## From our Deacon

Busy, busy, busy! How often do we find ourselves oh, so busy!? With the conflicting demands of work, family schedules, and paying for and taking care of our possessions we may at times feel overwhelmed by all the things that cry out for immediate attention. How do we prioritize, maintain a proper balance and focus?

For a time I lived in denial. At fifty years old I was the last remaining member of my immediate family (parents and brothers) that did not need glasses to read. I began to either hold things at arms length or let my eyes adjust to see only what was immediately before me. When I would look up to see things at a distance all would remain blurry for quite some time. My focus had become small and short, no longer could I clearly see the big picture. Finally I was prescribed glasses and things became clear again.

In this weekend's gospel reading Jesus invites a man to "sell what you have...; then come follow me." The man's "face fell, and he went away sad, for he had many possessions." Had the man's possessions become his focus, the most important things immediately before him? Perhaps he was in need of some "spiritual glasses". Perhaps at times we all are.

What "spiritual glasses" do we have available to us? At Mass we gather to pray, to hear the word of God and to reflect upon what it means in our lives. In the Eucharist we receive Jesus, we become one body in Christ. At small Christian community gatherings, such as CFM, we listen and support our brothers and sisters, learning how to keep our Catholic faith alive in our daily walks.

Quiet prayer, opening our hearts to the Holy Spirit, may become a "lens" to see God's will. As we go about our busy lives may we pray that we remember to put on "spiritual glasses", to see clearly what matters most: God loves us!

## Reflecting on the Scriptures

"Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" . . . Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said to him, "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." with that statement his face fell, and he went away sad, for he had many possessions.

After the house down the road was nearly totally demolished in the straight line winds a couple of years ago, I bumped into the owner at the grocery store, and asked her how she and her family were doing and where they were living. In her response were these words, "We lost nearly everything, but we're all safe, and we have one another." The threat of losing their lives helped them in letting go of what isn't important.

In today's Gospel, the young man is earnest in asking *the important* question, "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" This individual is clearly a good person as he has been faithful to the commandments. He doesn't realize that his question will lead him somewhere he is unwilling to go.

In Jesus' looking at the man with love, His response reflects that love, for Jesus doesn't want anything to stand in the way of the man's relationship with Him now or hereafter.

Jesus was calling the young man to be *His disciple*. Sadly, this young fellow in walking away said "no" to Jesus' call to discipleship, to love so deeply that he joins Jesus without hesitation. This nameless man chose holding on to his possessions over following Jesus. So did the young fellow rethink his decision afterwards? We will never know. His anonymity reflects that this is not a specific man that He calls but it is His call to each of us to hear our call to discipleship.

The call---and my "yes" to be a disciple---is indeed a profound decision to follow Jesus. The challenge of discipleship is the ability to say "yes" to *surrender* everything for Jesus. That doesn't mean that Jesus will require everything, but He desires us to *be able to let go* of everything else. So, it's *more than* about possessions and relationships; it is about our total "yes" to Jesus and an "all in" life with Him.

Am I equal to the challenge of being a disciple? What if I put myself in the shoes of the rich young man---what if I encountered Jesus and asked Him, "What do I need to do to inherit eternal life?" I am called to be a follower of Jesus before all else in my life---being sister, spouse, mother, daughter, wife, employee, and any role in an organization. What is it that I need to "sell" so that I can faithfully follow Jesus? As I assess my life, what have I allowed to hinder myself from fully responding to Jesus' call to me to be His disciple?

## Marriage Information

### Getting Married?

Congratulations! We would like to help prepare you for the Sacrament of Matrimony. Please call the parish office at least six months prior to your desired wedding date to begin preparation. Marriage preparation prepares you and your future spouse to live a sacramental marriage that is free, faithful, permanent, and fruitful. The grace of God gives strength to live out the sacrament.



### Already married but not married in the Church?

You may call to meet with one of our priests to discuss the possibility of entering into the Sacrament of Matrimony in addition to your civil marriage. This would be a new step in your relationship, asking the grace of God to be at work, and binding you and your spouse to vows before God.

### Previously married?

If you have been married and divorced, you may want to discuss the possibility of an annulment. An annulment process looks at whether the prior marriage had conditions missing for it to be a sacramental marriage. The annulment process is concerned mainly with the personal and spiritual aspects of marriage. It does not "erase" the civil contract, and it does not render children illegitimate. It merely states that after thorough investigation, the Church has decided that a marriage, as the Church understands marriage, was not valid. Deacon John Ingala, Fr. Tom, Betty Schwandt and Tanya Hielke from our parish are trained to assist people in this process. Please call the parish office to set up a time to discuss this with one of them. If an annulment is granted, the person is then free to enter into a sacramental marriage.



## WORKING WITH THE SCRIPTURES

(Mark 10:17-30)

They were ten seniors from a large Catholic University attending a weekend retreat on the spirituality of work and they brought their questions with them. What kind of work would they do after graduation? Where would life take them? Marcie hoped to go into international finance, Greg into banking, and Bill into computer programming. But then there was Philip. Philip had only come on this weekend because the others had talked him into it. He made it quite clear that he wanted nothing to do with organized religion. But it was Philip who spent most of his time writing in his journal, and it was Philip who had shared most deeply when the talk turned to spiritual things. When Philip asked "What must I do?" it was clear that he wasn't just talking about work.

Philip's dad was a successful businessman, at least if one judged success by the size of one's house and the number of figures in one's salary. But Philip questioned his father's definition of success. At the ripe old age of 21 Philip had become quite cynical about what society considered *successful*. His family was Catholic. His parents were heavy contributors to their parish. They did not kill, commit adultery, steal, bear false witness or defraud. But none of that mattered to Philip. What mattered to Philip was that his parents' drive to be *successful* left little time for them to be *family*. True, they provided the best nursing care available for their aging parents; but they never seemed to have the time to actually *visit* them. When Philip was in high school his parents never had the time to go to football games or parents' weekends. In fact, they had been in Europe when he graduated from high school.

"How *hard* it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God...". "A man ran up ... and asked him... 'what must I do to inherit eternal life?'" Philip came on that weekend seeking another kind of treasure. He came asking, "What must I do...?" If he asked us that question, how would we answer him?

# Father Ripley's

## Believe It or Not!

It might be interesting to note that the very verse which helped bring St. Francis to a deepening of his faith (his feast day was last week), is part of the Gospel for this Sunday. "Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." That is exactly what Francis did. Now, is every Christian called to do exactly that? Not literally, but certainly in some sense.

Jesus continues with this theme by saying, "how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." What's behind this analogy?

When I was walking through Jerusalem not far from the Tomb of Jesus, my friends and I noticed a door to a church which seemed to have a museum. As we went in, someone accepted our shekels, and we went down a staircase into some ancient ruins. Believe it or not, they claimed they found the "Eye of the Needle," which was possibly a nickname for a gate through which camels could pass with some difficulty, but not elephants or horses. The bottom of the passage was very narrow, and the top was wide, allowing camels to fit through much like that gameshow "Hole in the Wall."

Another explanation is that the Greek word for "camel" (*kamelon*) and "rope" (*kamilon*) are very similar, and the words were mixed up in copying. Perhaps Jesus was making a point that the rope is very difficult to pass through a needle. Yet, perhaps there was no mistake, and Jesus was using hyperbole to make a point: certainly it would be impossible for a camel to pass through a tiny needle's eye; therefore, take care that we don't get too attached to our material possessions, lest we forfeit eternal life.


