HOMILY

PROFESSION OF FAITH

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. 

St. Mark recounts this curious detail in his telling of Jesus' healing of the deaf man in today's Gospel. He tells us that Jesus looked up to heaven and groaned as he placed his finger in the man's ear and, spitting, touched his tongue.

Perhaps it is Mark's way of reminding us that Jesus knew well the fear that gripped this deaf man and all of us, who in one way or another, can be deaf to the love and mercy of God which is always the beginning of our own healing.

Jesus groans with longing that we open our lives to God in faith, just as he opened the deaf man's ear. In Jesus' suffering love on the cross, we encounter God's definitive victory over human fear, isolation and despair.

To borrow a truth from the Letter to the Romans, where evil abounds — including evil within the Church and among her leaders — holiness abounds more.

God does not abandon his Church. In every generation (our own, like every other) he sends men and women to restore her purity and revive her mission. In moments of bitterness, this can sound like merely pious word, but the witness of thousands of saints proves that it's true.

In an age of relentless noise, when we are tempted to be deaf to the needs around us. We must commit ourselves to truly listening, we can *hear the will of God* for the Church and for our own lives. I can think of no better gift, and no more important task for all of us.

## Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA)

### WHAT IS RCIA?

*“The rite of Christian initiation presented here is designed for adults who, after hearing the mystery of Christ proclaimed, consciously and freely seek the living God and enter the way of faith and conversion as the Holy Spirit opens their hearts. By God’s help they will be strengthened spiritually during their preparation and at the proper time will receive the sacraments fruitfully.”* (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults # 1, Introduction)

In other words, RCIA is for anyone interested in entering into Full Communion with the Catholic Church, which includes receiving all of the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. These are called the Sacraments of Initiation because they fully initiate one into the Catholic-Christian Faith, making them a full member of the Body of Christ, and open to all of the graces the Holy Spirit wishes to give them. Put in another way,

*“The sacraments of Christian initiation - Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist - lay the foundations of every Christian life. “The sharing in the divine nature given to men through the grace of Christ bears a certain likeness to the origin, development, and nourishing of natural life. The faithful are born anew by Baptism, strengthened by the sacrament of Confirmation, and receive in the Eucharist the food of eternal life. By means of these sacraments of Christian initiation, they thus receive in increasing measure the treasures of the divine life and advance toward the perfection of charity.”* (Catechism of the Catholic Church # 1212)

### WHO IS RCIA FOR?

The RCIA program is geared towards three groups of people...

1. A non-Christian who is interested in becoming Catholic, but has never been baptized.
2. A Protestant who is interested in becoming Catholic, and therefore, interested in receiving Confirmation and Holy Eucharist.
3. A Catholic who was never confirmed and would like to receive Confirmation.

### WHAT IS THE GOAL OF RCIA AT ST. JOAN OF ARC?

1. Participants come to encounter Christ and know him in a new way through the teaching and traditions of the Catholic Church.
2. Participants learn more about the Catholic faith, coming away with deeper knowledge and clarity about what the Catholic Church teaches and why.
3. Participants encounter and come to know other Catholics practicing their faith who will have the opportunity to share how Catholicism has impacted their lives in a profound way.
4. Participants will be prepared to receive the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism [if not already baptized], Confirmation, Holy Eucharist) and therefore, will become full members of the Catholic Church

### TIME COMMITMENT

Once we have an idea of the number of people interested; we will work together to find a common day and time to meet. Previously, it has been a weekly commitment on Sunday afternoons from 12p -1p.




Our June 5 crew had a great day building furniture at the Habitat ReStore.
