From The Pastor's Desk

Holy Week

This week is different...this week is holy. The word Holy in translation means different. Of the 52 weeks in the year, this week is the only week that we call *holy*. This week is holy because within the short 7 days of this week, we will be honoring and celebrating the most important events in human history, the Last Supper of our Lord, His Passion and Crucifixion, and His Resurrection. It is these events that heal us and open the way to eternal life for those of us who believe.

How will you make this week different from all the other weeks of the year? This week is meant to be different from the usual routine of our lives. I encourage all of you to step out of that routine in order to remind ourselves what it was that Jesus did for us.

On the evening of Thursday, our Sacred Paschal Triduum begins with the Mass of the Lord's Supper. This is the beginning of a three day long liturgy; it is all one liturgy not three separate liturgies. If you have never joined us for these celebrations, please make a point to do so this year. They are the most incredible celebrations of the year. I would especially encourage you to come to the Easter Vigil!

Once again here is the schedule for the Triduum:

Holy Thursday, April 14, 7:00 p.m.: Mass of the Lord's Supper

Good Friday, April 15, noon: Celebration of the Lord's Passion. *Please remember that Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence.*

Easter Vigil, April 16, 8:00 p.m.: Easter Vigil

Easter Sunday, April 17, 7:00 a.m., 9:00 a.m., and 11:00 a.m.

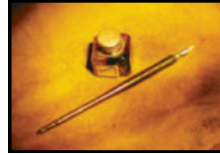

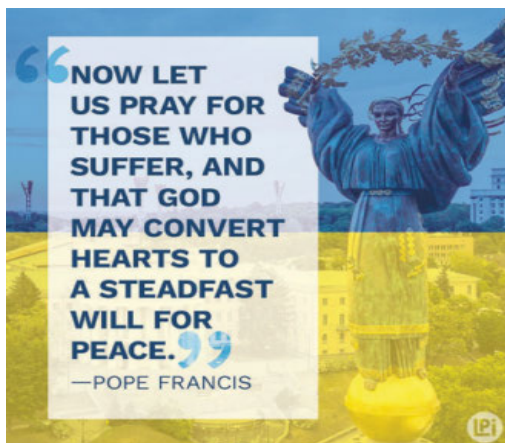

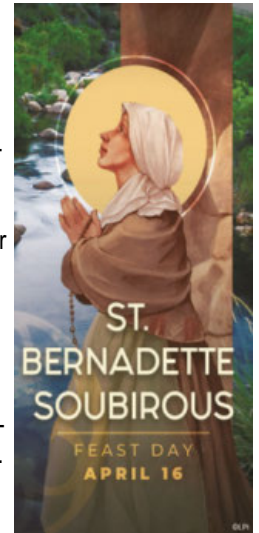

Saint Of The Week

St. Bernadette Soubirous | April 16

At the age of 14, St. Bernadette (1844-1879) was living in abject poverty with her family in a one-room basement, which had previously been used as a jail, in the town of Lourdes in southern France. She was a sickly child, having fallen victim to Cholera in 1854, and would battle asthma and tuberculosis for the rest of her short life. Bernadette was illiterate and is characterized in many accounts as slow or ignorant. It was in her 14th year that Bernadette was granted 18 visions of a 'Lady' at a grotto in Massabielle. The Lady instructed Bernadette to come daily to the grotto to receive the visions, eventually proclaiming 'I am the Immaculate Conception'. A spring at the grotto, which appeared where Bernadette was instructed to dig, has been a site of miraculous healing. The Lady also asked that a chapel be built in the grotto for pilgrims. Today the Marian shrine at Lourdes is one of the world's most popular.

During and following the period of visions, the saint was examined rigorously by Church and local authorities. The popular excitement around the visions left her subject to persistent questioning and attention. Eventually she sought protection by retiring to a home for the poor in a nunnery. She took her vows in 1866, with the Sisters of Charity at Nevers. She worked as an infirmary assistant, and later a sacristan, but by the end of her life she was too sick to participate in convent life. She died at the age of 35, humble and penitent until the end.

As we enter Holy week, let us turn our hearts again to Jerusalem, and to the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Let us ask the Lord, Jesus, to stir up within us the gift of faith that we may not only praise him with our lips, but may follow him in the way of the cross.

The Sacred Triduum begins with Jesus transforming himself into a servant to wash the feet of his Apostles. He proves his eternal love by changing bread and wine into His very Body and Blood. It reaches its height and conclusion in the Light of Christ, Victor over sin and death. O Lord Jesus, in order that the merits of your sacrifice on the Cross might be applied to every soul in all time, you willed that it should be renewed upon the altar. At the Last Supper, you said: *"Do this in remembrance of me."* By these words, you gave your apostles and their successors the power to consecrate and the command to do what you yourself did. Help me to realize that the Mass is the greatest gift of God to us and our greatest gift to God.

We are invited to receive His life-giving love. Thank you that you make all things new. Thank you for the victory and power that is in your name. Thank you that you hold the keys over death. Thank you that by Your might, Jesus was raised from the grave, paving the way for us to have a new life with you. Thank you for your plan, thank you that you made a way.

Thank you to all those who have helped with preparing the liturgies for Holy week. I would like to thank the Liturgy Committee, our parish music ministry, sacristans, servers, lectors, ushers, greeters, and those who live-streamed the services. Most of all, thank you to those who sewed banners for Lent and Easter, or helped decorate the church for Palm Sunday and upcoming Holy Week, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter. We look forward to a tremendous celebration of Holy Week and Easter. The beauty, solemnity, and the glory is not possible without the hard work of so many good people. Blessings on all of them.

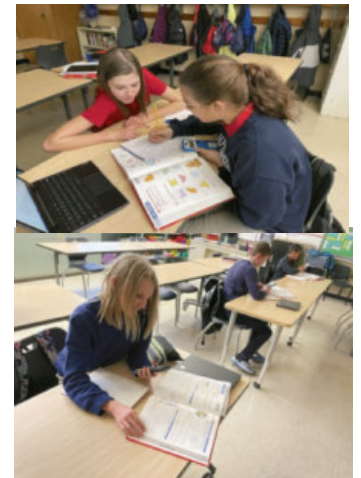
April Is National Child Abuse Prevention Month

Parents play the primary role in educating their children about sexual abuse. Here are 5 tips for teaching safety to the little ones God has entrusted to you:

1. Keep it practical—Teach your children the difference between safe and unsafe touches
2. Tell your children that saying "no" is okay—Empower your children to say "no" if anyone makes them feel uncomfortable or touches them inappropriately.
3. Give your children a way to alert you—Tell your children they can use an excuse or share a special "code-word" with you to alert you about an unsafe person or situation.
4. Tell your children to report an unsafe touch—Let your children know they should tell you if they feel unsafe around any adult or peer.
5. Tell your children you trust them—If your child makes a report to you, believe them and then report it to authorities.

School Scene

Middle school math students are busy this month learning some interesting math concepts! In 7th and 8th grade Algebra, students are learning various ways to solve quadratic equations. One way they learned to solve is by graphing the quadratic equations in the coordinate plane. 8th grade math students are learning about data analysis and displays. They learned how to find a line of fit from a scatter plot. In Pre-Algebra, students are learning about angles and triangles. They are learning about various angle relationships and using these concepts to find missing angle measures. In 7th grade math, students are learning how to find the volume of prisms and pyramids. Sixth grade students are currently learning about statistical measures. So far, they have learned about measures of center and measures of variation.

The Ecumenical Good Friday Service

2:00 p.m. Walk with the Cross
 3:00 p.m. Ecumenical Service



Back in 1969, clergy and congregations from the Christian Churches in Greendale planned to mark Good Friday by walking with a homemade Cross through the Village, and concluding with a Prayer Service. Over the years, pastors and congregations have expanded to include Greenfield, Milwaukee, and Hales Corners. The walk begins with gathering at St. Thomas of Canterbury Episcopal Church, praying a Common Prayer and then taking a reflective walk to St. Luke's Lutheran, then to Greendale Community Church, and concluding at St. Alphonsus Catholic Church. Families take turns carrying the Cross. Some join at one of the "station" Churches. Some folks come just for the Prayer Service at St. Alphonsus. The Ecumenical Prayer Service is focused on "the Seven Last Words" of Jesus, with brief reflections and music. Participating this year are Adoration Lutheran, Greendale Community - UCC, Emmanuel United Church of Christ, Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic, St. Alphonsus Catholic, St. Luke Lutheran, St. Stephen the Martyr Lutheran, and St. Thomas of Canterbury Episcopal Churches. We welcome you to join us!

Palm Sunday is the Sunday before Easter that begins the Holy Week. It is the day that we remember and celebrate the day Jesus entered Jerusalem as Savior and King. As Jesus rode a donkey into the town of Jerusalem, a large crowd gathered and laid palm branches and their cloaks across the road, giving Jesus royal treatment. The hundreds of people shouted "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!"
