### **Praying Together as Family**

Today as we celebrate the Holy Family, I think it is also important for us to celebrate our families. I cannot encourage you enough to pray together as a family. As Holy Cross Father Patrick Peyton used to say, "The family that prays together stays together." He promoted the family rosary earning him the title the 'Rosary Priest.' He understood that when a family takes time each day to invoke the help of the Blessed Virgin Mary, while recalling what the Lord said and did to save us, that family will bond together in God's love and be able to withstand whatever comes its way.

The Church reminds us, "The Christian family is the first place of education in prayer. Based on the sacrament of marriage, the family is the 'domestic church' where God's children learn to pray 'as the Church' and to persevere in prayer. For young children in particular, daily family prayer is the first witness of the Church's living memory as awakened patiently by the Holy Spirit" (CCC 2685).

And St. Teresa of Calcutta observed, "I think the world today is upside down, and is suffering so much, because there is so little love in the homes and in family life. We have no time for our children, we have no time for each other; there is no time to enjoy each other. If we could only bring back into our lives the life that Jesus, Mary and Joseph lived in Nazareth, if we could make our homes another Nazareth, I think that peace and joy would reign in the world."

### Ask the Apologist

Dear Apologist, I've been away from the Church for a long while. How do I come back?

The first consideration is what it means to "come back". If it simply means, "I want to be a Catholic in good standing", then the process is simple. First, do an examination of conscience. I suggest finding a guide by searching online for "NCRegister, Confession Guide for Adults". Then go to Confession. Either make an appointment with a priest or go to a regularly scheduled time. No matter what you've done or how long it has been, you're only one Confession away from a blank slate.

Keep going to Mass weekly and return to Confession at least annually and you'll be in good standing. However, there is a danger that doing the bare minimum will seem like a meaningless obligation. Confession and Mass may feel like religious checkboxes, arbitrary hurdles, or perhaps barriers the Church erects between you and God

So why stop there? A better mission might be; "I want to give my life over to God. I want to be a joy-filled disciple of Jesus Christ." In that case you can go above and beyond the bare minimum. For instance, learn more about the faith by listening to Catholic Radio (FM 89.1/90.9), reading the Catechism, or attending a parish Bible study. Deepen your faith by attending daily Mass, going on a CRHP retreat, or spending time at Eucharistic adoration. Serve Christ by volunteering at the Matthew 25 Center or the O'Conner House. The best way to return to the Church is to give your entire life back to Christ. In exchange we receive His life, for Jesus said, "I came so that you may have life – and have it more abundantly" [John 10:10]. Not a bad deal.
