A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners and all who worship with us,

By now, all of our registered parish families should have received in the mail a letter from me about our parish finances. With my weekly column I want to be sure that we have reached everyone who considers us their spiritual home.

These first two years have been a challenge to the financial life of the parish. As you might have seen in our Sunday Bulletin, during the first year of unification, we incurred a \$329,000 deficit. Gratefully, because of careful stewardship, we had the available cash reserves to cover the 2023 deficit. This fiscal year - 2024, which ends on June 30, 2024 the budget deficit currently is running at \$175,000. It is no secret that it took our staff and leadership much longer than expected to provide financial updates to our parishioners.

The parish staff and leadership have worked together to keep church expenses to an absolute minimum but the diminished Sunday offertory is *the* significant driver of the overall deficit.

Within the letter you received in the mail, you will find an offertory envelope for a special collection to help your parish close the gap of the anticipated budget deficit. If you prefer, you can use the QR Code at the bottom of this letter. This BOB collection - Balance Our Budget - will be used to meet our financial obligations through the remainder of this current fiscal year which ends on June 30, 2024.

Please prayerfully consider what you might be able to offer in order for the parish to meet its financial obligations thru June 30, 2024.

FIRST READING


Acts 9:26-31

GOSPEL MEDITATION

My friend and fellow pastor, Father Paul, noticed unsightly, overgrown trees near his parish church. He asked the maintenance crew to cut back the growth, which they happily did, telling him the trees would be much healthier and even fuller after a good pruning. A few days later, Father Paul received a letter from an irate man in the neighborhood who wrote, "Jesus would never prune trees like that. He loves trees, unlike you."

I suspect that the neighbor was not familiar with this week's Gospel in which Jesus says of his Father, "He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit" (John 15:2) I don't mean to pick too much on that fellow. He was perhaps ignorant of arboriculture. But I'd wager his main confusion was the pruning and removing quality of God's love. That confusion afflicts us all to some degree, doesn't it? It is just so darn easy to react negatively when God cuts something out of our lives and assume it's not his work at all. In the moment, all we see is the loss, and not the loving desire for future flourishing.

The cross is the great pruning of Christ's body. Jesus' rising is the brand - new growth. It is God's promise to us that all the painful pruning in life is leading us somewhere beautiful. What has been cut back or out in your life? A friend, an opportunity, a sense of certainty, a job, health, a relationship? This week, offer those dry branches to the one who lovingly prunes us in order to make our lives burst with verdant growth.

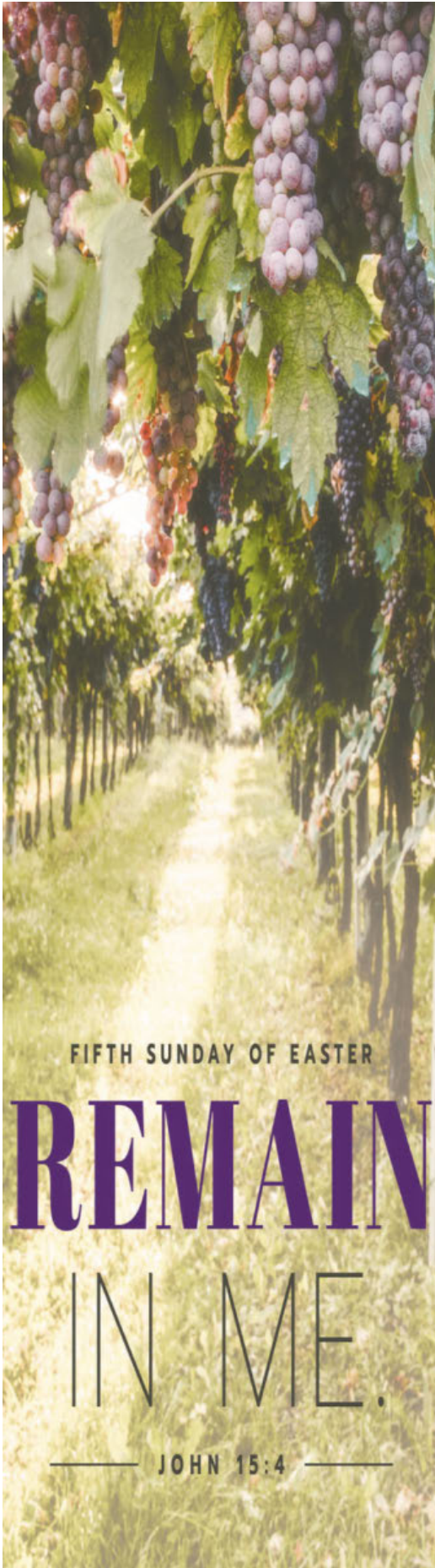
