

From the Parish Director

Baptism of the Lord January 9, 2022

Today we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. You may have asked yourself, why was Jesus baptized? For us the Sacrament of Baptism means the forgiveness of sins and becoming a part of the body of Christ. Jesus did not need to be baptized. He had no sins to be forgiven. He did not need to be made to be a part of himself. Why then was he baptized?

Last week we celebrated the Epiphany, which took place soon after Jesus was born. His baptism, which we celebrate today, took place 30 years later. We know little about his life during those years. His public ministry had not yet begun.

Jesus of Nazareth who was part of the crowd watching John baptize was a non-descript person, a simple carpenter. To all appearances, he was just another pious Jew listening to John's words.

After Jesus was baptized, the most amazing thing happened. "Heaven was opened, and the Holy Spirit descended on him like a dove." If that wasn't enough, a voice came forth from heaven saying, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."

It was at his baptism that Jesus received a clear sign that his time had come. The Spirit took hold of him and his mission had begun. This is what Peter spoke of in the house of Cornelius when he said that God anointed Jesus with the Holy Spirit and with power. This is when he began his mission of salvation. This is when our baptism became possible.

There is a saying used by the Church fathers, "Deus fit homo ut homo fieret Deus," which means, "God became human so that humans might become God." This sums up the meaning of Christianity. Our God not only loves humanity but went so far as to become human himself. Because the infinite God took on human nature, we humans can aspire to participation in the nature of the Divine through eternal life with God.

According to Pope Francis in a Baptism homily, the answer to the question of why Jesus was baptized is this: "Jesus did not need to be baptized, but the first theologians say that, with his body, with his divinity, in baptism he blessed all the waters, so that the waters would have the power to confer baptism." In other words, Jesus made the waters of baptism holy so that we could be made holy by those same waters.
