

Outreach Sunday

The third Sunday of each month, excluding the months of Christmas and Easter, has been set aside as Outreach Sunday by the Pastoral Council. All loose monies and checks made out to St. Alphonsus Outreach Program will be given to the charity selected by the Outreach Committee for that month. For May, the Outreach Committee has selected the Women's Care Center as its charity for the month.

Women's Care Center was founded by Professor Janet Smith in 1984, when she was a young professor at the University of Notre Dame. The center has grown to become the largest, most successful pregnancy resource center in America. They serve 30,000 women annually from thirty-three centers in twelve states, including Florida, Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Maryland, Michigan, Minnesota, Nebraska, North Dakota, Ohio, Pennsylvania and Wisconsin. Their mission is to help pregnant women from our communities choose life for their babies, have healthier pregnancies, become better parents and take first steps to self-sufficiency.

Saint Of The Week

St. Damien de Veuster of Moloka'l | May 10

People may be familiar with leprosy from Biblical times, but not so much in the 1800s. However, St. Damien de Veuster of Moloka'l (January 3, 1840 – April 15, 1889) would eventually shed a light on the effects of this devastating disease and allow people to see those afflicted with it with more compassion and love.

Born Joseph de Veuster in Tremelo, Belgium, he quit school at 13 so he could work on the family farm. Feeling called for more, however, he entered the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary six years later, where he took the name of a fourth-century physician and martyr. His brother, a priest from the same congregation, fell ill and was unable to go to his assigned location. Damien quickly volunteered in his place and found himself on the Hawaiian Islands in 1864. Two months after arriving, he was ordained a priest of Honolulu and assigned to the Island of Hawaii.

In 1873, he visited the Hawaiian government's leper colony on the island of Moloka'l, where he petitioned to stay permanently to care for their physical, medical, and spiritual needs. After years of working to improve their location and those who lived there, he con-

tracted Hansen's disease and died of its complications. Saint Damien was canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on October 11, 2009.

Please pray for the souls of those who have recently died and were buried from our parish.

The Sacrament Of Confirmation

The Sacrament of Confirmation is one of the seven sacraments of our Catholic faith. Every sacrament is a special moment in our life with God and a deepening of our faith as God's people. God gives us his life in Baptism, shares His Son with us in Eucharist, forgives us in Reconciliation, strengthens us during the Anointing of the Sick, blesses our love in Marriage and ordains us to a special role in the church through Holy Orders.

The Sacrament of Confirmation is that moment when an individual promises God to be a faithful member of His Church. It is the public event to pronounce "YES" to the process, which began at Baptism.

Through Confirmation, the gifts of the Holy Spirit are received: Wisdom, Understanding, Knowledge, Counsel, Fortitude, Piety and Fear of the Lord. These gifts help us remain faithful to the promise.

The Sacrament of Confirmation...

- welcomes us and deepens our belonging to the faith community
- deepens our relationship with God, as Creator, Redeemer and Spirit
- strengthens us as disciples

At St. Alphonsus, we ask our candidates to participate in a 2-year preparation program. Tenth grade is designed to review and build on their foundation of knowledge, fulfill all Sunday and Holyday obligations, and actively participate in classes. Eleventh grade adds additional layers by connecting Mass with class time, attending off-site retreats, and community service. They also meet regularly with their sponsors and sit down one-on-one with a parish staff member sharing their faith journey and proclaiming their intentions.

The Benefits of Learning a Foreign Language

A question that I am often asked is "Why do we teach a foreign language to our students at such an early age?" We have all heard the answers such as "it teaches us to appreciate others' cultures" and "it increases job opportunities, down the road." But, the truth is that the benefits are actually much more significant, and much more immediate. Here are four GREAT reasons we begin teaching foreign language early. According to The Center for Applied Linguistics; Learning a second language at an early age...

- 1. Enriches and enhances a child's mental development. People who have learned foreign languages show greater cognitive development in areas such as mental flexibility, creativity, and higher order thinking skills, such as problem-solving, conceptualizing, and reasoning.
- 2. Has a positive effect on intellectual growth. In addition to cognitive benefits, children who have studied a language at the elementary level score higher on tests in reading, language arts, and math.
- 3. Leads to the acquisition of some important life skills. Because language learners learn to deal with unfamiliar cultural ideas, they are much better equipped to adapt and cope in a fast-changing world. They also learn to effectively deal with new situations.
- **4. Improves a child's understanding of his/her native language**. Foreign language learners have stronger vocabulary skills in English, a better understanding of the language, and improved literacy in general. These results are apparent in several studies as well as in test scores.

As teachers, we want to do so much more than to just teach subject matter; we want to develop critical thinking and problem solving in our students. Foreign language is helping us to do that.


