

Dear Parish Family,

Today the Catholic Church throughout the world begins the holiest week of the year. For 2,000 years, the liturgies of Palm Sunday and Holy Week have been a sturdy foundation and have anchored us in who we are as Catholics. But maybe we have heard the Passion so often that we might take what Jesus did for us for granted. But we can't be cold, uncaring, and hold His love for us at arm's length anymore – these events **really happened**. We have to allow His love to pierce our hearts and change us.

I encourage you to use your imagination as you participate in our liturgies this week. Walk right beside Jesus. Feel His love that drove Him to Calvary for the Father and for you personally.

In the Old Testament, God gave the people a ritual way so they could symbolically offer themselves to Him. Burnt, cereal, & peace offerings *expressed* their communion with God; sin and guilt offerings were ways to *restore* their communion with Him. While these offerings can be difficult to understand, they help us understand the Mass better.

God set up the sin offering as a way for them to ask forgiveness for their sins and restore their relationship with Him. Guilt offerings made reparation or restitution for the damage the sin caused. So the one who had sinned would bring an unblemished animal (like a lamb) to the altar and would lay their hands upon its head, transferring their guilt onto the animal. The animal was then sacrificed on behalf of the sinner, thereby restoring the sinner's relationship with God.

This is who Jesus is. He is our sin and guilt offering, our Lamb.

So on Palm Sunday, as Fr. Jim processes up the aisle at Holy Rosary, imagine it being Jesus here with us. Understand that He is processing to the altar to offer Himself as our sin and guilt offering, as *my* sin and guilt offering. He forgives our sins and restores our relationship with the Father. He makes reparation and restitution for the damage our sin caused. This is something that only Jesus could do.

And because Jesus is not bound by time and space, our love for Him today can actually comfort Him as He experienced His Passion. So in your heart, walk there along beside Him. Look up at Him and allow your eyes to meet His eyes so He can feel your deepest sorrow, love, gratitude. Place your hand on His head - or on His heart - and understand that this is how much *He loves you*. And linger here with Him.

Our Holy Thursday liturgy will not finish until the Easter Vigil. Every Holy Week the Church slows the liturgy down so we can enter more fully into the Mystery. So let's not be in a hurry. Let's walk with Him, comfort Him, and understand that it is through His Sacrifice that He willingly endured for us, our relationship with the Father has been restored; Jesus has repaired the damage of our sin!

I pray that you will clear your calendar and join us. Deacon Chuck
