

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul motto is, "serving in hope." For most of us we hope for good weather, a raise, or a positive result from a medical exam. We hope our plans work out for the best. But these hopes, are really just wishes for good fortune; they pass quickly and are soon forgotten.

The hope in which we are called to serve as Vincentians is the same hope in which our faith calls us to live as Christians. It is not a passing feeling, or simply a positive outlook, it is one of the three Cardinal Virtues given to us by Saint Paul, who also teaches us that love (charity) is the greatest among them. We serve our neighbors for love alone. Love is the motive for our actions, but we also serve in hope.

What is the hope that we offer to a family who just came out of a shelter, lost everything fleeing a domestic violence home, or who needs beds for their children who are sleeping on the floor. It is easy to see that our hopes for weekend weather are not so important; it is much harder to dismiss a hope for beds, appliances and bedding as merely wishful thinking. This is what Christ calls us to do. It is the small relief or larger one, that we offer which opens the door to true hope that is offered to all.

There is no greater joy than helping a neighbor in need when we can provide them with living essentials: blankets, refrigerator, stove, dishes, pots/ pans, etc. We thank you for all your donations.
