

Dear friends,

This is now the third Sunday in Lent and a beautiful passage from the Gospel of John is presented to us at Mass, the one about the encounter between Jesus and the Samaritan woman.

I have only viewed a couple of episodes of the series, *The Chosen*, but the one episode on this encounter brought me to tears.

The Samaritan woman's self-esteem was at its lowest. She had been through five romantic relationships. Perhaps she fell in love those five times or maybe was forced into one of those five relationships. She had been disappointed, hurt and covered in shame. Why was she not drawing water from the well in the morning, like other women would do to avoid the heat of midday? She only dared to go to the well around noon because no one would be there to shame her and call her names.

One day, however, Jesus meets her at the well. The water her heart was thirsting for, the love she had been looking unsuccessfully in those five husbands had gone out of his way to meet her and tell her, "I am as thirsty for your love as you have been for mine".

Jesus, in fact, longs to love each of us wherever we are at. He longs to give us the water that will satiate our deepest longings. I bet it has been tiring to go around looking for love in wells that have only provided us with momentary relief. Now, Jesus is the one going out of his way to look for us and say to our face, "I thirst for you".

May this Lent and Easter be a time for us to quench the Lord's thirst for our hearts. Why not give our hearts to Jesus? We have given them to others in the past, and many times we have been left thirstier than ever before. Jesus, on the other hand, has given us in the cross a proof of his love for us.

For most of us, this is not an easy corporal work of mercy to carry out. Unfortunately, it is also difficult for families to accomplish as well. Obstacles for families are long drives, pre-approvals, confusing rules and regulations, clothing restrictions, limited physical contact, and meals from only vending machines. So, what can we do to improve the lives of the incarcerated and their families?

- Pray: Include in your daily prayers a petition that all who are imprisoned and their families know God's healing love.
- Support: Financial support for Cathedral Prison ministries and local re-entry programs. Consider giving a gift as part of your Lenten almsgiving.
- Volunteer: Extend yourself and volunteer with any of the Family of Five outreach programs. All of our outreach ministries serve people struggling to re-enter our community and their families.

Over the last six months, I have been attending Deacon Tom's "Doing Time Together" group, which is a place for those who have loved ones incarcerated. When someone is arrested, we often think about the prisoners themselves, how they might be getting what they deserved, or how unjustly they were prosecuted. What goes unnoticed is the impact on those whose loved ones are taken from their daily lives. By attending these group meetings, I've come to a much better understanding of this perspective and the hardships involved. Some participants, especially parents, are often blamed for their loved ones going to prison and cut off from friends. Having a loved one being sent to jail is in itself an isolating experience, but it is made worse by social exclusion. This group helps give those struggling with the imprisonment of someone they love a place to be able to talk about their unique daily struggles with others who understand what it's like. It is a place for community and unity where outside may be divisive and judgmental. Being a listener in this community has helped me become more empathetic and broadened my perspective of the brokenness of the world we live in and the grace God offers us all, even in difficult moments.

The Shepherd And The Lost Sheep 😭

Representatives from Bethlehem will be at Old St. Mary and the Cathedral, March 22-23, and at Three Holy Women (all sites) March 29-30, selling religious articles and other crafts from the region after all Masses. The last few years have been very tough for the Christian families. Sixty years ago, they made up 18% of the population but now are less than 2% of the population in the Holy Land due to events in the Middle East. The families are facing devastating economic strain since they relied on tourists to purchase their religious, hand-cared olive wood items as their only source of income. Wafa AlSahouri has come to the US and is trying to help support these families by bringing their artifacts here to sell. All proceeds from sales are send back to the families of the Holy Land so that they may be able to keep their homes and provide for their families. Please stop by after the Masses and look at the beautiful items being offered. Your support is a blessing for the native people of the Holy Land in Bethlehem.

Uganda Needs Rosaries, T-shirts, and Tote Bags

Deacon Gary Nosacek and his wife, Dr. Cindy, will be returning to Padibe at the end of the month. The catechists there would like them to bring rosaries. They do 20 to 40 baptisms per week, ranging in age from infants to the elderly. Each person baptized receives a rosary.

Sr. Caroline, administrator of Ss. Peter & Paul Medical Clinic, has requested infant t-shirts, size 3-6 mo. and tote bags. T-shirts (not onesies) are needed because most mothers cannot afford plastic pants. Along with a blanket, a 3 foot bar of soap (in Uganda soap is 3 feet long and cut as needed) and a basin to bathe the baby are given to the mothers who give birth to their babies at the clinic.


