OUR CATHOLIC FAITH

Q-How can a person who was cremated or blown up be resurrected if their pieces are scattered or lost?

A-When the Sadducees wanted to disprove the idea of life after death, they asked Jesus a question about marriage. Mosaic law required a man to marry his brother's widow if she is childless. They proposed a situation where seven brothers married the same widow, and she was childless when she died. Whose wife would she be? Jesus answers by saying that they were still thinking in terms of this life, not the life to come.

The same can be said about resurrection. It is a reality that is not governed by the laws of earthly existence, but rather the laws of eternity. The resurrected and glorified body is a new creation of God. The body is resurrected not in its old form, but in its new form. Remember how the apostles did not recognize Jesus after the Resurrection? He was glorified, yet still the same. This is why the tadpole and caterpillar are used to explain resurrection. They both become a new creation when they emerge as frogs and butterflies. So will we. The old parts just don't fit on the new model!

Q-If I go to confession and end up repeating the same sins, does that mean I do not have a strong enough intention to amend my life?

A-There is a popular expression that says, "Be patient. God isn't finished with me yet!" Growing in faith and holiness is an ongoing, lifelong project and our struggle with sin is at the heart of it. As St. Paul says, the good he (and we) intends to do, he does not do. The evil he does not intend, he does! It is not a lack of intention (although it might be in some instances), but more often the strength of evil that makes it difficult to change.

The admonition of Ash Wednesday to turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel is not easy to do. So, how do we improve? Two things come to mind. First, pray for and seek out strength and perseverance through sacraments, charitable work, and personal sacrifice. Second, avoid occasions of sin when you might fail or be sorely tempted. In doing these things, remind yourself daily that it is a spiritual war we wage, and with God's grace, we will succeed.

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

**GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER
UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE**

October 14, 2018 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Christian author C.S. Lewis once wrote that Christianity is not so much about being nice people but in being "new men." We see this contrast in today's Gospel. "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus first answers in the predictable way. Follow the commandments! "Teacher, all of these I have observed from my youth." Perhaps for some of us it's easy to answer this way. "I'm a good person!" he seems to reply. Does he truly follow all the commandments he professes to follow? Does he -- in word and deed -- check off all the boxes of the moral law? Perhaps. Whether he's being honest or fudging the truth, Jesus accepts his answer at face value with compassion. "Jesus, looking at him, loved him."

But he's not done yet! Jesus wants to remind us that this attitude alone is not enough. "Go, sell what you have ... then come, follow me." Jesus' invitation to the young man is radical. Abandon everything that gives you any sense of security. Give it all up for an unknown future with a wandering preacher.

The Christian life is not easy. "How hard it is to enter the kingdom of God!" It's easier, Jesus says, for a gigantic camel to squeeze itself through a tiny needle's eye. But the God of the universe creates out of nothing, breaks the bars of hell, and raises the dead to life. Is a needle's eye really such an obstacle? Jesus' invitation is always bigger than our own limitations. This week, what do we need to offer up? How is Jesus inviting us to follow him?
