## Encounter Leads to Ministry

When we read the gospels, we hear the transformation that happened to all those who encountered Jesus. Jesus went out to meet people where they were. A good example is when Jesus called his first disciples. He met them at the Sea of Galilee where they were fishing. He met the Samaritan woman at the well, the good thief on the cross, and in today's gospel, Jesus leaves the synagogue and enters the house of Simon's mother-in-law where he encounters her. He heals her, and in return she ministers to him and his disciples. All those Jesus encountered were sent with a mission to serve others in different ways.

During a homily on the First Sunday of Advent in 2014, before he confirmed a group of parish children, Pope Francis said, "The most important thing that can happen to a person is to encounter Jesus who loves us, who has saved us, who gave his life for us." We may ask ourselves, where do we encounter Jesus in our daily lives? First, Jesus is alive in his Word, the inspired gospel stories and the living tradition of our church. Second, we meet Jesus in the sacraments, especially in regular participation in both the Eucharist and the sacrament of reconciliation. And third, we meet Jesus in our loving service to those in need, those who live on the periphery of society.

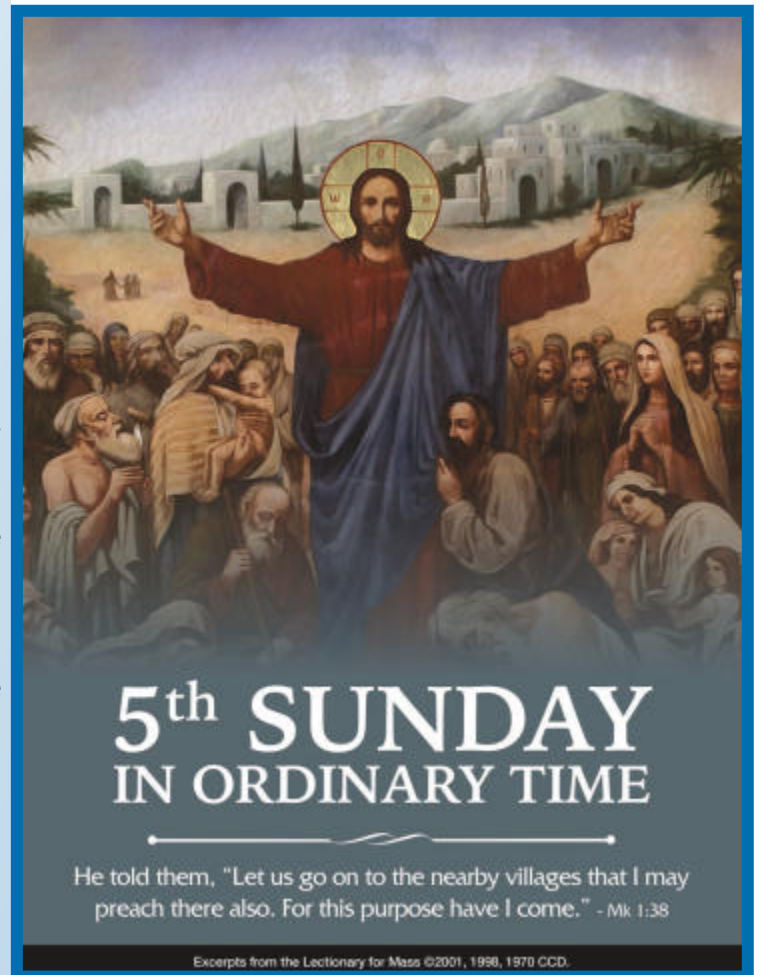
As Jesus healed Simon's mother-in-law, he also desires to heal us and make us whole. But this does not come without a cost. He heals us and sets us free not so that we can simply live life our way, but so we build the kingdom of God by spreading the Christian message, the message of hope and love. As Christians, we are called to say with St. Paul, "Indeed, preaching the gospel is no reason for me to boast; it is an obligation that has been imposed upon me. And woe to me if I do not preach the gospel" (1 Cor 9:16).

All of us are given this mission; we simply need to discern every day what is our calling and what we were created for. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, we have access to the graces and gifts necessary to live out our call every day. At times, the way we are to live out our calling is simply to be a good mother, father, child, loving and devoted wife and husband, man and woman, faithful friend. In other words, as St. Francis of Assisi said, "Preach the gospel at all times; and if necessary, use words." Our deeds need to be a testimony that we are Jesus' disciples.

**Reflections on this Sunday's Readings**

As I walked out of my house this morning, I was hit by a frigid 6-degree wind. As I drove my kids to school, I was extra aware to drive carefully because the streets were still a mess from the blizzard-like conditions a couple of days before. I continue to be weighed down by the emotional toll of living through a global pandemic. Life is hard right now. I am craving the warmth of summer, putting my snow shovel back in storage; I long for a time when I don't have to remember my mask before I leave the house! As I said... life is hard right now.

Echoing reality, our Sunday readings also describe people who are struggling. In fact, Job's first words in the second reading are "Is not man's life on earth a drudgery?" Thanks for easing into it, Job. Job goes on to say, "So I have been assigned months of misery..." As I stated at the beginning, I can relate to the feeling that we are in months of misery.

The good news is that we do not suffer alone. First, we have each other, and second, we have the love of Jesus Christ. Even in our darkest time, Christ does not abandon us. We just have to be a patient while we wait for it.
