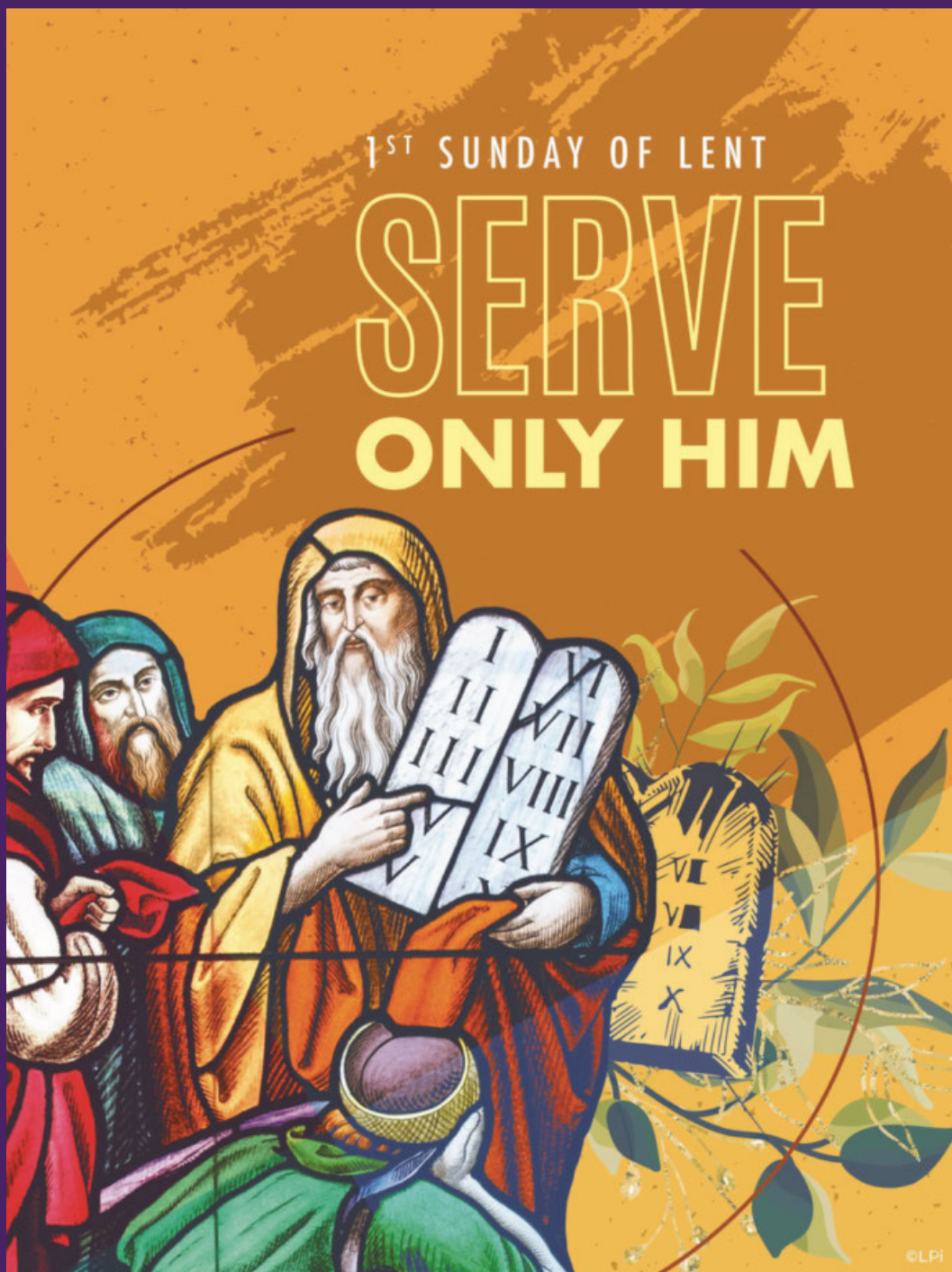

Dear Friends,

And so we begin Lent!

I quote from a poem named “The Age of Anxiety,” because it seems that is us! But if we are honest, every age of history, from the very beginning, has been filled with anxiety in different forms. Be it personal or communal, anxiety, fear, worry are as common as the air we breathe. Sure we count our blessings, but in the course of an ordinary day, most of us are kind of “glass-half-empty” folks.

That is why the season of Lent and the fine-tuning of conversion it offers is so important! Through spiritual and physical discipline, we discover treasures of being a disciple. We are given the “full” message that anxiety in any form is not the final answer, but that the final answer is Jesus Christ, who climbed the Cross freely for us, who is also the Christ raised up on Easter in the triumph of hope and a new way of living for his followers.

Lent is not a time of misery like a workout that most of us, especially myself, dread. It is a 40 day-at-a-time plan of small steps that lead us to a great victory.

My prayer for you is not that you have a powerful, successful Lent, but a day-at-a-time Lent with one small accomplishment of prayer, fasting, almsgiving each day. May it be a gentle Lent of a step-at-a-time climbing whatever Cross is in your life, so that when Easter comes, and we all gather on a spring Morning with family and friends and fellow parishioners and a ham in the oven, we rejoice at the renewal of our experience of the triumph of hope over anxiety, life over death!

Table blessing follows the 10:30am Mass. Sales and food serving continues until the raffle at 1:30pm.

The Christian Women Society invites you to experience this Italian tradition which honors St. Joseph. The intent of this communal celebration is to help those in need.

Legend tells us that during a time of drought and famine in Sicily, people prayed to St. Joseph for his intercession. When the rains came, crops were planted, and people were able to rise up and thrive again. From their crops, they prepared a grand fest and with their neighbors in need, they feasted together in thanksgiving to St. Joseph.

In keeping with this Italian tradition, the parish prepares a table, a display of food and faith, celebrating St. Joseph near his feast day. Occurring during Lent, this beautifully adorned table is filled with donated **meatless** dishes, traditional foods, sculpted breads, and sweets. After a blessing, the food is sold to attendees.

Participants receive a complimentary bread roll and a bowl of pasta con sarde, a favorite Lenten pasta with fish sauce (also served without the fish sauce.) A specially prepared cake is cut and shared with those present.

There will also be a raffle, with a wonderful variety of prizes, including restaurant certificates, tickets to events, gift baskets, and cash prizes! Proceeds from the food sales, raffle, and free will offerings are donated to the parish's social justice ministry and other organizations or projects in the community that provide services to people needing help. **Uganda Needs
Rosaries, T-shirts, and Tote Bags**

Deacon Gary Nosacek and his wife, Dr. Cindy, will be returning to Padibe at the end of the month. The catechists there would like them to bring rosaries. They do 20 - 40 baptisms per week, ranging in age from infants to the elderly. Each person baptized receives a rosary.

Sr. Caroline, administrator of Ss. Peter & Paul Medical Clinic, has requested infant t-shirts, size 3-6 mo. and tote bags. T-shirts (not onesies) are needed because most mothers cannot afford plastic pants. Along with a blanket, a 3 foot bar of soap (in Uganda soap is 3 feet long and cut as needed) and a basin to bathe the baby are given to the mothers who give birth to their babies at the clinic.

This year, our Lenten Almsgiving will focus on prison ministry, families of the incarcerated, and re-entry programs locally and worldwide.

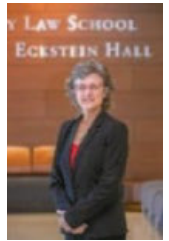

From the Desk of Deacon Tom

Lent is a time for all of us to reflect on our lives. I know for me at least, reflecting on my failings of what God calls me to do for the least of my brothers and sisters can be challenging and daunting at times. That is why I believe the Church, in her wisdom, calls us at this time in our church year to take a step back and revisit what Jesus Christ did and continues to do for us by recalling the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Since my ordination in 2000 as a Deacon in the Catholic Church and covenanted with the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist since 2008, my main ministry is to the incarcerated and now to the families of the incarcerated. If you ask me why, I believe that for everyone there is a need to have compassion and care to try and understand what brought them to do what they did, no matter how horrible the crime committed against someone or against society.

I was a volunteer chaplain at the Milwaukee County Jail for some 23 years. One evening, I began a conversation with a young man who told me about his situation and that he knew he needed to pay for the crime he had committed. What he proceeded to tell me was how remorseful he was for what he had done and asked for forgiveness from the individual and society. He was also remorseful for what he had done to his family and regretted dragging them down the same path. He knew his family would be ridiculed for not seeing the path of destruction he was on. He knew the family would withdraw from the world and hide in disgrace, humiliation, and shame.

Through this experience and God's grace, "Doing Time Together" became a reality. It has been in existence since 2011 and is still a vital program to assist families of the incarcerated return to what we refer to as a, "new normal way of life." My team members and I listen to families' anguish and acknowledge the anguish their loved ones have caused to someone else and their families. Families come and go for a variety of reasons, but our hope is as they move forward, with a sense of some healing within themselves, being able to live a "new normal of life" to welcome home their family member home when released.
