From The Pastor's Desk

The Month of Mary

I think that May is one of the busiest months of the calendar for us. Many of us, if not most of us, are busy during this month attending family events such as graduations, confirmations, 1st communions, maybe a wedding or even an ordination. We shouldn't forget that Mother's day is this month. Often, there is not a weekend that is completely free during May. It can be a great month of celebration and spending time with family.



May is important for another reason, but one that gives us yet another reason to celebrate. May is a month dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary. During May, we highlight the Virgin Mary and all that she does for us. There can be some confusion about the role of the Blessed Virgin in the Church. Perhaps you have been confronted with such confusions. For instance, we Catholics are often accused of worshiping Mary. We don't worship Mary, because she is not God. Rather, we honor her for her cooperation in our salvation. She said "yes" to do the Will of God in her life, and in her case, this meant become the human mother of our incarnate Lord Jesus Christ!

This common confusion may come from the fact that we understand that the Blessed Mother was born without original sin. The Blessed Virgin Mary was given a special Grace by God in order to prepare her for the work that she would accomplish in her life (bearing and being the mother of God the Son).

Because of this special Grace, we understand that St. Mary, while not God, is Queen of Heaven. She is the only perfect saint (because she was born that way)! Her role is to be our greatest intercessor. She can bring our requests to her Son who (like all good sons) listens to His mother in a special way. So, never hesitate to bring your needs to St. Mary and ask that she speak to her Son about those needs.

In the midst of the busyness of this month's celebrations, take some time to honor the Blessed Mother. Pray the Rosary or some other Marian devotion. If you want to pray with a group, consider attending the rosary and Mother of Perpetual Help devotions held in the Chapel every Tuesday at 6:30 p.m.

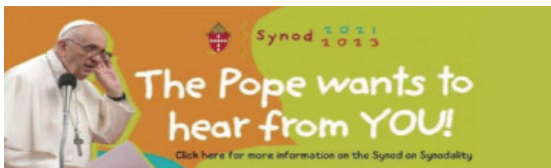
Trustee-Secretary

Saint Of The Week

St. Margaret of Cortona | May 16

Though St. Margaret of Cortona (1247 – 1297) is today known as being an incredibly pious Catholic, she didn't start out that way. Born into a farming family in Laviano, Tuscany, her mother died when St. Margaret was seven. Her father remarried, but life with her stepmother was so difficult that St. Margaret moved out of the home and instead chose to live with a man named Arsenio, though they weren't married. They had been living together for nine years when she gave birth to a son. Knowing in her heart that this wasn't the life that God intended for her to have, she prayed for purity.

One day while waiting for Arsenio, his dog led her into the forest where she found Arsenio murdered. So shocked was St. Margaret that she fell into a life of penance. She and her son returned to Laviano, but still found her stepmother to be as unwelcoming as ever. They then went to Cortona, and eventually her son became a friar.

Three years after her conversion, St. Margaret followed in her son's footsteps and became a Franciscan tertiary. During her life, St. Margaret established a hospital and founded a congregation of tertiary sisters. She was canonized in 1728.

Garden Care-Takers Needed

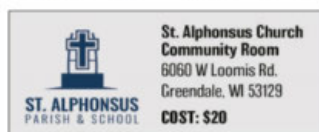

Works of Charity

"Where charity and love prevail, there God is ever found..."

Here at Saint Alphonsus Parish, we are blessed with much generosity by so many folks. Since its inception in the late 1960's, St. Alphonsus Outreach Committee has continued to raise parish awareness and financial support of approved needs beyond our parish. Committee members are appointed by the Pastor and meet once a year to evaluate non-profit organizations' received written requests.

The focus is on programs that not only give direct aid to families and addiction recovery programs, but also those that empower by providing educational (esp. literacy/ESL) and job training opportunities. Organizations must be consistent with our Catholic values.

Each fall, by a simple majority vote, the committee members meet to choose which charities and causes are supported on the nine designated weekends of the coming calendar year. (Exception: Christmas, Easter, and September). Committee recommendations are submitted to the Pastoral Council for approval.

Two weeks before the collection, a parish Bulletin announcement publicizes the Outreach Charity for that particular month. Contributions, cash or checks (excluding parish envelopes and parish-designated checks) placed in the collection on the third weekend of the month are then sent to the charity. **This year' designees are:** Franciscan Peacemakers, Maryknoll Sisters, Christ Child Society, Women's Care Center, Hope Network for Single Mothers, Capuchin Community Services, Mercy Housing Lakefront, Life Navigators, and Project Return.

2022 Outreach Committee Members are: Timothy and Jill Bemis, Judy Budny Chybowski and Mike Chybowski, Maureen and Art Dorrington, Bill and Peggy Mitchell. Ex-officio Members: Fr. Kevin McManaman; Sr. Eileen Kazmierowicz.

5th Sunday of Easter

"It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the Kingdom of God." Many folks really work very hard to circumvent difficult situations. We prefer the easier way around something, rather than risk inconvenience, hurt or prolonged suffering. It's no wonder euthanasia is rapidly becoming acceptable around the world. Through purely human eyes, there is no issue bypassing the inevitable, taking control and bringing things more swiftly to a place of peace. If this is the way God sees things, then why does Jesus make such a big deal helping us understand the experience of suffering and embrace it? God's wisdom clearly takes us in another direction.

Imagine if we were able to eradicate ALL hardship and suffering. Where would we be? As we look at our own journeys, many of our solid more growth-producing life lessons have been born of suffering, disappointment, inconvenience, darkness, and despair. There is something sacred about all of these experiences, as God uses them to create something new. Envisioning a life without hardship and suffering brings us to a vision where everything is flat-lined and dull. As much as hardship and suffering are difficult crosses to bear, not taking them up runs the risk of us becoming shallow, empty, and lifeless. Helen Keller remarks that, *"a happy life consists not in the absence but in the mastery of hardships."* What an incredibly wise insight! Many really successful people and saints were brought to their station in life because they suffered. Suffering teaches us about what's important and propels us to search the depths of our souls for resources and strength we never would have known before.

This is especially true when we love as Jesus asks us to love. Love, perhaps above any other experience, can cause us great hardship, pain, and suffering especially when it's authentic and unconditional. While it can thrust us into an incredible experience of God and life on one hand, it can bruise and wound us deeply on the other. Mastering the art of love is the secret to living life well, walking in the presence of God and investing in the joy of the Gospel. Love and suffering walk hand in hand. Compromising one will compromise the other. Maybe that's why Jesus spent so much time convincing us to accept both. ©LPi
