





December 25 is Christmas Day! Light the Christ Candle in the Center of your wreath. Say the prayer found on this page.

The 12 Days of Christmas: Christmas day starts the Christmas season, which isn't a *day but actually continues.* In fact, there are 12 whole days of Christmas, and they go all the way through the Epiphany! Here are two activities you can do as a family to celebrate the Christmas Season:

Read 12 picture books about Christmas, 1 for each day during Christmas

Move the kings for your nativity set each closer and closer to the nativity set, having the kings arrive on the actual Epiphany

Reflecting on the Scriptures

Put on, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another, And over all these put on love, And let the peace of Christ control your hearts, The peace into which you were also called in one body.

As I look in the mirror before heading out the door, I take one last look. What do I look like in this sweater, with these earrings? Some days I change my mind and say, "Hmm, that doesn't look very good", and proceed to change. What do I want people to see when they look at me?

In today's reading, St. Paul talks about how we are to "*clothe*" ourselves in genuine Christian character, "*heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another*".

The "heartfelt compassion", which Paul speaks of, pulls me away from focusing on myself, to be more aware of *others* and in tune with *their* struggles, to feel for them and with them. God's love propels me to move *outward* to others as described by Blessed Cardinal John Henry Newman,

"Shine through me, and be so in me So that every soul I come in contact with May feel Your presence in my soul. Let them look up and see no longer me, but only You, O Lord"

I am also to robe myself in *kindness*. One of the simplest ways to love is to be kind. "Kindness is the language spoken by the dumb, heard by the deaf and seen by the blind," as described by Twain. Notice once again that my attention and concern is for *"the other"*, not for myself. It can be a smile in passing, holding the door, a mild disposition, attention to the needs of the other, a pleasant tenderness in words and action. Kindness drives me to extend help to those in need without expectation of anything in return.

I must also vest myself in *gentleness*; in order to be truly gentle, I must be strong because gentleness restrains strength by love. Gentleness interrupts harshness with its own kind of beauty. It is evident in the way a mother cradles a newborn baby or a father bouncing his toddler on his knee.


I smile at St. Paul's naming "bearing with one another" as he must have lived the challenges of living daily with those we love! To love one another when I or they are not their best selves is the love that is truly a fruit of the Holy Spirit.

What is the underpinning of the virtues I am to clothe myself in? Paul states, "And over all these put on *love*". This is how I am to look into the eyes of others, deal with annoyances, people at the checkout line, my fellow drivers on the road, and with those who drive me a little crazy. And for those who live under the same roof, those closest to me—and to you---we must put on the mind of Christ, who lived *self-sacrificing* love. I see it in dear Pope Francis, who lives humbly, loves widely, and breathes the love of Jesus to others. May I not only Jesus, but live the love of Jesus each moment, especially when it is most inconvenient and challenging.

AFTERSHOCK FUN!





Believe it or not, one thing I strongly associate with Christmas is vulgar language. Wait, wait, what? Let me explain.

In the 5th century, the Bible was translated into Latin by St. Jerome. It was originally in Greek, but the common language of the people of the Roman Empire has become Latin. Therefore, the Church wanted to have it in the common, or "vulgar," language. That's what the word means, although it has become synonymous with slang.

Now, what is the connection with Christmas? St. Jerome requested that he be given a cell in the basement of the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem to do his 15-year long work of translation. His received his request and started to live and study in a stone-walled room right next to the spot Jesus was born.

His version of the Bible is known as the Vulgate.

When I visited Bethlehem for three weeks in seminary, I went several times early in the morning to Mass at the place Jesus was born, and afterwards I would pray in St. Jerome's cell. It gave me a sort of affection for the place and for St. Jerome and his work of translating God's word into the vulgar language.


