

Holy Water and Blessed Beer



Holy Water – If you’re ever looking for Holy Water, the church is the place to get it. Perhaps you’ve seen the large vat next to the baptismal font. It’s always available for persons if you bring a small bottle to fill.

Throughout the history of the Church, holy water has been used for blessing religious items, places, and used during various liturgies. It can also be sprinkled on people, and in homes parents can sprinkle it on their children as an invocation to protect the health of a home and a family.

The prayer a priest uses to bless holy water comes from *The Roman Ritual*, and the text inspires confidence in God’s protective grace. The ritual for blessing Holy Water first begins with the blessing of salt, as the priest prays that “it may **become a source of health for the minds and bodies** of all who make use of it. May it rid whatever it touches or sprinkles of all uncleanness, and protect it from every assault of evil spirits. Through Christ our Lord.”

Before the blessed salt is commingled with the water, the priest invokes the Lord’s blessing: “May this, your creature (water), become an agent of divine grace in the service of your mysteries, to drive away evil spirits and **dispel sickness**, so that everything in the homes and other buildings of the faithful that is sprinkled with this water, may be rid of all uncleanness and freed from every harm. **Let no breath of infection and no disease-bearing air remain in these places.** May the wiles of the lurking enemy prove of no avail. Let whatever might menace the safety and peace of those who live here be put to flight **by the sprinkling of this water, so that the health obtained by calling upon your Holy Name, may be made secure against all attack.** Through Christ our Lord. Amen.”

With the delta variant of the virus all around us, this prayer reminds us that because our Catholic faith is incarnational, God’s blessings– and even through the sprinkling of holy water– can bring us protection spiritually and physically.

Parents and parishioners are welcome to fill small bottles with holy water, and sprinkle their children and their homes, including entryways, with the water, echoing the sentiment that their homes and families be protected from any breath of infection or disease-bearing air, and that by calling on the Lord’s Holy Name, their health may be made secure – secure against any virus or variation thereof.

Blessed Beer – if ever you’re looking for Blessed Beer, one of the only places you’ll ever find it is at St. Alphonsus’ Oktoberfest, happening in just two weeks, September 24, 25, and 26. (See page 5 for more info). As part of the festivities on Friday evening, there will be a ceremonial keg tapping at which I will bless the Oktoberfest beer. There is actually a legit prayer in the Catholic Church, and the text of the prayer asks God to make it a “salutary remedy” and that we find it to be “a help in body and in soul.”

Lord, bless this creature, beer, which by Your kindness and power has been produced from kernels of grain, and let it be a salutary remedy for humanity. Grant that whoever drinks it with thanksgiving to Your Holy Name may find it a help in body and in soul. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

When the prayer refers to beer as a “creature,” it more significantly implies and invokes our Creator God. Since He can also be called the Author of Life, God desires that the various elements in His creation, when used responsibly and in proper order, become agents of his grace, blessing, and fruitfulness. That’s why the Church provides this prayer for us.

When the world sometimes seems to be crazy, we could all benefit from a reminder of the blessings we have to fill our hearts with thanksgiving, and to invoke God’s protection on our families and our homes through the sprinkling of a little Holy Water.

May the Lord bless you and your family with health of body and soul.



Oktoberfest Variations

Because everyone wants our Fest to be safe, healthy and successful, and because there is Covid variant floating around, there are a few adjustments we’ve had to make to this year’s Fest. We are sad to report that there will be no craft beer tasting downstairs in Festival Hall. While the room is large, the craft beer event attracts too large a crowd for an indoor venue, and a space that which doesn’t have good ventilation. Even with the room blessed with Holy Water, the prudent thing is for us to focus on the outdoor events.

Another change we’ve had to make is the cancellation of Kinderfest for this year. Because children under 12 aren’t able to be vaccinated, a children’s event or play area would encourage large numbers of unvaccinated children to congregate in too close proximity. Given the circumstances, both the Fest committee and the school administration believe that a Kinderfest area would create too many unnecessary risks for our students and families.

Are You Ready To Become Catholic?

Registration is open for The Rite of Catholic Initiation for Adults (R.C.I.A.) Classes will be every Wednesday from 6 PM– 7:30 PM and begin September 22. Each year we are blessed with several individuals who desire to enter and learn more about the Catholic faith. The RCIA program is the study of the Catholic Faith and the process of introduction into the faith community.

This class is offered for adults in three situations:

1. Un-baptized adults who desire to be baptized in the Catholic Church.
2. Baptized non-Catholic Christians who desire to be formally admitted into communion with the Catholic Church.
3. Baptized Catholics who have not yet been confirmed and desire to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Adult baptism (and if applicable, Confirmation and First Holy Communion) takes place at the Easter Vigil (Evening before Easter Sunday). It is one of the highest celebrations in the Catholic Church's liturgical year!

Gospel Meditation

We need to get our bearings straight and properly lay life's cornerstone. Otherwise, the rest of our journey will be skewed, and our judgment clouded. We can recall Jesus' famous rebuke of Peter, "You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." Even he, as one of Jesus' closest friends struggles with understanding things and grasping the big picture. Pierre Teilhard de Chardin (1881-1955) a renowned and learned French Jesuit priest often has these words attributed to him: "*We are not human beings having a spiritual experience. We are spiritual beings having a human experience.*" Whether they were actually from his lips, they certainly mimic his thought. These wise words orient us and capture the essence of who we really are.

Many people consider spirituality an option. It is no wonder that they come to this conclusion when they predominantly define themselves using human terms and concepts. Immersed in this world view, they struggle finding any semblance of God because God does not work according to human expectations! This is especially true when suffering and death enter life's

picture. If we are only human beings having a spiritual experience, then we wrongly expect our spirituality to serve us as we desire. The human expectation is that my spiritual life is something that is useful in avoiding pain, hardship, and death, not something that gives the courage to live through it!

So, when we protest and get upset with God because our journey is becoming difficult, painful, treacherous, disappointing, and even pointing us toward death, Jesus rebukes us as he did Peter and gently reminds us how to see. It is God who inspires and opens hearts to see truth and beauty. In God, the true meaning of things is understood, and we receive a depth of insight and understanding that is not found following purely human paths. It is not our task to understand God, as God is beyond human understanding. Ours is the joyful privilege of simply resting in God's presence simply because God is God and we are who we are. As spiritual beings having an exciting and adventurous human experience, it is in our DNA to do so. Through prayer we can let go and let be. This is how we lose our lives but then save them.

Live The Liturgy

Inspiration for the Week

Rest in the presence of God simply because God is God and you are you. This is all that is necessary. Out of this relationship will come inspiration, understanding, courage, constancy, truth, and virtues of all kind. We will find ourselves knowing the true meaning of things and developing a depth of insight that is not found following purely human venues. It is God who inspires and opens human hearts to see truth and beauty. In God, we understand all of our relationships with a richer appreciation and come to know who Jesus, who speaks of God's kingdom, really is. The trust that is fostered from resting with the Divine One allows us to

see that God's ways are not our ways. There is something bigger going on in this picture of life. It is something mystical and magical that seeks to surprise us at every turn. It is not for us to cling to this world and its limitations. Our adventure is to dream bigger and brighter, realizing that it is even in suffering that the radiant light of the dawn will come. God's ways allow for our paths to be rocky, challenging, difficult, and even crippling at times. Purely human eyes cannot understand the 'why' of such experiences. The eyes and mind of God, however, reveal and detail a journey that ends in glorious resurrection joy. When we lose our axis and become too human in our thinking, Jesus rebukes us and gently reminds us how to see.

Helpful Household Hints by Harvey Levin

Pumpkins

In case you do not remember the hint from two years ago, here it is again. Do not waste that pumpkin by carving it. You can make the pumpkin into soup. Paint it, instead of carving it. Quantities vary according to the size of pumpkin. For a 12" pumpkin: Wash the pumpkin. Cut pumpkin in half and scrape out the seeds and the membrane. (If you want, separate the seeds for roasting.)

Bake the split pumpkin on a jelly roll pan at 350° for 45 min.

While it is cooking, sauté 8 diced stalks of celery & 2 large diced onions.

Let the pumpkin cool. Separate the meat from the skin and place the meat in a large pot & add the celery and onions and water to cover the pumpkin. Add 4 – 8 cloves of chopped garlic & 2 T salt. Bring to a boil and simmer 45 min. Let the soup cool and run through a food processor or immersion blender to give a smooth consistency.

Heat and add one pint of whipping cream (or less to your taste) and serve.





How to Offer a Mass Intention

Did you ever notice that every Mass said here at St. Alphonsus is offered for a special intention? The entire congregation prays for that intention during the petitions (Prayers of the Faithful) when we say,

"For those who have died, and for the intention of this Mass: (named intention)"

[You can make a Mass Intention request here.](#) Masses are often offered for family, friends and relatives that have died. Praying for the dead is a Spiritual Work of Mercy. Offering a Mass for someone that has died is an especially comforting gesture to the family. Mass can also be offered to commemorate joyful occasions and to give thanks to God for blessings received.

The customary offering for a Mass here is \$15. However, any amount that you would like to offer is completely acceptable. You can request Masses by visiting the Parish Office during office hours or calling the Parish Office at (773) 525-0709.

You can **register in the parish** by coming to the rectory office or going online at www.stalphonsuschicago.org. The advantage to registering is that we know who you are and can better plan our programs by knowing whom we serve.
