



Catholic Schools Week/ Family Mass



St. Alphonsus strongly supports our wonderful Alphonsus Academy & Center for the Arts school and our community families! Since 1974, National Catholic Schools Week is the annual celebration of Catholic education in the United States. It

starts the last Sunday in January and runs all week, which in 2022 is January 30 – February 5. The theme for National Catholic Schools Week 2022 is "Catholic Schools: Faith. Excellence. Service." Schools typically observe the annual celebration week with Masses, open houses and other activities for students, families, parishioners and community members. Through these events, schools focus on the value Catholic education provides to young people and its contributions to our church, our communities and our nation.

It is a shame that CPS and their teacher's union are in constant strife and bickering with city officials over health policies. In the end, the Chicago public school's kids and their education suffers. Luckily Catholic schools have a stable learning environment and are above the politics involved, though of course the health concerns of the latest Omicron variant of Covid-19 are shared amongst all families, regardless of education stature.

St. Alphonsus will be having a special "Family Mass" on Sunday, Jan. 30 at the 11 AM to kick-off Catholic schools week. AACA students will have the opportunity to sign up to read, bring up the gifts, and the children's choir will perform. 




- A NATIONAL EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE
- 1. Do I make an effort to inform myself in a way that is open to truth wherever it might be found or do I only read opinions and media with which I always agree?
- 2. Do I make an effort to find, understand, and read news sources that are objective and follow journalistic standards?
- 3. Do I regularly reduce complex issues to simplistic, partisan sound bites to avoid engaging honestly and vulnerably with people with whom I disagree?
- 4. Do I speak of my ideological opponents in a way that dehumanizes, stereotypes, or objectifies them? Do I speak scornfully or dismissively of those with whom I disagree rather than engaging with their ideas?
- 5. Do I allow feelings of rage, hatred, and bitterness toward those I see as political

enemies grow in my heart?

- 6. Do I cultivate sin in my heart more than I cultivate virtue?
- 7. Do I read spiritual books as much as or more than I read the news?
- 8. Do I speak of and focus on political events more than the Church's liturgical calendar?
- 9. Am I regularly distracted from my responsibilities by news, pundits, political arguments, and negative feelings toward those with whom I disagree?
- 10. What are my highest priorities? Where do I direct most of my energies? Do I put living for God first in my life?

For all those injured and who lost their lives recently, we pray they may rest in peace. For an end to division in our nation, Lord hear our prayer. That peace, justice, and truth may reign in our hearts and in our nation, Lord hear our prayer.

Gospel Meditation

"We are called to live our baptism every day, as new creatures, clothed in Christ."

Pope Francis

What reference point do you use when making decisions? Many times, impulse takes control and decisions are made based solely on emotion and desire. We all know that these types of decisions can often get us into trouble. When a person has a confident sense of who they are and a real understanding of what is important and of value, the likelihood of kneejerk impulsive choices diminishes. Baptism gives us what we need to make well informed and purposeful decisions. By this simple gesture, God claims us as His own and provides us with the identity and purpose we need to properly live life.

It is tremendously reassuring, when we truly embrace this revelation and realize that we no longer have to wonder about the purpose of our lives or struggle to find our way. The answer of who we are in God has been given to us. We no longer have to fumble around, trip over ourselves or walk aimlessly about. Issues surrounding the sacredness of life, the meaning of death, the protection of those most vulnerable, care for the weak and the poor, offering hospitality to those in

search of a home, the purpose and proper place of work, how to create a just social order, caring for creation, and understanding our roles as heralds and stewards are just a few of the wonderful gifts baptism brings. When we make decisions based on things such as these core Gospel truths we



really act as Christ himself, revealing to others the new creations that we are. This is how we live our baptism.

It is difficult to walk against the tide. Yet, that is precisely what baptism calls us to do. Although we are sinners, in need of mercy and far from perfection we are called to order our life and make decisions based upon the wisdom and guidance of Almighty God. He alone is the one who can claim us as His sons and daughters. Standing up for our principles will not make us popular. But who ever said Christianity is a popularity contest? Baptism calls us to stand up for that which goes against the grain of secularism. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor to steady us in the tempests of life and God is very pleased. Forge ahead. There is nothing to fear.

Misa de Señor de Esquipulas

Señor de Esquipulas Mass Sunday January 16 at 12:30 PM



The 12:30 PM Mass on Sunday Jan 16 will be a grand liturgical celebration to honor our Lord in a way that is particular to the people of Guatemala, yet also bears relevance for all of us, who, by virtue of their baptismal call, follow the way of Jesus. Therefore the invitation to participate is extended to all the Christian faithful.

The celebration of Señor de Esquipulas, a cultural devotion to the Black Christ of Esquipulas, therefore invites all the Christian faithful to participate, since we are all called to walk in the way of the Lord Jesus. Esquipulas is a city in Guatemala, and in 1594 an artist from Portugal carved a large crucifix there to help foster devotion among the natives, who found Jesus and the Catholic faith more relatable because of the dark color of the cross. (You may have seen the replica of the cross

which resides in the shrine next to the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe.) Down through the centuries, devotion to this image of our Lord has grown in Central America. The Cross is carried in processions each January, and it has become a powerful symbol offering hope, peace and justice to so many. While the procession at the start will happen, due to the health concerns of the Omicron variant of Covid-19, the annual fiesta in the Festival Hall will not take place. When we worship at this Mass, let us pray to the Lord of Esquipulas to end this pandemic.

Keeping Warm

Now that cold weather is upon us, we need to find better ways to keep us warm. Obviously, a warm coat is "warm." But it is not practical to have various coats in every degree of warmth. So, make sure that your "warm" coat is loose enough to layer underneath it to keep yourself toasty as ... uh toast.


Also, moisture from your body evaporates, so you do not want any moisture in your clothes. Clean clothes are warmer than clothes from yesterday.

Also, color is essential. Dark colors are warmer than light colors. This is regardless of visible light. Yes, black underwear is warmer than white underwear. It has a higher coefficient of thermal conductivity. That is why chocolate ice cream is softer than vanilla ice cream though both are in your dark freezer.

But sometimes you will be outside and regardless of what you are wearing, your fingers and toes are cold. Take ten deep breaths. Count them. Your blood gets aerated and it causes your capillaries to dilate and the extremities get warmer. This really works.

You can make a Mass Intention request here. Masses are often offered for family, friends and relatives that have died. Praying for the dead is a Spiritual Work of Mercy. Offering a Mass for someone that has died is an especially comforting gesture to the family. Mass can also be offered to commemorate joyful occasions and to give thanks to God for blessings received.

The customary offering for a Mass here is **\$15.** However, any amount that you would like to offer is completely acceptable. You can request Masses by visiting the Parish Office during office hours or calling the Parish Office at (773) 525-0709.
