



## One Percent Prayer

## Sustainability Tip

While windows are a significant source of heat loss in the home, the biggest culprit is "air leaks" - drafts in your walls, windows, floors, fireplaces and attics. A 1/8-inch gap under a 36-inch wide door will let as much cold air into your home as a 2.4-inch hole in through your wall. You can lose up to 60% of your heated air before it even reaches the register if it travels through uninsulated ducts in unheated spaces like an attic or crawlspace. ## Epiphany

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany--the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles as represented by the Magi. The Magi represent the people from the East and other nations other than the Jewish people. The Jews were not the only ones who looked forward to a great king to be born to bring peace on earth. The longing of all people is represented in this feast.

Today's second reading from St. Paul to the Ephesians echoes the words of the gospel that Jesus came for all nations: "It was not made known to people in other generations as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: that the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel."(Eph.3:5-6).

Epiphanies are all around us if we are alert to their presence. Jesus reveals himself to us in various ways and invites us to respond to his love like the wise men did. These personal epiphanies convince us there is a God in our midst in all situations and circumstances. But too many people do not move any further in their knowledge and experience of God. I remember when I went on mission trips with groups of teenagers. Before we wrapped up the day, we would go round sharing our "God moments" and the lows of our day. Many of the teenagers shared their God's moments happened in the least-expected situations. They thought they were only helping the people by repairing or rebuilding their homes. But in the process, the teenagers learned a lot from these people. Epiphany moments help us to grow spiritually and as human beings; they uplift us when we are down.

I know everybody is tired of hearing the experiences of this year, but it helps us to reflect on those epiphany moments we had that uplifted us. Married couples, remember your wedding day and how joyous it was. Parents, recall the first time holding your baby in your arms. Think of when you got your first job. The list is endless. We don't need to travel far like the Magi seeking to see Jesus. He is God with us, "Emmanuel." He lives in each one of us, in others and also in nature.

We need to understand we should not be limited by an epiphany we may encounter; we need the experience and guidance of other spiritual persons who can teach us what we do not yet know. Just like the Magi, who listened to the guidance of the angel and didn't return to Herod. This is why we need religion and the Church to guide us. Let us always remember to recognize who lives in each one of us. Epiphanies




