MESSAGE FROM FR. DAREN

Dear brothers and sisters,

With the celebration of Christmas now just a few days away, I am very grateful and edified to see how many of you have signed up to join us for Mass at Christmas. We do not have any more room at the 5:00 p.m. or 7:00 p.m. Masses on Christmas Eve, but we do still have room at the 8:00 a.m. Mass on Christmas Day. I regret that I will not be with you for the Masses on Christmas Eve, though I will be with you for Mass on Christmas Day. In order to conserve some strength and not to exhaust myself because of the additional Masses needed to be said both at St. Peter's and at St. Augustine's, I have asked one of the priests from the Cathedral, Father Dominic Rankin, to offer the Masses here at St. Peter's on Christmas Eve. His gracious assistance will allow you to celebrate the Lord's Birth at those two Masses with a priest who isn't worn out and will also allow me to have sufficient strength for the Masses the weekend just after Christmas.

Although our celebrations for Christmas – both within the church and in the domestic church in our homes – will be smaller and simpler than what we would like them to be, it does not mean that we cannot experience the authentic joy that Christmas can give. The joy of Christmas is not found so much in the presents beneath our trees or in the company of family and friends or in the feasting on rich foods. Rather, the true joy of Christmas is found in the hearts of those who recognize the great and wondrous gift the Child of Bethlehem has given to us not only in his Birth, but especially and above all in his Passion, Death, and Resurrection from the dead. The recognition and the acceptance of his merciful love, displayed so unmistakably for us on the Cross, is what gives rise to the true joy of Christmas. Let us not forget that the Christ Child took on our humanity in order to save us from sin and death. This is very point of Christmas.

Please be assured that you and those you love will be remembered in my prayers as I ask the Lord to give each of us the grace to open our hearts to the unfathomable gift of the love given to us in Christ Jesus.

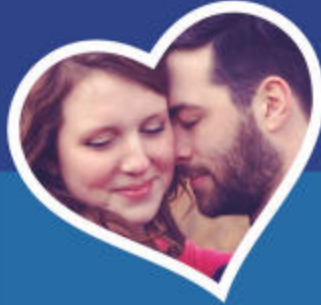
