

Happy Lent! Happy Laetare Sunday!

Laetare is Latin for "rejoice." Here, on the fourth Sunday of Lent, we are reminded that all our Lenten practices should lead us to rejoice in the anticipation of the resurrection. We are called to join Christ on the cross through sacrifice, so that we may rejoice and share in His resurrection.

The weekend is also a reminder that

we are close to the end of Lent. Lent is a great time to return to the sacrament of reconciliation. As a priest, this beautiful sacrament is one of the greatest aspects of my priesthood. I rejoice every time I encounter someone in the confessional. It is a humbling experience to be with people as they confess their sins and offer God's mercy in the darkest moments of their lives.

Has it been too long since you have been to confession? I encourage you not to let another Lent go by without availing yourself of the sacrament of reconciliation. In addition to offering confessions seven days a week in our parishes, we have several upcoming opportunities to receive the sacrament. On April 9, the Archdiocese of Milwaukee is offering "Pray, Reconcile, & Rejoice: 12 Hours of Reconciliation." You can find locations and times here:

La Sagrada Familia Sister Parish Dominican Republic

One of the greatest prophetic signs of Saint John XXIII during his pontificate was to visit the inmates of the Regina Coeli prison in Rome. With the humility that characterized him, John XXIII presented himself to the inmates as "I am John, your brother. Since you could not leave to see me, I have decided to come and see you." The visit of the "Good Pope" (as he was called) not only filled the inmates of the Regina Coeli prison with hope but also all the prisoners in the world, who began to call the Holy Father "our brother John." I personally think that prison ministry is one of the best kept secrets of the pastoral and social work carried out by the Catholic Church. Perhaps because sometimes it is difficult to share the comfort and encouragement and all the support that is given to inmates, in the midst of very sad and difficult situations. One of the joys of my priestly ministry has been prison ministry. For four years (2016-2020), I went every Wednesday to the federal prison of Sturtevant, Wisconsin, and for the last four years, I have been visiting, every week, the prison at Km. 15 of Azua, here in the Dominican Republic.

A good friend asked me, "What does a priest do during prison visits? I replied, "Give hope." I think that is our job, to give hope to a population full of hopelessness, either because of the guilt that they carry, or because of:

- the difficulties of the place
- loneliness
- the lack of medical attention
- the hunger that they may end up going through or by the abandonment of their family and friends

Here in the Dominican Republic we give hope to the inmates through our weekly pastoral visits. Whenever we can, we supply them with basic items such as toothbrushes, toothpaste, toilet paper, soap bars or shampoo, as well as medical items to refill the first aid kit that is often empty.

During the years of my formation before ordination, I never thought that I would end up doing prison ministry, much less that this would be a blessing in my ministry. I pray that we never forget all those people who are deprived of their liberty, and that we strive to learn how to give them hope. It is not an easy task, but God always gives us the grace, the resources, and the generous people that are needed to bring hope to the those who are in prisons. "Don't worry, hope is for everyone. Also for you," said John XXIII to the inmates of the Regina Coeli prison.

Safe Environment

Archdiocesan Safe Environment Awareness Week: March 30 – April 6

The Archdiocese of Milwaukee recognizes March 30 – April 6 as Safe Environment Awareness Week. Each year in the month of April, which is recognized around the country as child abuse prevention month, we dedicate a week to elevating the general awareness of the Church's efforts to keep our children safe. We want people to know that we are committed to maintaining safe environments in our parishes and schools through adult child abuse prevention training; criminal background checks for all clergy, volunteers working with minors, and employees; safety training for children in each grade level; and adhering to all mandatory reporting requirement laws.

Free Adult Safe Environment Training Session: April 1 at 6:00pm at the Cathedral Atrium (812 N Jackson St).

Our parish/school recognizes the month of April as a time to mark our support for child abuse prevention in our parishes, schools, and communities. The Family of Five Parishes will be hosting an adult safe environment education training session on Tuesday, April 1 at 6:00pm in the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist Atrium (enter through Jackson Street Garden Gate to the left of the main Cathedral entrances). These trainings focus on identifying grooming behaviors, recognizing signs of abuse and neglect, and how to report concerning behavior and abuse and neglect to the proper authorities. This three-hour training is part of the safe environment certification process, and is a crucial part of training our adults to prepare them to volunteer in our parish/school. Did You Know... All clergy, employees, and volunteers are required to meet all of the requirements of safe environment certification. Certification includes participating in training on recognizing signs of abuse and neglect, identifying grooming behaviors, training in maintaining boundaries, and mandatory reporting; reviewing the Code of Ethical Standards and the Social Media and Digital Communication Policy, and undergoing a criminal background check. Certification is required prior to beginning ministry and subsequently every five years.
