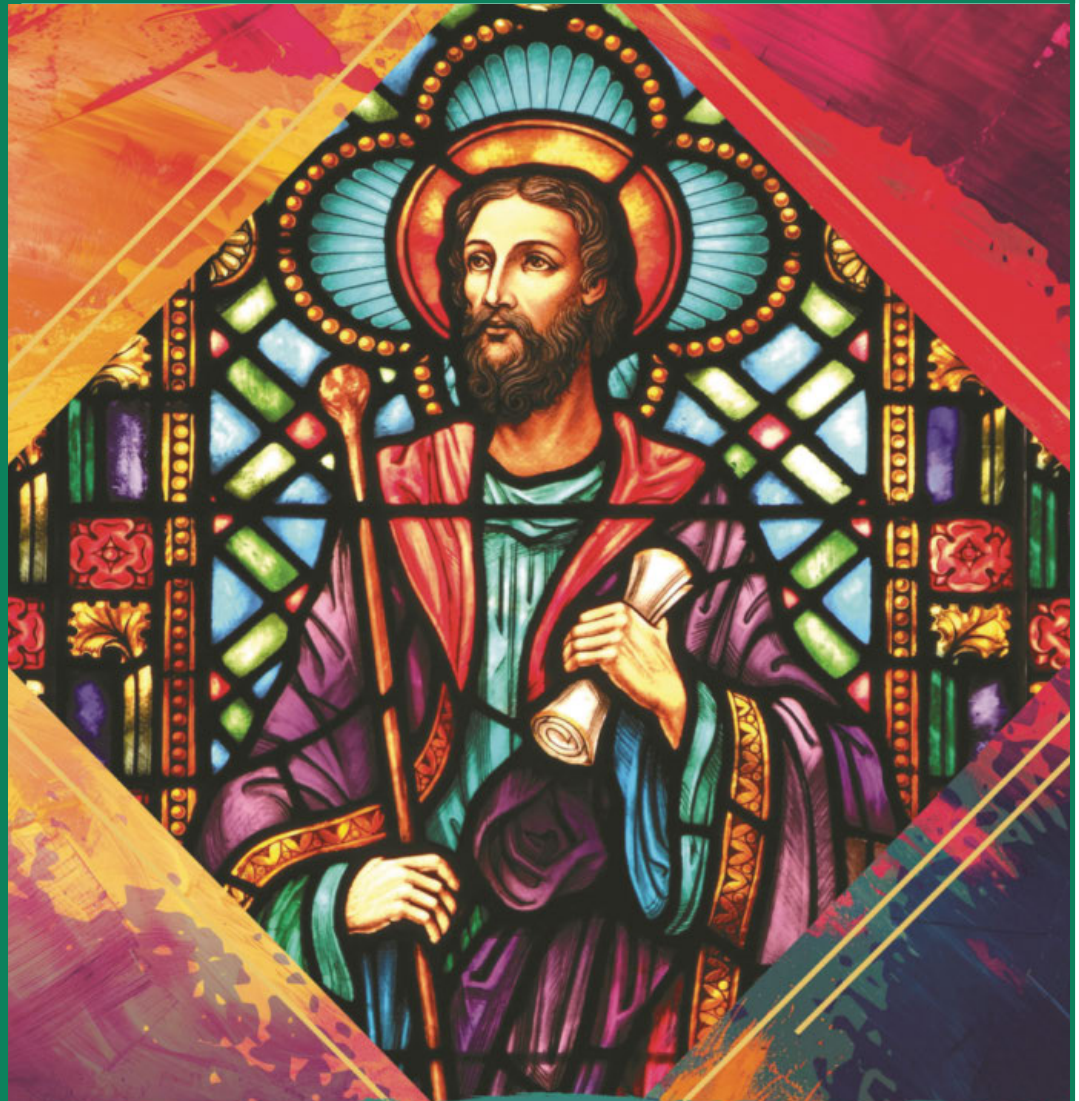

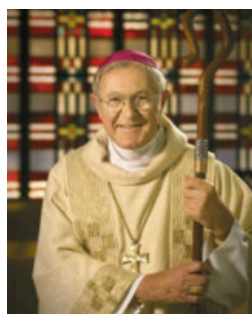

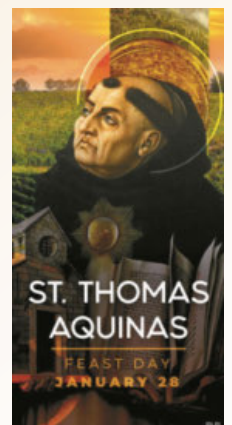
Vocations Fair

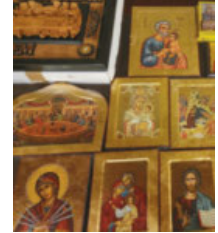

Sale: Religious Items from the Holy Land

The Shepherd And The Lost Sheep representatives from Bethlehem will be at St. Casimir and Ss. Peter and Paul churches after all Masses, January 25 and 26, selling religious articles and other crafts from the region. The last few years have been very tough for the Christian families. Sixty years ago, they made up 18% of the population but now are less than 2% of the population in the Holy Land due to events in the Middle East. The families are facing devastating economic strain since they relied on tourists to purchase their religious, hand-carved olive wood items as their only source of income. Wafa AISahouri has come to the US and is trying to help support these families by bringing their artifacts here to sell. All proceeds from sales are sent back to the families of the Holy Land so that they may be able to keep their homes and provide for their families.
