Dear Friends,

In a consumption-based culture, the value of surrendering oneself to something greater is seen as a sign of failure and weakness. Only acquisition is seen as victory, "The one who dies with the most stuff is the winner...." Or something along those lines.

As we prepare to remember the greatest surrender, when the Word made flesh, the Second Person of the Holy Trinity, the King of Kings and Lord of Lords, dies a rather violent and senseless death on a tree whose fruit seems to contain no satisfaction but misery, pain, and the ultimate void of death.

We are being asked to believe that ultimate surrender is ultimate victory.

And yet right at the moment of his surrender, Christ gives us the key to the door that surrender opens. It is the door of absolute dependence and the freedom that we don't have to be in control all the time, the freedom to let someone else do the work. After the heavy work of the carrying the cross, Christ finally can say it is finished, into greater hands he commends his spirit and he can finally totally and irrevocably be free.

It is that freedom finally that the heavy weight of human living and burdensome, calculated choice become overwhelmingly light because we can finally let go. Our work of carrying any cross is over, and the one whose Name is Love takes over! And that sweet freedom, that amazing grace will finally take us home!

As Lent moves toward Holy Week, let's continue to hold each other close in prayer and good works!

La Sagrada Familia - KM.15 Prison in Azua, Dominican Republic

Visiting prisoners at Km. 15, situated near the town Nuevo Sabana Yegua in September 2024, was the most important segment of my visit to our Sister Parish La Sagrada Familia. I didn't want to go to that prison. I had been there before and recalled it to feel hopeless and dangerous. Father Javier clearly loves the inmates, and they love him back. The four of us from the Cathedral of St. John Evangelist sat across a conference table-sized concrete structure from some of the most devout, respectful, well-groomed, soft-spoken gentlemen I can recall ever meeting. Their faith seemed strong, and they spoke of the things they would do to move forward after their release from prison. Many of them are participating in educational programs to be gainfully employed upon their release, notably as barbers. This optimism was obvious, even among those whose sentences were as long as 25 years. The prison currently "houses" (if you can call it that) more than double the number of men that it was designed for. It is indeed a sad place. Probably dangerous. But I didn't want to leave when it was time. I was touched by the love and connection with the people, inmates, guards, and the prison psychologist who was there with us. Father Javier never goes to the prison empty-handed. Once he has preached the gospel, he hands out simple things that all people need. Toilet paper, soap, toothpaste, deodorant, laundry detergent. Basic things we all take for granted. He usually supplies these things with his own money. I couldn't help thinking that Jesus loves prisoners, and that St. Francis was a prisoner. To me, they are no longer prisoners but people who are worthy of every bit of respect we can show them. I loved them.

The Holy Spirit was definitely present when we attended the prison in Sabana Yegua in the Dominican Republic with Father Javier, the pastor of our sister church, who has a monthly ministry there. We were able to ask questions of the prisoners who attended through Father Javier's translation. Deacon Tom asked if the prisoners felt like their spirits were lifted when Father Javier presided over Mass with them. When Father Javier translated the question, they all started cheering and applauding at the top of their lungs. We passed out iced tea to them as well as packets of antacid, handing them each item personally. They were just people, not someone to be feared, and they were very thankful for our visit and applauded us as well. The experience moved me to tears. I will never forget it, and it made me even more committed to raising funds to help with Father Javier's outreach program for these prisoners.

Safe Environment

Archdiocesan Safe Environment Awareness Week: March 30 – April 6

The Archdiocese of Milwaukee recognizes March 30 through April 6 as Safe Environment Awareness Week. Each year in the month of April, which is recognized around the country as child abuse prevention month, we dedicate a week to elevating the general awareness of the Church's efforts to keep our children safe. We want people to know that we are committed to maintaining safe environments in our parishes and schools through adult child abuse prevention training; criminal background checks for all clergy, volunteers working with minors, and employees; safety training for children in each grade level; and adhering to all mandatory reporting requirement laws.

Did You Know...

The Archdiocese of Milwaukee has a Victim Assistance Coordinator that assists survivors of sexual abuse to navigate through the process of reporting abuse and receiving counselling services. The Victim Assistance Coordinator can be reached at 414-758-2232. The Archdiocese of Milwaukee also has a third-party reporting mechanism for misconduct through Convercent. All mandatory reporting laws in the State of Wisconsin are required to be followed with all reports to the Archdiocese of Milwaukee or Convercent. A report of abuse can also be made through the Advocate Aurora Healing Center or directly reported to the appropriate civil authorities.

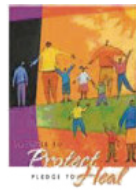
