Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a several-month process for an adult wishing to become a Catholic through the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist) or through a Profession of Faith. These rites are celebrated at the Easter Vigil. Please call the Parish Office.

Infant Baptism is generally celebrated on the first and third Sundays of the month at 2:00 pm in the Church. The Baptism Preparation Program for parents and godparents, if possible, is held each month. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

Confirmation Adolescent Confirmation Sacramental Preparation is a structured 2 (two)-year faith journey beginning in junior high in our School and our religious education program, Family Program, and continuing through high school to complete the 2-year requirement. Adult Confirmation Sacramental Preparation takes place in a subcategory of the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults. For more information please contact Barb Cegielski, Director of Religious Education.

The Eucharist is brought to the homebound by Care Ministers. Arrangements are made by calling Mary Ann Harvey at 847-323-6910. First Eucharist preparation for children begins in first grade and is celebrated in the spring of second grade. For more information contact Barb Cegielski.

Matrimony arrangements made a year in advance allow for adequate reservation time, participation in marriage preparation programs and liturgical planning. Please call the Parish Office.

Anointing of the Sick is celebrated in the Fall during a communal celebration. Special requests for this sacrament can be arranged by calling the Parish Office.

Reconciliation is celebrated on select Saturdays from 3:30pm to 4:30pm through Sign-Up Genius. Communal Reconciliation Services are held during Advent and Lent.

Dear St. Athanasius Community:

Clothing ourselves in Christ!

Do we remember the clothes we wore at the New Year's Eve celebration just a few days ago? Maybe some of us do or maybe we don't. One thing that we know for sure is that choosing what we put on, or the kind of attire we would like to wear is a big deal for some of us. Have we ever wondered why some people spend lots of time, money or energy in making sure they wear the right clothing? I am sure we might have different opinions about it. At least, we all agree that covering our bodies with clothes is a social expectation.

Even though we all might have different tastes or styles when it comes to choosing our clothing, there is a special clothing that goes beyond our personal preferences and that all the baptized have in common. And that is what today's Feast of the Baptism of the Lord wants to remind us about.

The feast of the Baptism of the Lord wants to highlight that by virtue of our baptism we are all clothed in Christ. So what does it mean to be clothed in Christ? According to our Catholic teaching, "Jesus Christ is the one whom the Father anointed with the Holy Spirit and established as priest, prophet, and king. The whole People of God participates in these three offices of Christ and bears the responsibilities for mission and service that flow from them."



So, in other words, we put on our priestly clothing anytime we recognize that by virtue of our baptism every life is sacred and consecrated to God. We are called to be a spiritual house of holiness. We put on our priestly clothing anytime that we praise God with our lives. Knowing this empowers us to offer our day to day tasks to God as a sacrifice to give him glory. We wear our prophetic clothing anytime we witness to others with our actions that God is at the center of our lives anywhere we go. We wear our prophetic clothing anytime we become God's voice amidst systems of injustice and oppression in our world. We put on our royal attire anytime we serve the poor and needy. For us Christians, our royal power and dignity is shown in humble service to others. As Jesus said, we are called to serve, not to be served.

Next time when we find ourselves debating what to wear, let us remember that there is already embedded in us a special clothing given to us at baptism waiting to shine God's light in the world.

St. Athanasius Review of Recent West Lot Improvements. December 2020 Update

St. Athanasius Parish has occupied almost a full City Block in Northwest Evanston since 1921. The property has been used for both School and Church activities with concern and focus on safety and appropriate use for the needs of our Parish as well as those of the broader Evanston community.

In 2019 a review of various operational components prompted a need for changes to traffic flow and parking as we focused on student safety throughout the school day. In particular, it became necessary to review and improve some parking arrangements for staff and parish usage. Our primary focus was a car-free parking area for student pick-up / drop-off, sporting events and play-area needed to improve safety. This area is also adjacent to our artificial turf site, Lindley Park, which provides a number of opportunities for improved student and staff interactions. This area is well situated on the South side of our North Parking area.

Many of these issues have been solved for student safety including this car-free area. We encourage greater use of the newly configured 14 parking spaces in the South Lot rather than the South Side of the North Lot.

With the current adjustments for parking and new fencing along the North Alley and Eastwood Avenue, student safety has been improved we look forward to some further development of the South

Lot. Although we now have 14 parking spaces along the alley, we are working with St. A's groups to share ideas on the potential use of the remaining 60% of the Lot.

An assortment of open space for school classes and sports, meeting and Mass use, as

well as non-formal gathering space have been discussed. We look forward to some Spring time changes for this now wood-chip and evergreen covered Lot.

St. A's will continue to seek the best opportunities for our school, our parishioners and neighborhood combined. We have done so in this case as safety for all has been enhanced and improved property usage will occur.

We are all grateful to the participants in the To Teach Who Christ Is Campaign, which has funded these Improvements.

We also want to thank staff, students and parishioners for the patience needed to get us to this important phase for our West Lot.




