

From the Parish

Perhaps you have heard of alchemists, the practitioners of the medieval art of alchemy. Alchemists believed that ordinary metal could be transformed into gold. At that time people believed that all things tended to reach perfection. Since gold was thought to be the perfect metal, the alchemists thought that there was a substance in nature that changed ordinary metals into gold. They believed that if they found this substance, they could get rich changing iron or lead into gold.

Just as alchemists sought to transform one thing into another our Gospel story is one of transformation. There are at least three transformations in this story: Jesus transforms water into wine; Jesus' private life is transformed into his public ministry; and the disciples' unbelief is transformed into belief.

The wedding feast at Cana is the first of a series of signs found in John's Gospel. In broad terms, a sign is a symbol that points to that which it signifies. For example, the word exit on a door tells you that is the way out. In John's Gospel the word sign has a special meaning. To John each sign is an act of self-revelation by Christ. It is a wondrous feat that points beyond itself to a deeper reality. Each sign's real significance lies in that deeper reality.

The centerpiece of this story is Jesus changing water into wine. That wine was no ordinary wine but wine of the finest quality. Better yet, there were 120 to 180 gallons of this fine wine for the wedding guests to share. That must have been some party!

This first sign is one of transformation. In looking for the deeper meaning of this sign, we should look for transformation.

I propose to you that the deeper meaning of the wedding feast at Cana relates to the Eucharist that we celebrate here each week. During each Eucharist wine is transformed into the blood of Christ. Although it still looks, tastes and smells like wine, it is no longer wine but is the blood of Christ.

Later in John's Gospel Jesus tells us that his blood is true drink and that whoever drinks his blood remains in him and has eternal life with him. The wedding feast at Cana is a sign pointing to the eternal wedding feast in which we all hope to participate. The transformation of water into wine at Cana points to the transformation that we all hope and pray for, the transformation of our mortal lives here on earth to eternal life with and in Christ.

The wedding feast at Cana points to a deeper reality the Eucharist. The Eucharist in turn points, and indeed leads us, to a still deeper reality – eternal life in Christ.

Stewardship Reflection

Today's Gospel reading from John recounts the familiar story of the wedding feast at Cana when Jesus launched His public ministry by performing His first miracle at his mother's request.

In the midst of the feast, the Blessed Mother noticed that the wine had run out and pointed out the problem to Jesus. Then, she gave the servants instructions that are equally applicable to us modern-day stewards, saying, "Do whatever He tells you." Jesus gives the servants a simple and seemingly mundane task, telling them to fill some stone jars with water. They did what He told them to do. And Jesus used their obedience in the accomplishment of that simple task to perform His first miracle, turning the water into the choicest wine.

Our Lord didn't have to include those servants in order to perform this miracle — He chose to. And today, 2,000 plus years later, He still chooses to include us in the performance of His miracles through our cooperation with Him in using the gifts and talents He has given us. What a privilege! Let us take care to listen to our Blessed Mother: let's examine our lives this week to see if we really are "doing whatever He tells us," cooperating with God to make the best use of the gifts He has given us for the benefit of those around us. If we all take this call seriously, He will perform miracles in our families and our parish.
