

Happy Feast of the Assumption of Mary! We pray that our Blessed Mother may continue to show us the way to Jesus and to life eternal with Him.

As of today, there is no longer a general dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass that applies to everyone. Each weekend we welcome back more people. It is good to have you with us again!

The best way I can find to explain whether someone should be coming to Mass is this: If someone is out and about for other things, going to stores, restaurants, working with other people, and other things like that, then that person should normally be at Sunday Mass.

Some people, mainly for health reasons, need to be very careful, and continue to stay at home. They do not go shopping, etc. Those who would put their health or that of a loved one in serious jeopardy are encouraged to stay at home. Anyone who is sick should normally stay at home. There is not an obligation for people who fall into this category. That has always been the case and continues to be the case. Those unable to participate in Mass due to these reasons are encouraged to keep holy the Lord's Day by keeping Sunday a day of prayer.

At St. Raphael, there continues to be a section of church reserved only for people wearing masks, and that section is spaced every other pew. People may sit in the rest of church with or without a mask. This allows parents of unvaccinated children and others to have a safer area of the church. Everyone is encouraged to sanitize their hands upon entry into church. Masks are available in the Gathering Space. Those distributing communion continue to sanitize their hands and wear a mask for distribution.

Let us continue to be respectful of one another, and remember that these protocols may change, as we have been adapting to conditions the past year and a half.


Back to Mass

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Dear St. Raphael Families,

The joy of Jesus be with you! As we prepare for the 2021-22 RE school year, our priority is to accompany your family in growing closer in the faith and love of Jesus, while protecting the physical, emotional and spiritual well being of youth and families, even as we continue through the COVID-19 pandemic. Please review our detailed COVID-19 safety protocols listed below. These guidelines apply to all faith formation options for grades 4K-Confirmation.

Face Covering Guidelines

- 1) Face coverings are **optional** for students and volunteers grades 4K-Confirmation to start out the 2021/2022 RE school year, with a mask only classroom alternative available for families who have children in grades 4K-5. (Details and signup listed below)
- 2) Youth who are being sent home due to showing signs of illness will be asked to wear a mask while they wait to be picked up by a parent.

Face Mask Only Alternative for children grades 4K-5: We recognize that children under the age of 12 cannot be vaccinated, so we would like to provide an option to families who prefer their children to be a mask only classroom. Please read the following points below carefully:

- 1) The mask only option is available to families registered for Tuesday/Wednesday class sessions 4:30-6 and Families of Faith
- 2) The students in the mask only classrooms will be a multi-age grouping based on development level. This means that a mask only classroom would not have a grade based curriculum and may contain children in multiple grade levels.
- 3) Families who want their child in a mask only classroom and who have already registered should call or email me (jessie.adrians@raphael.org) by Monday, August 30th to let me know their preference. I will then send them the link to signup via SignupGenius.

Social Distancing Guidelines:

- 1) Social distancing of three feet will be maintained in all classrooms grades 4K-Confirmation.
- 2) Where three feet of social distancing is not possible, plexiglass partitions will be used.

We will continue to monitor public health developments. Our review process will be ongoing throughout the 2021-2022 school year as the COVID-19 pandemic continues to evolve. Mitigation measures including, but not limited to, required face coverings, and increased sanitization protocols may be put in place during the year to allow our youth and families to gather safely. As always don't hesitate to contact me with any questions or concerns. I look forward to growing in the faith and love of Jesus with your family this year.

Reflecting on the Scriptures

So be imitators of God, as beloved children, and live in love, as Christ loved us and handed himself over for us Immorality or any impurity or greed must not even be mentioned among you, as is fitting among holy ones, For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of light, for light produces every kind of goodness and righteousness and truth. Everything exposed by the light becomes visible, for everything that becomes visible is light.

There's nothing like a great bonfire. I'm not talking about a little campfire, but a giant fire in which there's large brush, a fire that is 10-12' in diameter. Early in the summer I enjoyed a bonfire such as this, in which a tractor was used to shove the brush closer together. It was so hot that I thought the hair on my arms and legs were being singed off! That fire lit up the entire area in the dark cover of night.

The effect of light is that it reveals what is hidden in the darkness. "Live as children of light," instructs St. Paul. Indeed, we *are* children of light as Jesus is the Light of the World, and we are God's children. So, what does that look like in our daily lives?

Most of us see or hear the news in one form of media or another. A high percentage of this news is dark, evil, disconcerting, and filled with sin. We can not allow the news to affect our joy or peace, but what we do with it is important; that is, to pray for the people we hear or read about who are hurting or causing hurt.

Living as children of light means that I'm not saying or doing anything I would hide from others. Spiritual health lies in honesty and transparency and so we live in the light when we are willing to lay every part of our lives open to examination by those who need to trust us. If there's something we rush to hide, we are not living in the light of Jesus.


There's a lot of secret sin happening in the world. And a great deal of it includes technology. Some people have text messages, pictures, or videos on their cell phones that they wouldn't want their loved ones to see. Others may not want people to see the "history" of the websites that they've visited. Some people wouldn't want others to read their emails. To live in the light of Christ and to be children of Light, we are open and transparent in our lives. Nothing in our lives should be so shameful that we want to shield it from the eyes of people who love and trust us.

How does one loosen the hold of the secrecy and sin of what is hidden in the darkness of his life? Simply, bring it into the light where it can no longer be secret. One of the best gifts that Jesus has given us (Matt. 16:19) is the Sacrament of Reconciliation, which afford each of us to speak openly, bringing into the light, the secret sins in our lives. AND, it provides a felt sense of the forgiveness that God gives us when we are sincere in repentance. The forgiveness that God gives to us is *grace*, free and with no strings attached. Bringing secret sin out into the light takes away a lot of its power out of our lives. A closet drinker or smoker can testify to this.

To live as Children of God, we are instructed to live in the Light of Christ----to be honest and transparent, to be journeying with Jesus toward eternal life, just beyond the door of death. The other alternative is to live a life of dishonesty, deception, hiding in the dark, journeying down the pathway of destruction and eternal damnation. All of this affects not only us, but all who love us. It is a choice: do I want to bring life to myself and into the relationships that are most important in my life - or do I wish to destroy myself and my most important relationships?



Working with the Scriptures (Lk. 1:39-56)

They tell me that there are countries in South and Central America where praying the words of Mary's Magnificat (the words Mary speaks to Elizabeth in today's Gospel) is prohibited by law. When I first heard this I was surprised. Who would make such a law, especially in a "Christian" country? The answer, it seems, is anyone who would be threatened by words like "Hehas scattered the proud in their conceit...cast down the mighty from their thrones..." and "...lifted up the lowly...filled the hungry...and the rich he has sent away empty." Good news for the poor but not so good if you happen to be rich.

Suppose someone came into your office or shop and said that those who were being paid the lowest salaries would be receiving a bonus so large that they would be able to buy steaks for dinner and new winter coats for everyone in their family? And then, what if they said that those who were making the highest salaries would suddenly find that their money was no good? If you happened to be among the poor living in a third world country this would probably come as pretty good news. But what if you were among the rich?

Bring it closer to home. What if you were a day laborer hired to pick cucumbers or wash dishes in a fancy restaurant and someone told you that from now on you would be paid enough money to not only support your family but even send your children to college? What if you were the president of the company that processed the vegetables? Or the owner of the fancy restaurant?

Mary was an unmarried, pregnant teenager. Later she would know what it meant to leave her homeland, afraid for her life and that of her child. She would see her Son convicted of crimes He did not commit and unjustly sentenced to death. Mary was not unlike many people living today in third world countries - or even in our own. What would happen if the Magnificat was proclaimed on the Evening News? How would we react to Mary's words?

Now we've come full circle! The very first Ripley's column I wrote was about the Assumption of Mary, and this Sunday we celebrate just that. I'll only do this once, but here is a throwback to August 16, 2020 bulletin:

"There are two places in Jerusalem that claim to be the site of the Assumption of Mary. The Catholics have The Abbey of the Dormition at an ancient location next to the Upper Room, where it is held that Mary 'fell asleep' before the Assumption. The other church is an Orthodox site called The Tomb of Mary, located not too far away at the foot of the Mount of Olives. They claim that Mary's casket was processed through the Kidron Valley from where she died and placed in this tomb. St. Thomas (the 'doubter') was supposedly not there to see her placed in the casket, so he requested that it be opened so he could see for himself. To everyone's surprise, Mary's body was not to be found! That said, the two stories are not necessarily in conflict, so believe it or not. However, the main thing we must believe is that by the merits of Christ's victory. Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory."



The first one on what we believe, the Creed starts September 10.


