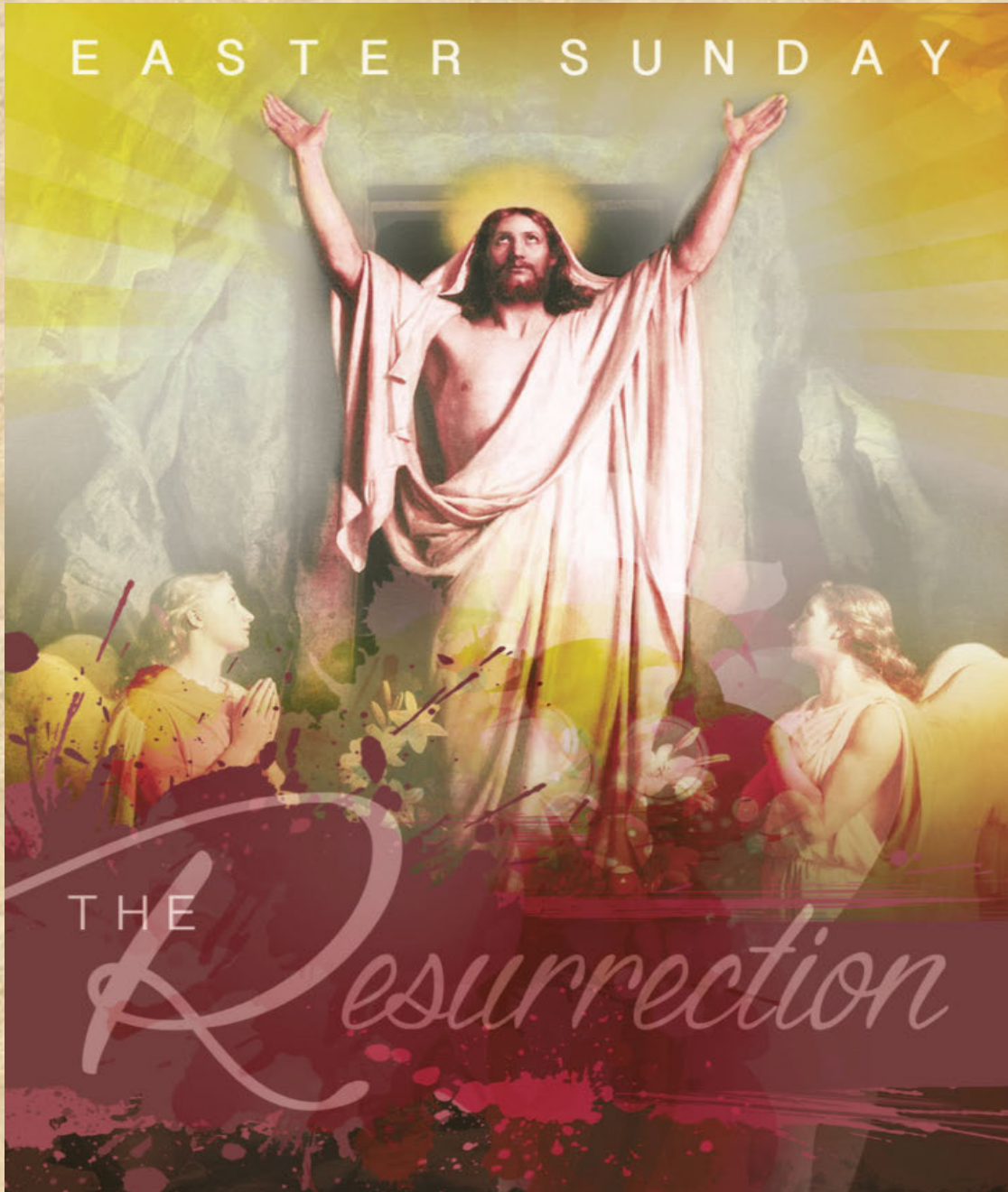

## Saint Of The Week

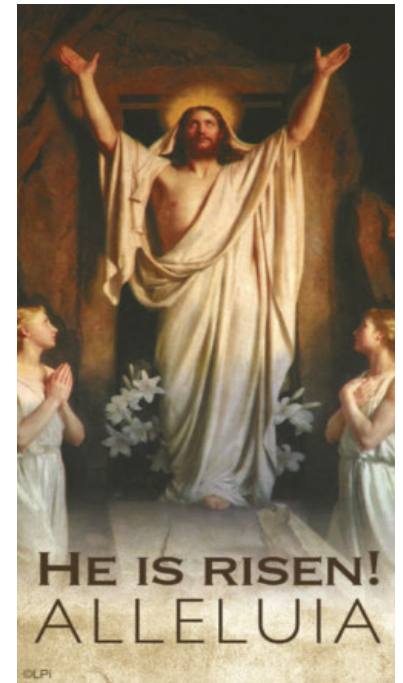
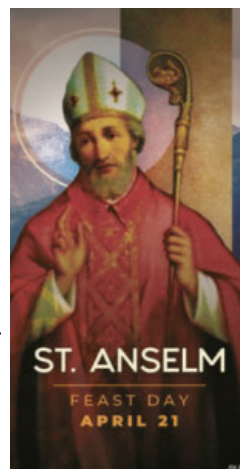
### St. Anselm | April 21

Saint Anselm of Canterbury left his home in Italy to travel as a young man and ended up at the monastery in Bec, France, which was known for the teachings of its leader, Lanfranc. Anselm rose quickly to become abbot of the community, and his writings are now compared in importance to those of St. Augustine.

In 1093, Anselm was appointed Archbishop of Canterbury by William II Rufus, the son and successor of William the Conqueror. However, at the time there was a controversy in Europe over whether kings or the pope had the power to invest bishops. Anselm, who believed only the pope should have the right to invest an ecclesiastical authority, spent much of his time as Archbishop exiled in Rome.

Saint Anselm's teaching and works of theology are his most important contribution to the Catholic faith. He is considered of the fathers of scholastic theology and his chief achievement in philosophy was the ontological argument for the existence of God. His work *Cur Deus homo?* taught that atonement for sins could only be achieved through Christ. He was canonized in 1494, and named a Doctor of the Church in 1720.

*“We are an Easter people and Alleluia is our song.”*

I think St. Augustine *“hit the nail on the head”* when he said this back in the 5th Century. Much can be said about what it means to be a follower of Christ, but the truth of the Lord’s resurrection is at the foundation of who we are as a people of faith.

So what does it mean to be an Easter people?

Pope Benedict XVI opened up this truth for us when he famously wrote: *“Being a Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea. But the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and decisive direction.”*

As Catholics, the center of our faith has always been the encounter of both an **event** and a **person**: That event is the **resurrection**, and that person is **Jesus Christ**.

Pope Benedict’s words need to be at the forefront of how we live our lives. There is a temptation in our spiritual lives to treat Jesus simply as a great historical figure of the past. But Christianity has never been about simply following a historical person from the past. No! At the core of our faith is a relationship with a living person: Jesus Christ.

The saint’s lives bear testimony to this truth. The reason why the saints lived radical lives of joy and holiness was that their faith was centered on a lived relationship with the person of Jesus Christ, and it was their love for Him that drove them to heroic virtue.

Do we live our lives as Easter People? Are we convicted that Jesus Christ is alive and that he has conquered sin and death? Is He the love of our lives? Do we believe that every time we come to Holy Mass that He becomes truly present on our altar? Do our lives bear testimony to the joy of His resurrection?

Take the time this Easter season to ponder this truth and allow the mystery of the Resurrection to saturate your life.

### April Is National Child Abuse Prevention Month

#### Keeping Children and Teens Safe Online

1. Model appropriate online behavior for young people
2. Teach your children not to share private information or images online
3. Limit usage of computers and mobile devices to public spaces in the home
4. Install software that can block or monitor explicit website use
5. Review and discuss the websites your child has visited and apps they have used
6. Report online exploitation of minors to public authorities.



### School Scene

In 5<sup>th</sup> grade, students took part in a live action role playing game which revolved around the medieval times. Students assumed a medieval job such as a blacksmith or fletcher, and also took on the role of a warrior unique to those times. Students were required to earn bronze, silver, and gold coins to purchase *“armor,”* such as gauntlets and greaves in preparation for the final battle, which was in the form of a chess-like game played out on the Smart Board. Each day, students would meet with their group in order to help one another earn their gear pieces and purchase what they needed for the battle. ## Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord

There are many stones in our paths that keep us from truly living and being free. Some of these boulders have been there for a very long time. They have been there so long that they have even settled into the soil of our lives with other weeds, vines, and compacted soil keeping them firmly in place. We find them hard to move, and trying to do so can be exhausting. What are these suffocating albatrosses that keep us so tethered and immobile? They are many things.



They are past childhood wounds and hurts that stem from disappointment, rejection, or abuse. People may have told us we were unwanted, that the world is frightening, that there are only some acceptable feelings you can have and others you cannot. We may have tried to love someone or struggled to figure out how and were met with rejection. Maybe we trusted someone completely and were betrayed. We come to life collecting barnacles that begin to attach to other barnacles and before you know it, we have a mass of solid matter blocking our vision and keeping us from moving. We live in fear. We are afraid of losing what we have, afraid that the future will be empty, afraid that we won't succeed and even more afraid that we will not be loved. There is so much fear. Didn't Jesus tell us not to worry and to not be afraid? Either we believe in the message of Easter, or we don't!

Go confidently into the night. Walking with God you will find the light and strength you need. Often without even knowing, God will move those boulders and stumbling blocks that bind us and, with putting one foot in front of the other and looking forward, we will move. The resurrection of Christ is really all about receiving the gifts of trust and faith and doing new things. The rocks that bind us keep us spinning the same wheels and doing the same things. When was the last time you threw caution to the wind and actually did something totally out of character and different? This is where we find God, in the spontaneous, the adventurous, the fun, and the creative choices we make! God is not boring and stuck. God is exciting and engaging. Jesus Christ is risen from the dead! Find a way to trust that this is true and live.
