Pastor's Corner



Dear Friends,

This weekend, Jesus says in the Gospel, "If you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners do the same". And yes, this is a very hard thing to do. In fact, left to my own strength and capabilities, what Jesus is proposing in the Gospel is impossible to do. Our trust is, therefore, that Jesus will provide us with what we need to do things like loving our enemies and never

judging others. It is the Christian thing to do and, no matter how virtuous a person is, without practicing what Jesus lays out in the Gospel this weekend, we are not of Christ.

Two weeks ago, I shared about my appointment to studies in Rome, Italy and said I would be leaving in September of this year. In this regard, I have an update to share, namely, it has been determined that my last day at the parishes be June 24, 2025 and that I travel to Rome that week. As I process and prepare for what it will mean to leave the parishes in June, I want to share my love and gratitude with each of you. I look forward to being your fellow Christian and parish priest until then.

If I may, from now on, I will write my bulletin columns in both English and Spanish to make our Spanish speaking parishioners feel more so part of our Family of Parishes.

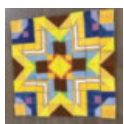
La Familia de Arte

"Hope Does not Disappoint" - SPES NON CONFUNDIT Pope Francis

Pope Francis refers to those in prison when he writes, "During the Holy Year, we are called to be tangible signs of hope for those of our brothers and sisters who experience hardships of any kind. I think of prisoners who, deprived of their freedom, daily feel the harshness of detention and its restrictions, lack of affection, and, in more than a few cases, lack of respect for their persons. I propose that in this Jubilee Year, governments undertake initiatives aimed at restoring hope; forms of amnesty or pardon meant to help individuals regain confidence in themselves and society; and programs of reintegration in the community, including a concrete commitment to respect for the law."



This Lent, the Family of Five Parishes will focus on this message from Pope Francis. He has designated a set of Holy Doors at the Rebibbia prison on the outskirts of Rome as, "a symbol of all the prisons dispersed throughout the world," to deliver a message of hope to prisoners.

Our Lenten Almsgiving theme, Door of Mercy, will center on Prison ministries, supporting the Cathedral Prison Ministry, local Ren-entry Programs here in our community and take a more significant step toward a Global Prison Ministry for La Sagrada Familia in the Dominican Republic (Archdiocese and the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist support as a sister parish).

We will also offer Rice Bowls for Catholic Relief Services, which serves millions of our most vulnerable sisters and brothers who face life-threatening levels of hunger, food insecurity, and malnutrition.

In the coming weeks, you will see and hear more presentations about how to financially assist these programs.

Caregivers and Prayer

Caregiving can be a prayer, if we approach it with attention and love. We may pray by reminding ourselves of God's presence in the large and small acts we perform every day, by handing someone a glass of water, performing treatments that require complex skill, changing diapers, or simply listening. Our prayer may involve reflecting on the events of the day, marveling at our participation in the mystery of other people's lives, or grappling with our feelings of helplessness, anger, or inadequacy. We can ask God for whatever we need or give thanks for whatever is.

Prayer is often described as an awareness of God's presence, and our response to that awareness. God dwells with us and among us, everywhere, at all times, and God is always present in our caregiving. Prayer may be a powerful source of strength and consolation. While praying, we remind ourselves that God stands with us in our caregiving. We recall that God is never absent in the rewarding times, when everything goes well and we feel full of light and blessing, nor in the dark times, when things are especially difficult. Prayer expresses our wonder and gratitude during the hopeful times and our need for understanding, support, patience and guidance in the trying times.

Because prayer is an intimate expression of our unique relationship with God, each of us will pray differently. God lives within us; we give expression to God's life in us through our unique love. We need to trust God's presence and pray in whatever way we find helpful.

CAREGIVERS

Lord, we pray for those who serve others as caregivers, that they may exhibit Your care. Let them be Your hands in administering Your love, whether they serve children, the mentally or physically impaired, or the elderly. Strengthen them when their responsibilities are heavy. When those whom they serve lack gratitude, let them find joy in knowing that in serving others they are serving You. Amen.

ASSURANCE

Father, you have called Your servants to ventures of which we can see neither the end nor the unknown challenges ahead. Give us assurance that what we do is pleasing to You. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that Your hand is leading us and Your love supporting us, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

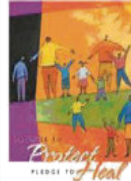
