

Fasting

The Church formally asks members who have reached the age of 14 to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and each Friday of Lent. In addition, those between the ages of 18 & 59 are required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, taking in only one full meal on those days. The obligation of fasting ceases with the celebration of one's 59th birthday.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

What we say and how we say it reveals the true intentions of our hearts. The content and manner of our speech is a window into the recesses of our souls. Our consciences, attitudes, sentiments, weaknesses, and motives are displayed. As much as we think we can hide the truth of our lives from others, we cannot. Who we really are is not only expressed on our lips but is written on our faces. Jesus says precisely this, "For every tree is known by its own fruit." What does the fruit of our lives say about us?

Because we like to play the game of hide and seek with ourselves, in pretending that we are hiding we deflect attention others may give to us by becoming more critical of others. After all, the more time one can spend analyzing others' behavior the less time one has to look at his or herself. Often, the behaviors we abhor most in others are the very ones we are guilty of ourselves. We just don't know it yet. The more we put ourselves in the role of a judge, the more satisfaction and control we seem to achieve. Yet, what about ourselves? In focusing our attention on the beams in others' eyes, the aridity and barrenness of our lives goes unchecked. St. Ambrose reminds us that "no one heals himself by wounding another." Bringing our brothers and sisters down by being overly critical, serves no positive purpose.

But the one who knows how easy it is to fall into sin and weakness and how quickly errors in judgment can be made, knows the depth of true compassion, mercy, and kindness. Having recognized our own poor choices, misguided opinions, negative emotions, and ability to do horrendous things, we can be more sympathetic and understanding of where others may be. We are designed to be mentors and guides to one another. In walking the journey together, we can help each other become the best we can be. Humility is the order of the day and the primary virtue that prevents us from being hypocrites.

Lent and Ashes

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Lenten season and our journey to Christ's Passion and Resurrection. It is the Church's Day of Atonement, stemming from the Jewish practice of wearing sackcloth and ashes as a sign of repentance. Since the 11th century, receiving ashes on the first day of Lent has been a universal Western Christian practice.

Now may be a good opportunity to think about how you will become more fervent in *prayer*, more eager to discover your own hunger through *fasting*, and more generous in works of charity through *almsgiving*. These three traditional practices are meant to guide and assist us as we strive to form a more perfect relationship with our God.

Why ashes? The imposition of ashes in the form of a cross on our foreheads remind us of some basic truths about ourselves. We are mortal beings, and the dust of ashes reminds us that death is inevitable for each of us. The words at the imposition of ashes call us to make a commitment to reform: "Will you turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel?"

This day beckons us to hear the Gospel anew, to listen with hearts burning! The cross on our forehead is like a question mark calling us to examine the whole of our life, social systems, politics, justice and meaning. What will you do? Will you turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel?

You are invited to begin your Lenten journey at our Ash Wednesday Masses at either 8:15 AM or 7:00 PM. The Lenten reflection booklets will also be available as an additional resource for you. A free will offering is requested.


