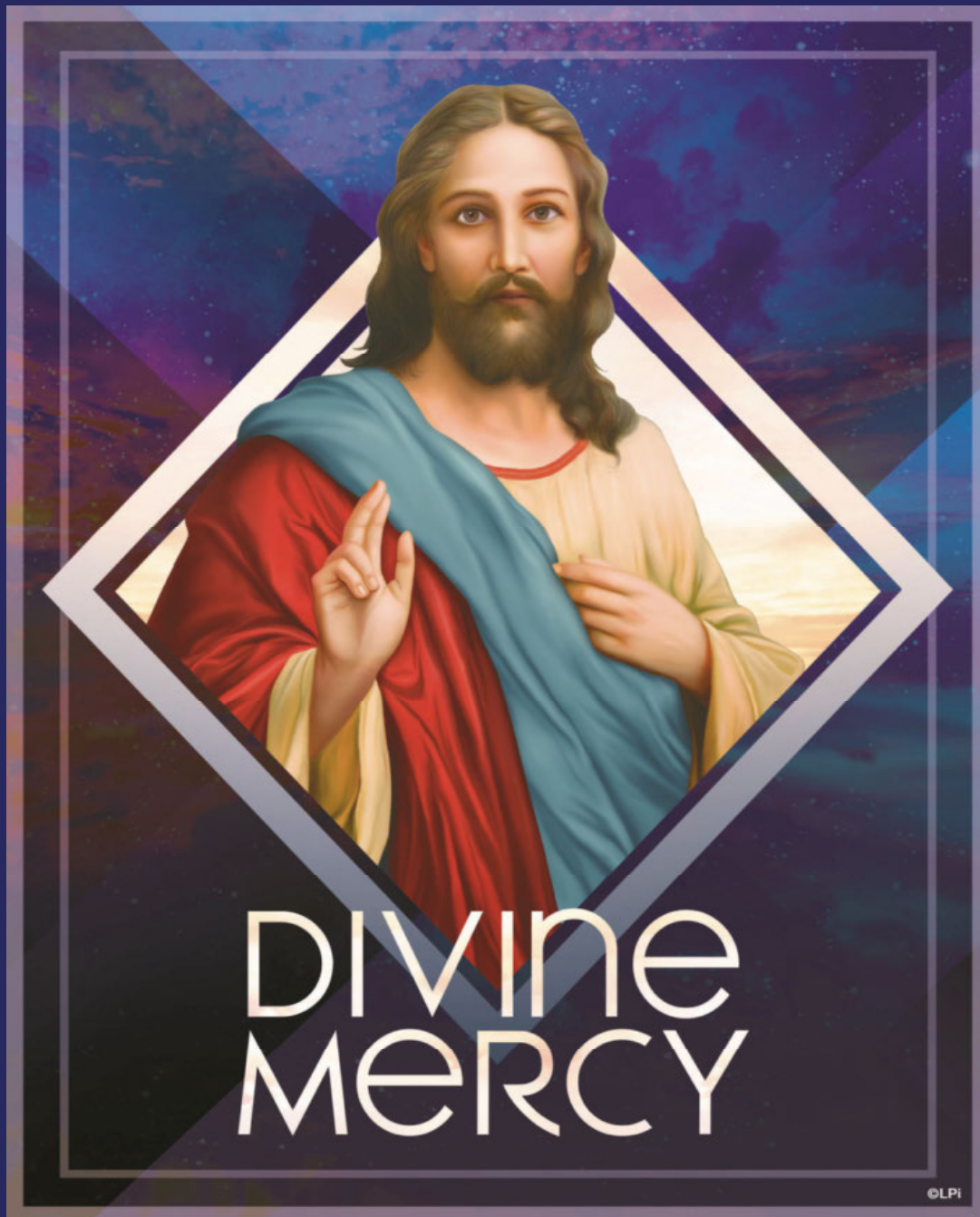

From The Pastor's Desk

The Easter Season

I hope you all have had a great Easter celebration and some time off during the holiday. But we should note that our celebrations have not ended. After the 40 days of Lenten penance comes the 50 days of Easter joy and celebration! This festive season is filled with joy, and there are some characteristics of it that you should watch for.



First, our Gospel readings for this season focus on the encounters that the disciples have with the Risen Lord. During the Sundays of Easter, we will move through those wondrous moments when Christ ministers to His Disciples, to the Church. Through these passages we are given the opportunity to enter into the Resurrection of the Lord in our own life.

Second, Easter is the only season in which we do not usually read from the Old Testament during Sunday Mass. Instead, we work our way through the Acts of the Apostles. Through these readings we get to notice the remarkable change that has come upon the apostles after the Resurrection. They have moved from their timidity and incomprehension of the Gospels to the bold proclamation of the Resurrection of Jesus. We also get to watch as the Holy Spirit moves through the disciples to build the Church in remarkable ways.

The third aspect of Easter to notice is the return of Alleluia. After fasting from this festive and joyful word during Lent, it makes its triumphant return during Easter. You might notice in the songs that we sing during Easter there is often an emphasis on the word Alleluia, because this word is a great expression of our Easter joy. At the Easter Sunday Mass and the Second Sunday of Easter (which is within the octave of Easter), we end with the solemn dismissal in which we chant: *Go in the Peace of Christ, Alleluia, Alleluia.* We will use this same dismissal on Pentecost Sunday.

Lastly, the Easter season moves us from reflection to action. We begin the Easter Season by celebrating and reflecting on the Resurrection of the Lord and we will conclude it with the celebration of Pentecost. At Pentecost the Holy Spirit descends upon the disciples, and they are equipped for the mission of the Church. The Easter season helps us to take up the mission of the Church and sends us out into the world to proclaim the Resurrection.

A note of congratulations to our Confirmandi, as they receive the Gifts of the Holy Spirit through the Sacrament of Confirmation by Bishop James Schuerman this Saturday, April 30!!

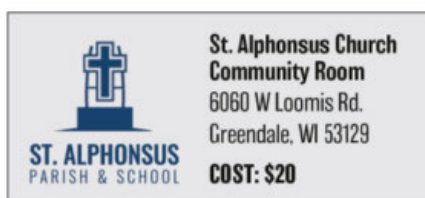
Question Of The Week

Census Statistics and Next Year's Budget

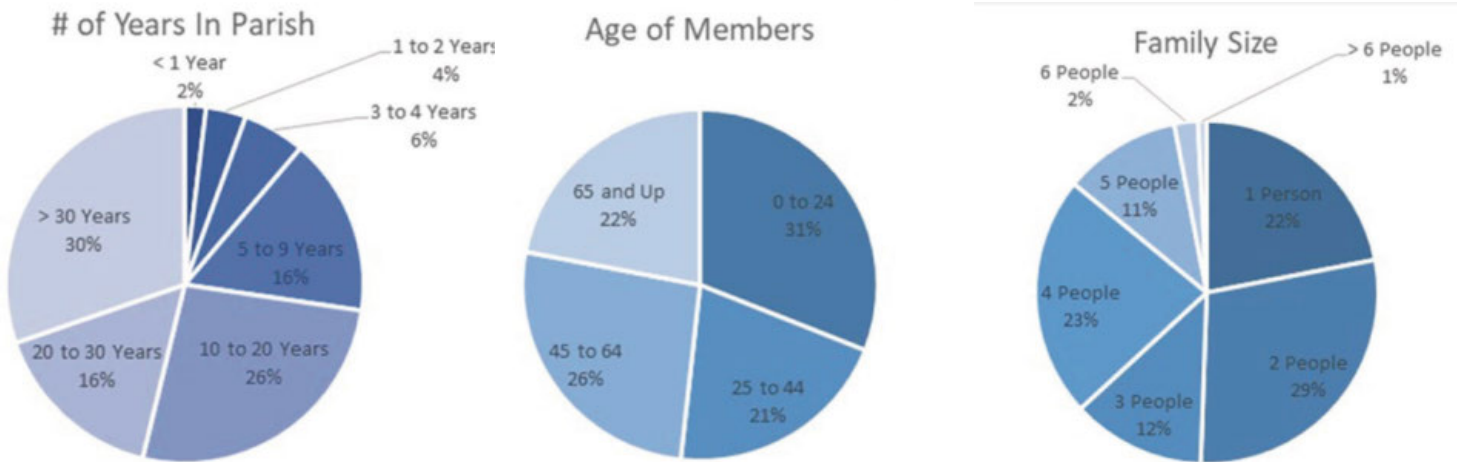
What a busy time of the year! Census forms continue to trickle in, and we are so very grateful to the 1,220 families that returned their form. We have updated many email addresses, removed several landline phone numbers, and entered new cell phone numbers. Fr. Kevin, Fr. Patrick, and the rest of the Parish and School staff will more easily be able to contact you because of your updated information. In addition, we received 429 prayer requests. The Census committee is working on how best to disseminate those requests so we can lift your concerns in prayer. They will also be reaching out to those who have not returned their Census form, trying to update as many families as we can. Please help us by returning your form if you have not already done so. Here is a snapshot of your Parish based on the Census forms returned:

6,786 Members from 2,393 Registered Families

Your Finance Council has been hard at work on the budget for the 2022-2023 fiscal year (July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023). We met with the various departments and committees to develop a reliable budget for the upcoming year. The budget is scheduled to be finalized in the next few weeks and will be presented to the Pastoral Council at their May meeting. The budget summary will then be published on the website and on the bulletin board in the Gathering Space (watch the bulletin for a notice of the posting). 2nd Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday)

Even Thomas struggles to remove his boulder! Being very pragmatic and determined, he wants to see the risen Christ for himself! Thomas's boulder is heavy with mistrust. Many of ours are too. A certain amount of skepticism is good, as it can save us from being duped or misled. But we can become so skeptical of things that it erodes our ability to trust anything we see or hear. Skepticism can actually be a well-disguised defense mechanism that we use to prevent us from being hurt or perceived as a fool. Having too much ego protection is a real risk. Thomas, because of the boulder blocking his vision, could not even trust the word of his friends.

Boulders are hard to move. It's difficult to seek change or take a risk, especially when we are so afraid to be vulnerable or reluctant to trust another's word. When we are closed minded, overly pragmatic, unwilling to see things in a different way, stubborn or defensive, it is difficult to be surprised by God and stretched. We need to be less guarded, self-assured, and self-absorbed. God cannot break into the ordinary moments of our lives and inspire us when we cling to doubt. If we are going to discover resurrection faith, we have to believe that what the witnesses say is true, especially when they are credible. We also have to trust that the risen Christ is alive in us, too!

While the first witnesses to the resurrection have faded into history, there are many others who have come after them. They continue to inspire by walking the talk of faith. They are the martyrs who offer their lives for the Gospel, the simple holy people in our communities who cling so steadfastly to their faith, those who have touched despair and found new hope and the ones who, even in spite of ridicule, still pursue their hunger and thirst for God. They are our friends, acquaintances, biblical heroes, and saints, and many others who are convinced that they have seen the Lord! The risen Christ may not surprise us with the same kind of visit as he did the first disciples, but God finds other ways. All we have to do is open our eyes, remove whatever is preventing us from seeing and believing and exclaim: *"My Lord and my God!"*
