GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Human history reveals many periods where people lost a sense of God's transcendence. It may even be argued that human beings have been wandering and lost more than they have been at home and focused. Human nature being what it is, we struggle with who God really is — the God of our salvation history or the "gods" of human constructs. Relying on our own designs and pursuits, we forget that we really are meant to listen to One upon whom the Spirit of the Lord rests, Jesus Christ, and not to ourselves. That same history that reveals our fickleness and infidelity also reveals God's constancy and faithfulness. God always finds us.

As people wander and fumble to find their way, God is there bringing them back to holiness and giving them the assurance of His presence. We have to allow God's Word, God's life, to touch us and change us. It can make us more flexible and attentive to the sacred in all facets of life so that every day is one that is holy. Every day is a time when fulfillment is possible for one's soul. Jesus stood before those gathered in the synagogue as the fulfillment of words of promise that were echoed long ago. God doesn't forget. He always comes for us.

Now it is time to remember to go to God. Sometimes our lives are so confused and tangled that it is difficult to see the Word and hand of God. But when we realize, deep within, the depth of friendship God offers to us it really has the power to turn sadness to joy. The promise is fulfilled. Going frequently to God's Word, allowing ourselves to be enriched and rejuvenated, and pondering the certainty of God's fidelity and promise permanently transforms us. We will be more aware of the sacred and the holy and less invested in things that pull us away.

We are grateful for our Extraordinary Eucharistic Ministers to the Homebound! Those taking Communion to the homebound are reminded that it is *not* permissible to take multiple hosts with the intention of distributing them throughout the week.

Only take one host per recipient for that particular day. The Holy Eucharist is to be consumed as soon as possible, and should never be left out or "saved for later." Please contact the parish office if your loved one would like to receive the Eucharist on a more frequent basis.

Also, please note that it is appropriate for you to come forward to receive the Holy Eucharist at the end of the communion line. The celebrant will place the Blessed Sacrament into your pyx and say a blessing. Please do not ask a Eucharistic Minister to bring it to your seat- you should come forward for the blessing.

PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY NEWS



Dear Knitting and Crocheting Friends,

The beautiful prayer shawls and other knitted/crocheted items have been inventoried, and we are ready to resume receiving *specific* items for this ministry. We have a few changes to the process, so please read on.

Based on the items most requested, most useful and most versatile for both men and women, the need right now is for knitted/crocheted (not cloth) LAP TROWS measuring *approximately* 30"x60."

"WHAT ABOUT PRAYER SHAWLS?" An ample selection of blessed *PRAYER SHAWLS* is still available at the parish office for any parishioner to obtain for someone in need. More shawls are not needed until further notice, but if you have some you already completed but have been waiting to deliver, by all means bring them to the office.

"HOW ABOUT BABY BLANKETS & BABY HATS and HAT & SCARVES SETS?" A selection of blessed *BABY BLANKETS* is available at the parish office. Our current supply of baby blankets and hats, as well as hat/scarves sets for both children and adults is very robust. No new items are needed until further notice, but if you have some you already completed but have been waiting to deliver, by all means bring them to the office.

"CAN I DONATE YARN, KNITTING/CROCHETING or SEWING SUPPLIES?" We thank you for the offer, but we currently have all the supplies we can handle. We will put an announcement in the bulletin when we need to replenish.

"CAN I OBTAIN SOME MATERIALS to GET STARTED?" A variety of yarn and prayer tags & bags for the completed blankets are available at the parish office. Bringing blankets to the office that are already tagged and bagged will make the process so much easier to maintain. Father will then bless them before they are distributed.

"WHAT if I HAVE PLENTY of MY OWN YARN at HOME?" Fantastic! By all means use it. Color, type of yarn, kind of stitch, fringe or no fringe....all your choice. At present all we ask is that the finished item measure *approximately* 30"x60" and keep in mind that since men as well as women are the recipients, some deeper colors are always nice. Again, in the parish office we have prayer tags and bags for your completed blankets if you are able to take those extra steps. If you're unable to, that's no problem at all!

"I THINK I'D LIKE to BECOME the COORDINATOR of THIS MINISTRY!" We were hoping you'd say that because we need someone to oversee this ministry. Please call the parish office at 414-762-6810, and they will put us in contact with one another.

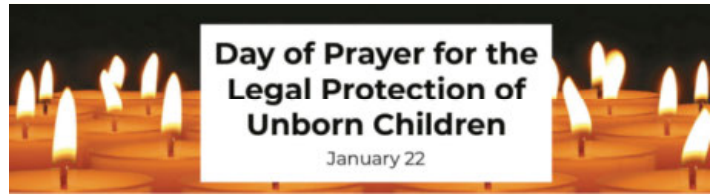

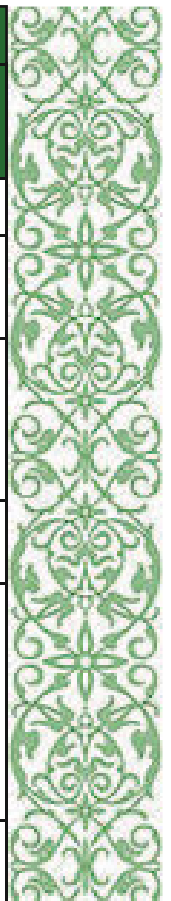
