From The Pastor's Desk

Introduction to the Sacrament of Matrimony

It has been a long time since my last entry in this column on the Sacraments. Spring is always such a busy time of year in the parish! My last entry in this series introduced the Sacraments of Vocation: Holy Matrimony and Holy Orders. Let me use this week's bulletin column to introduce the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony.



Of course, you might argue that this Sacrament needs no introduction because we are all familiar with it. However, while there are many human similarities, matrimony in the Catholic faith is quite different than the rest of the world because for us, it is a Sacrament. I bet you didn't know that of all the seven Sacraments of the Church, Holy Matrimony is unique. This uniqueness forms the foundation for all that we teach about Marriage and Sexuality. Let me explain.

Whenever I celebrate a wedding, I have a particular practice when it comes time for the Rite of Matrimony. I come down out of the sanctuary to the floor of the Church, and I have the bride and groom step up into the Sanctuary. This isn't to put the couple on display or to create nice pictures but to emphasize a particular fact. The uniqueness of the Sacrament of Matrimony derives from the fact that, unlike the other Sacraments, the ordained minister is not the minister of the Grace of the Sacrament. Rather, the ministers of the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony are husband and wife. This reality is what is being communicated during the exchange of consent of the Rite of Matrimony.

This means that husband and wife, in the totality of their being, body, mind, and soul, are the outward signs, given by Jesus, to communicate His unearned and undeserved gift of love active in our lives. This is such an awesome reality! It speaks to the amazing goodness of God's plan for humanity!


This upgrade will cost about \$11,500 for the demolition and construction, and another \$6,000-\$8,000 for furnishings. Our maintenance staff will lead this project so that we can keep our costs low. We hope to complete this much-needed upgrade in the fall.

2022-2023 Budget Available

As promised in my April Pastoral Sharings article, the budget was presented to the Pastoral Council at their May 10 meeting and is now available to share with the parish atlarge.

A budget summary is available on the Finance Council page of the parish website and on the bulletin board in the Gathering Space.

We will again be submitting a deficit budget to the Archdiocese. This means that the expenses for next year are expected to be more than income, something we would not normally be able to manage. However, as part of the CARES Act, the Parish applied for and received an Employee Retention Credit. This government grant will cover the shortfall in income shown in the deficit budget. We know this cannot be sustained forever and we will continue to work to increase income through Stewardship efforts and minimize expenses through more efficient operations so that we end this next fiscal year without the planned deficit. Thank you for your ongoing support of the parish!

Saint Of The Week

St. Rita of Cascia | May 22

Saint Rita of Cascia (1381 – 1457) had the opportunity to live her life as a wife, mother, widow, and eventually, member of a religious community. Born in central Italy, St. Rita felt the calling to become a nun but was pressured at a young age into marriage. During her 18-year marriage to a cruel man, she raised two sons. When her husband was killed in a brawl and her sons died, St. Rita decided to go back to her first love and attempted to join the Augustinian nuns in Cascia. Her status as a widow caused some complications to her entering, but she eventually succeeded in professing vows.

Throughout her lifetime, St. Rita of Cascia was known for her prayerfulness and charity. She also experienced stigmata on her forehead, meditated frequently on Christ's passion, and cared for the nuns of her religious community and those in the lay community who came to her for counsel.

Gospel Meditation - Deeper Understanding Of Scripture

Jesus tells his disciples, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you." The peace that Jesus gives is far different than the kind that comes from the absence of war, conflict, or affliction. The peace that God offers is found alongside suffering and hardship, not necessarily in their absence. St. Teresa of Avila offers us a bit of wisdom regarding peace: "May today there be peace within. May you trust God that you are exactly where you are meant to be. May you not forget the infinite possibilities that are born of faith. May you use those gifts that you have received and pass on the love that has been given to you. May you be content knowing you are a child of God. Let this presence settle into your bones and allow your soul the freedom to sing, dance, praise, and love. It is there for each and every one of us."

In order for us to experience the divine peace that Jesus offers, we have to allow God's presence to settle into our bones! It is only when this happens that we can be truly taught by the Holy Spirit to discern the true path to peace and find ourselves with untroubled hearts. The world and our lives are so unpredictable and changeable. If we look for a source of lasting and real peace only there, our search will never be satisfied. Something will always unsettle and disturb us. The Jewish disciples could really relate to what Jesus was saying about peace (shalom). They already knew that it was more a matter of achieving wholeness and wellbeing than anything else.

Wholeness and wellbeing are precisely what is uncovered when we begin to really see and know the height, depth, and breadth of God's presence and promise. The elegance of God's Divine life flows through our blood and the marrow in our bones. It is that close and deep. As we breathe in and exhale God's life, peace becomes what we know within and what is exhaled out. This remains in the midst of intense conflict, persecution, suffering, rejection, and even death. **©LPi**©LPi
