GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

My husband is a bird watcher by day and a stargazer by night. I confess it drives me a little bonkers on our evening dog walks. I tend to want to keep moving; between him and our dog (who seems to want to sniff every mailbox), it's the pedestrian equivalent of stop-and-go traffic. Hearing about the journey of the Magi, however, reminds me to pause and look, too. Just as they saw the star rising and followed it to Jesus, we, too, can seek God in our surroundings, our relationships, and the beauty of creation – the next step is to follow where God leads us. As Pope Benedict XVI wrote, the Magi represent "the journeying of humanity toward Christ." (Jesus of Nazareth: The Infancy Narratives) We may falter from the path from time to time, but Isaiah's prophesy reminds us of our destination: "You shall be radiant at what you see, your heart shall throb and overflow."

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

The Epiphany is early this year, falling right on the heels of New Year's Day. If we haven't made our New Year's resolutions yet, now is a good time to do so. In addition to typical resolutions such as reducing clutter or getting fit, we can set some spiritual goals as well. The definition of epiphany (lower case) is "a moment in which you suddenly see or understand something in a new or very clear way." As we reflect on today's readings, let us ask the Holy Spirit to provide us an epiphany – into how we can grow closer to Jesus during this year ahead. Just as their encounter with the infant Jesus caused the Magi to be transformed from outsiders to faithful believers, and to take a different route home, our encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist is meant to transform all of us, and set us on a new path to light and life.

RESOLVE New Year's resolutions are great! Why not add a couple of spiritual resolutions to the list – perhaps to pray the rosary more often, spend time in eucharistic adoration, or go on that retreat you have been meaning to attend. Ask the Holy Spirit for inspiration and see where it leads.

This weekend the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Epiphany. Epiphany marks the liturgical zenith of the Advent-Christmas season. Epiphany means manifestation. What the Church celebrates today is the manifestation of our Lord to the whole world. After being made known to the shepherds of Bethlehem, Jesus now is revealed to the Magi who have come from the East to adore Him. Christian tradition sees the Magi as the first fruits of the Gentiles, and thus the feast of Epiphany is an affirmation of universal salvation.

THE CHURCH IN LATIN AMERICA



WHY WE BLESS OUR HOMES

"Chalking the door" is a way to celebrate and literally mark the occasion of the Epiphany and God's blessing of our lives and home.

Mark the lintel of your front door while saying: The three Wise Men, Caspar, Melchoir, and Balthazar followed the star of God's Son who became human over two thousand years ago. May Christ bless our home and remain with us through out the new year. Amen. You can pick up blessed chalk in back of Church.

QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTIONS

If you are over 70 ½, consider making charitable donations from your IRA using a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). You can transfer up to \$100,000 per year to an eligible charity. This would be a great way to grow the parish endowments, help with a special project, or pay your weekly giving in one lump sum. While a QCD does not generate a charitable deduction, you do not have to report the income. This is a great option for people to still get a tax benefit even though they are not able to itemize deductions.

Charitable deduction rules can be very complicated, and you should work with your tax advisor to ensure you are maximizing the tax benefit of any donation.

WHAT IS A DEACON?

Deacons are Servants of the Word: As a servant to the Word, deacons proclaim the gospel, instruct the faithful, and evangelize by word and deed.

Deacons are Servants of the Sacramental Life of the Church. As a servant of the sacramental life of the church, deacons preside at baptisms, assist at the Eucharist, bring the Eucharist to the sick and suffering, witness marriages, bury the dead, and preside at Benediction.

Deacons are Servants of Charity As a servant of charity, deacons report the needs of the community to the Church and bring its support and assistance to those in need. For example: Feed the hungry, visit the sick, comfort the mourning and care for one another in our brokenness.

ARE YOU BEING CALLED?

Are You Being Called to the Vocation of the Permanent Diaconate? The Diocese is recruiting a new Permanent Deacon Formation Class. "Deacons are ordained...at the service (*diakonia*) of the people of God in communion with the Bishop and his priests - St. John Paul II.

Deacons are ordained into the Ministry of Service in three areas: 1) Word 2) Sacrament and 3) Charity. Bishop Siegel would like for there to be representation from all around the diocese, especially areas where there is a lack of deacons. Informational Meetings are being scheduled for the discernment period. Saturday January 8th at the Evansville Diocesan Catholic Center, 4200 N. Kentucky Ave, Evansville, IN 47711. 
