

# Love Story

The St. Vincent de Paul motto is "Serving in Hope". Hope can be a powerful feeling, a state of mind that keeps us going through great difficulties. It is a light at the end of the tunnel, the silver lining and the gain we seek. But the hope in which Vincentians serve is much more than a feeling or a motivation - it is a virtue and a grace to be shared.

There is no doubt that the material supports we offer to our neighbors is important. Not having enough food for the children, no stove or refrigerator, no beds to sleep in, can lead to hopelessness. All the beds, household items, appliances, and bedding that offer some small relief for our neighbor's suffering is vital. As St. James reminds us, if all we do is wish the poor well, "but do not give them the necessities of the body, what good is it? So also faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead."

These works are not enough by themselves; works without faith are no less empty than faith without works, and visits are not just merely dropping items off, but to form relationships based on trust and friendship. Our visits, our encouragement, and our prayers serve most importantly to bring true hope. Hope is that which fills the heart, it is a hope that grows from the love of a God who holds each of us precious in his sight.

God's love is eternal, and our first responsibility in serving the poor is to do so for love alone, in the hope that through our caring "the poor may catch a glimpse of God's great love for them."
