A Note From Our Pastor

Convection in the Church

Any of our budding scientists in our school can tell you that convection is the process in which warm air rises. It happens in a grand scale in nature, which helps produce rain. It happens in a small scale inside convection ovens, which helps cook dinner. And it happens on a medium-sized scale inside our church.

You may have noticed during Mass that some of the windows and the front doors are propped open even in the winter, creating a draft coming in from the outside. This follows the health and safety guidelines issued from local and national agencies. By keeping the doors open and the heat on, the convection created by the incoming draft lifts the air in the church up and vents it to the outside through the ornamental grates located high up on the wall.

We understand that some people find the chilly draft unpleasant or distracting, and we apologize for that, but the resulting convection is necessary as a step to help mitigate the spread of the virus and keep us safer in these times.

Holy Communion on the Tongue

At the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Archdiocese decided for reasons of caution to limit for a time the reception of the Holy Eucharist to the hand. Starting January 31st, and in a safe way, St. Alphonsus will resume the tradition of allowing worshippers the option of receiving the Holy Eucharist on the tongue at our Sunday liturgies. This is a normal, reverent, and

time-honored way of receiving our Lord. Over the past several months, a growing number of parishes in the Archdiocese have also resumed this method of distributing Communion, and have done so in a safe and sanitary way. To date, no parish has reported an incident of COVID-19 spread that can be traced back to reception of the Holy Eucharist on the tongue.



For those who wish to receive the Eucharist on the tongue, an additional Communion minister will be distributing the Sacred Host at a separate station, and sanitize their hands after every reception, while still wearing a mask and face shield. To avoid confusion, this minister will have his own station behind the sanctuary rail (in front of the ambo) and will not be administering the sacrament to anyone else other than those receiving on the tongue. Brief guidance regarding this procedure will be given at each Mass prior to distribution of Communion.

We look forward in great hope to this coming year, and the wonderful ways in which the Lord plans to use our parish for His glory. We thank you for your continued support of St. Alphonsus and we look forward to celebrating Holy Mass with you soon. May God bless you!

Becoming Catholic Through RCIA





Helpful Household Hints by Harvey Levin

FRAUD PREVENTION

1. Do not sign the back of your credit cards. Instead, put 'ASK FOR ID.' If you do that, the thief does not have an example of your signature and therefore cannot try to copy it.
2. When you are writing checks to pay your credit card accounts, DO NOT put the complete account number on the 'For' line. Instead, just put the last four numbers. The credit card company knows the rest of the number, and anyone who might be handling your check won't have access to it.
3. Put your work phone # on your checks instead of your home phone. Never have your SS# printed on your checks. (DUH!) You can add it if it is necessary. But if you have it printed, anyone who sees one of your checks will have it.
4. Photocopy both sides of the contents of your wallet. You will know what you had in your wallet and all of the account numbers and phone numbers to call and cancel. Keep the photocopy in a safe place.
5. Carry a photocopy of your passport in each piece of luggage when you travel either here or abroad. Also, you have to put your name and address on your luggage when you travel. Put your work address and not your home address. Then the crook in Paris cannot contact his accomplice in your home city to tell him which house to burglarize.
6. We've all heard horror stories about fraud that's committed by stealing a Name, address, Social Security number, credit cards. We have been told we should cancel our credit cards immediately. But the key is having the toll-free numbers and your card numbers handy so you know who to call. Keep those where you can find them.
7. File a police report immediately in the jurisdiction where your credit cards, etc., were stolen. This proves to credit providers that you were diligent, and this is a first step toward an investigation (if there ever is one).
8. But here's what is perhaps most important of all. Call one of the 3 national credit reporting organizations immediately to place a fraud alert on your name and also call the Social Security fraud line number. (They share with each other so you do not have to contact all three.) The alert means any company that checks your credit knows your information was stolen, and they have to contact you by phone to authorize new credit.
9. Here are the numbers you always need to contact about your stolen wallet:

 - 2.) Experian (formerly TRW): 1-888-397-3742
 - 3.) Trans Union: 1-800-680 7289
 - 4.) Social Security Administration (fraud line): 1-800-269-0271

Gospel Meditation

It was a normal day by all accounts, but John just wasn't feeling himself. He was a little lightheaded and out of sorts. Later in the afternoon, he experienced a sharp pain in his chest and arm. Quick thinking and action brought John to the emergency department with a diagnosis of a significant heart attack. Surviving this ordeal, he found himself face to face with his cardiologist, having an honest conversation about things that needed to change. "I came close to death," John found himself thinking. Then came the remorse. He was a young man with a loving wife and children who were very close to facing life without him. John found himself with intense sorrow for living an unchecked and self-indulgent life that almost brought him to his demise. He wanted to change.

We all have our wake-up calls. We have experiences and encounters that force us to really think twice about choices we have made and directions we have taken. Often, we find ourselves looking at those we have hurt square in the eye and wallowing in our foolishness. We regrettably realize that we have allowed our needs to lure us into making some cruel mistakes. We impulsively say things and flippantly do things that

reveal our unredeemed and unhealed self. It is a self we stumble over and try to tame but can't quite seem to master and control. Help!

We spin our wheels, naively thinking that we will somehow, perhaps through persistence, get ourselves unstuck. But, we don't. We just get out of the car, feeling very helpless, and ignorantly look at the mess we got ourselves into. Did we ever think to ask someone for help? Or, taken the advice of One who is wiser and avoid this route altogether? "Come after me," are words that Jesus says to all of us. In order to heed his invitation, we must leave our ego-self behind and follow.

When we really see and understand the freedom, peace, justice, and love he offers, we find ourselves with such sorrow in our hearts for how foolish and silly we have been. All the misguided choices and sinful actions come full view and we see how risky our random impassioned behaviors really have been. Repentance is beautiful. When done with a sincere and contrite heart, it directs us to the glory that can be ours, ignites us with the challenge of living a life in service of others and reminds us that all is well.

How to Offer a Mass Intention

Did you ever notice that every Mass said here at St. Alphonsus is offered for a special intention? The entire congregation prays for that intention during the petitions (Prayers of the Faithful) when we say,

"For those who have died, and for the intention of this Mass: (named intention)"

[You can make a Mass Intention request here.](#) Masses are often offered for family, friends and relatives that have died. Praying for the dead is a Spiritual Work of Mercy. Offering a Mass for someone that has died is an especially comforting gesture to the family. Mass can also be offered to commemorate joyful occasions and to give thanks to God for blessings received.

The customary offering for a Mass here is \$15. However, any amount that you would like to offer is completely acceptable. You can request Masses by visiting the Parish Office during office hours or calling the Parish Office at 773-525-0709.

You can **register in the parish** by coming to the rectory office or going online at www.stalphonsuschicago.org. The advantage to registering is that we know who you are and can better plan our programs by knowing whom we serve.


