

From the Desk of Fr. Lawrence.....

Dear Parishioners,

There have been times in my life where I have wished it were possible to go back, if but for a day, to a moment in my childhood. One of those moments would be Christmas Eve and walking with my family to church for Midnight Mass. I always looked forward to this night which seemed so magical and so beautiful. On our way home from Mass we would sing the Polish carol: "Triumfy, Krola Niebieskiego" (Triumphs, the King of Heaven!). Food would await us on out arrival home and we would get the chance to open one Christmas present before we went to bed. I miss my mom and dad as well as my grandparents who made this night so special. I think of them often and never more than at Christmas. Memories ... Christmas awakens many a memory in each of us, and hopefully it stirs us to remember that God so loved the world that he sent us his only begotten Son to be our Savior.

Saint Francis, "two years before he died," wrote his biographer, Thomas of Celano: "wanted to do something that will help others recall the memory of the little Child who was born in Bethlehem. and set before our bodily eyes in some way the inconveniences of his infant needs, how he lay in a manger, how with ox and ass standing by, he lay upon the hay where he had been placed." (Thus began the custom of the Christmas crèche.) Thomas goes on to relate: "A certain virtuous man saw a little child lying in the manger lifeless, and he saw Saint Francis go up to it and rouse the child as from a deep sleep. This vision was not unfitting, for the Child Jesus had been forgotten in the hearts of many; but, by the working of his grace, he was brought to life again through his servant Saint Francis..."

Isn't it true that the Child Jesus has been forgotten in the hearts of many even today, who seek to celebrate Christmas without Christ? To combat the commercialism of Christmas many will say put Christ back in Christmas. Recently I saw an ad which read: "Put Mass back into Christmas." I like that. As Catholics we can't truly celebrate Christmas without Christ or Mass. Perhaps God will use you and me this Christmas to help bring the memory of Christ alive again in the hearts of many. Masses on Christmas Eve here at the Basilica will be at 4:30 p.m. and 10:30 p.m., and on Christmas Day at 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m.

May you have a very blessed and Merry Christmas! Wishing you an abundance of God's blessings in the New Year of Our Lord, 2021!
