

Palm Fronds on Palm Sunday

Dear brothers and sisters, We celebrate Palm Sunday on the last Sunday before Easter. We begin the Holy Week on this Palm Sunday. It commemorates the triumphant arrival of Christ in Jerusalem. We receive blessed palms during the liturgy and we carry them in procession into church. Because these palms are blessed I ask you not to discard them as trash. We gather them next year and burn them to create the ashes that will be used on Ash Wednesday observance.

What does the Bible tell us about the palms? The Bible tells us that people cut branches from palm trees, laid them across Jesus' path and waved them in the air. They shouted "Hosanna [meaning "save now"], blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" In ancient times, palm branches symbolized peace, goodness, well-being and victory. They were often depicted on coins and important buildings. King Solomon had palm branches carved into the walls and doors of the temple: "On the walls all around the temple, in both the inner and outer rooms, he carved cherubim, palm trees and open flowers." (1 Kings 6:29) Psalms 92:12 says that "the righteous shall flourish like the palm tree." At the end of the Bible, again people from every nation raised palm branches to honor Jesus: "After this I looked, and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and before the Lamb. They were wearing white robes and were holding palm branches in their hands." (Revelation 7:9) As we are in the Holy Week let us fix our minds and hearts on Jesus. Let us bear the Cross so that we may be worthy of wearing the crown He wore. Have a meaningful and fruitful holy week. May God Bless!
