Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a several-month process for an adult wishing to become a Catholic through the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist) or through a Profession of Faith. These rites are celebrated at the Easter Vigil. Please call the Parish Office.

Infant Baptism is generally celebrated on the first and third Sundays of the month at 1:00 pm in the Church. The Baptism Preparation Program for parents and godparents, if possible, is held each month. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

Confirmation Adolescent Confirmation Sacramental Preparation is a structured 2 (two)-year faith journey beginning in junior high in our School and our religious education program, Family Program, and continuing through high school to complete the 2-year requirement. Adult Confirmation Sacramental Preparation takes place in a subcategory of the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults. For more information please contact Barb Cegielski, Director of Religious Education.

The Eucharist is brought to the homebound by Care Ministers. Arrangements are made by calling Mary Ann Harvey at 847-323-6910. First Eucharist preparation for children begins in first grade and is celebrated in the spring of second grade. For more information contact Barb Cegielski.

Matrimony arrangements made a year in advance allow for adequate reservation time, participation in marriage preparation programs and liturgical planning. Please call the Parish Office.

Anointing of the Sick is celebrated in the Fall during a communal celebration. Special requests for this sacrament can be arranged by calling the Parish Office.

Reconciliation is celebrated on select Saturdays from 3:30pm to 4:30pm through Sign-Up Genius. Communal Reconciliation Services are held during Advent and Lent.

Dear St. Athanasius Community:

God's letters during Lent!

There are two marvelous stories this weekend. In the first story we travel in time to the past, and find ourselves floating in the water and reading God's letter of love to Noah. In the midst of uncertainty and an unknown future when it seems that the end is near for Noah's generation, God makes a covenant with him and his descendants. However, Noah is required to do his part. He builds the ark, holds onto his faith, and follows what God is asking of him. God said, "I set my bow in the clouds to serve as a sign of the covenant between me and the earth." And we know the end of the story. God keeps his promises.



Now, after the story of water, we find ourselves in the desert reading another letter of love from God to Jesus. After his baptism, Jesus is led by the Spirit to a place of sparse vegetation. He is

surrounded by a flat, dry and sandy landscape. He is isolated from his routine, busyness and projects. It seems like the right setting for a peaceful retreat, right? However, it's just in that moment, when Jesus finds himself away from worldly, mundane and material distractions, that he is tempted by Satan. In this spiritual battle, Jesus remembers that the Spirit of God is with him. Jesus says, "This is the time of fulfillment. The Kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel." And we know the end of the story. God never fails us.

So, where do we find ourselves reading God's letters of love for us as we begin the season of Lent? Are we building the ark with Noah, or are we in the desert with Jesus? If we would like to experience how much love God has for us, let us take a moment during this season of Lent and dive into God's letters filled with hope and never ending promises. God's love endures forever. May we all be strengthened over these forty days of Lent to continue growing spiritually, and deepening our relationship with God and with each other.



Please join us for a discussion of Pope Francis' October 2020 encyclical, Fratelli Tutti: On Fraternity and Social Friendship. In it, he proposes great ideals but also tangible ways to build a more just and fraternal world in ordinary ways. Fratelli Tutti is an extension of the work Pope Francis has been doing for years, including overseeing the 2007 Aparecida Document, which called the Church to "go out" among the people, especially the poor, and his signing of the Abu Dhabi declaration with the Grand Imam of Al-Azhar, which seeks to advance a "culture of mutual respect."

How do we fast?
When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

Am I excused from fasting and abstinence?
Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women.





FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

Lectionary: 23

READING I Genesis 9:8-15

God said to Noah and to his sons with him: “See, I am now establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you and with every living creature that was with you: all the birds, and the various tame and wild animals that were with you and came out of the ark. I will establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all bodily creatures be destroyed by the waters of a flood; there shall not be another flood to devastate the earth.” God added: “This is the sign that I am giving for all ages to come, of the covenant between me and you and every living creature with you: I set my bow in the clouds to serve as a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. When I bring clouds over the earth, and the bow appears in the clouds, I will recall the covenant I have made between me and you and all living beings, so that the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all mortal beings.”

READING II 1 Peter 3:18-22

Beloved: Christ suffered for sins once, the righteous for the sake of the unrighteous, that he might lead you to God. Put to death in the flesh, he was brought to life in the Spirit. In it he also went to preach to the spirits in prison, who had once been disobedient while God patiently waited in the days of Noah during the building of the ark, in which a few persons, eight in all, were saved through water. This prefigured baptism, which saves you now. It is not a removal of dirt from the body but an appeal to God for a clear conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers subject to him .

GOSPEL Mark 1:12-15

The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert, and he remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan. He was among wild beasts, and the angels ministered to him.

After John had been arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God: “This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel.”
