FOUR PRINCIPLES TO HELP GUIDE CATHOLICS IN MAKING DECISIONS IN PUBLIC LIFE

As election advertisements start to fill the air waves and public debates fill the media, I thought it useful to offer these four principles outlined by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops in forming our consciences to make wise decisions in public life. Below is an edited version of what can be found on the front page of our Parish website: www.annunciationevv.org.

The Dignity of the Human Person

Human life is sacred. The dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision for society. Human life is especially under direct attack from abortion. Other direct threats to the sanctity of human life include euthanasia and assisted suicide (sometimes falsely labeled as “death with dignity”), human cloning, in vitro fertilization, and the destruction of human embryos for research.

Catholic teaching about the dignity of life calls us to oppose torture, unjust war, and the indiscriminate use of drones for violent purposes; to prevent genocide and attacks against noncombatants; to oppose racism; to oppose human trafficking; and to overcome poverty and suffering.

Subsidiarity

The human person is not only sacred but also social. Full human development takes place in relationship with others. The family-based on marriage between a man and a woman-is the first and fundamental unit of society. It should be defended and strengthened, not redefined, undermined, or further distorted. It is important to uphold parents’ rights and responsibilities to care for their children, including the right to choose their children’s education.

The principle of subsidiarity reminds us that larger institutions in society should not overwhelm or interfere with smaller or local institutions, yet larger

institutions have essential responsibilities when the more local institutions cannot adequately protect human dignity, meet human needs, and advance the common good.



The Common Good

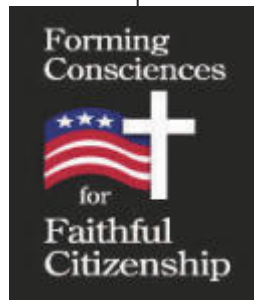
Human dignity is respected and the common good is fostered only if human rights are protected and basic responsibilities are met. Every human being has a right to life, the fundamental right that makes all other rights possible, and a right to access those things required for human decency-food and shelter, education and employment, health care and housing, freedom of religion and

family life. The right to exercise religious freedom publicly and privately by individuals and institutions along with freedom of conscience need to be constantly defended.

The economy must serve people, not the other way around. It is therefore necessary that an economic system serve the dignity of the human person and the common good by respecting the dignity of work and protecting the rights of workers.

Solidarity

We are one human family, whatever our national, racial, ethnic, economic, and ideological differences. Loving our neighbor has global dimensions and requires us to eradicate racism and address the extreme poverty and disease plaguing so much of the world. Solidarity also includes the scriptural call to welcome the stranger among us-including immigrants seeking work-by ensuring that they have opportunities for a safe home, education for their children, and a decent life for their families and by ending the practice of separating families through deportation.

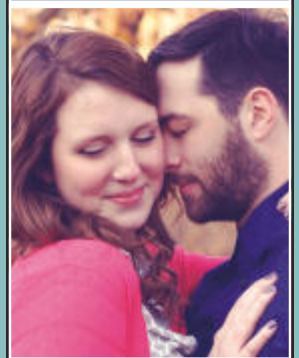
