are affected when resources become scarce. Whether it is money, food, or even time that is insufficient, or barely sufficient for our needs, we don't tend to make rational decisions. It's not a matter of wealth or education. Very busy people, for example, for whom time is scarce, often mismanage the time they have.

For the poor, of course, scarcity is a constant in their lives. We should hardly be surprised that some of their decisions make no sense to those of us who have in abundance what the poor lack. Scarcity is not affecting our thinking. At the same time, while we set aside our judgement, as we are called to do, and set about trying to provide for whatever scarcity we can address: love.

"Man cannot live without love" Pope St. John Paul II reminds us. Vincentians never forget that giving love, talents and time is more important than giving money. The material assistance we offer such as beds or appliances is meant not to create false abundance, but to demonstrate God's love, o be God's instrument in providing what is needed. It is the poor who evangelize Christ's suffering with us. In turn, we evangelize first by fulfilling Christ's promise to provide for their needs, and through our works, offering the true abundance that sweeps away the scarcity: the abundance of God's love, and his Hope.


