





#### **Reflecting on the Scriptures**

It has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: that the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel.

Happy Epiphany! This is OUR feast day! Epiphany, is the day that the birth of Jesus Christ our Savior, is revealed to the non-Jews, like most of us! Yes, this is the day in which the Lord revealed that He came not only for the Israelites---the Jews---but He also came for you and for me! Today we celebrate!

The Magi at the manger represent the inclusion of the outsiders in the people of God. In the words of Paul, "It has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: that the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel." They remind us that we can expect God to consistently undermine the safe and convenient barriers we like to draw between ourselves and the 'other'. The peace and justice that God-with-us brings is "uncomfortable" for the comfortable.

Today's Gospel also directs and challenges us. In what way? Well, this news was disturbing for the Jewish people, that they were not exclusively God's chosen people. In our nation today, many like to exclude others: from safety, refuge, freedom, providing for their families, being welcomed, and the list goes on. As we know, Joseph learned from God in a dream that he needed to take Mary and Jesus to Egypt to flee from his homeland to a country where they all would be safe. Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, as refugees, fled to a safe and different land. Jesus himself welcomed the Samaritan woman, the tax collector, the widow, and did not exclude anyone.

Sacred Scripture is our guide as Christians. We are children of God first and foremost of all. As a disciple of Jesus, we are inclusive of all peoples, disregarding nationality, education, political issues, religious differences. etc.

Like the magi we leave from our encountering Jesus, changed. If I allow myself to enter the scene, where Jesus lay in the manger, I could pick up the child, receiving him the way I receive the Eucharist. I could say, "Amen." Amen to this gift, this love, this saving redemption, this mysterious way of surprising me into seeing my vulnerable God's love for me. I can imagine how different it will be to say "Amen" when I next receive the Eucharist! May I receive Jesus so completely that my heart is able to receive with love all of the other people God created, regardless of who they are, where they come from, what they believe, or how they vote.

#### **WORKING WITH THE SCRIPTURES**

While many of us may still have our Christmas trees up, if you're anything like me it feels like Christmas was weeks - rather than just days ago. Even the 'after-Christmas sales' are winding Hats and noisemakers have replaced down. Santas and snowmen on store shelves and there's nary a Christmas carol to be heard. And we might find ourselves asking, "What difference does it make anyway?" Or, perhaps more to the point. "What difference does Christmas make in our lives?"

Matthew's Gospel describes a world of class distinctions and crooked politicians and prejudice. a world divided between those who 'have' and those who 'have-not'. In other words, Matthew describes a world very much like our own. But then something happened, something that made a difference.

"And you, Bethlehem...from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel." Shepherds were looked down upon. They spent their lives moving from place to place with their sheep – and they smelled like it. There were many shepherds around Bethlehem. "[B]ehold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem..." The magi were astronomers, the 'college professors' of their time. "They prostrated themselves and did him homage." Picture Harvard faculty bowing down before the janitor's son! "Then they...offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh." Evidently these men were also wealthy. It must have cost quite a lot to make such a trip, not to mention the cost of their gifts. Something was happening something that would make a difference.

But that was 2000 years (or maybe just a few days) ago. Christmas is over and Valentine hearts have replaced Santa in the mall. But wait a minute maybe that's OK. In fact, maybe that's exactly the point! Christmas isn't about political power or prestige - Christmas is about love. Christmas isn't about what we get - it's about what we give! Maybe we need to be more like the magi, more concerned about *bringing* gifts than *getting* them. Maybe that's what would make the difference! The magi went away changed, departing "...by another way." Can we say the same? Are we changed? What difference does Christmas make in our lives?

# Father KIRLLY'S-----Believe It or Not!

"But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are small among the clans of Judah, out of you will come for me one who will be ruler over Israel, whose origins are from of old, from ancient times." Micah 5:2

This prophecy was written around 700 years before the birth of Christ. It singled out Bethlehem as the town in which the messiah would be born, the descendant of David to rule over Israel in an everlasting kingdom. Since then, there has only been one person widely accepted as the messiah, and He was born in Bethlehem.

Bethlehem. In Hebrew, split into two words--"bet" and "lehem"--it means "house of bread." In Arabic, it is "bayt" "lahm," which means "house of meat." In God's amazing providence, Jesus was born there. Jesus, who would later call himself the Bread of Life and tell his followers that they must eat his flesh, was laid in a manger, an eating trough. The Eucharist is the Bread of Life, the flesh of Christ for the life of the world.

When I stayed in Bethlehem for a few weeks, the air of the early mornings was filled with the smell of--believe it or not--fresh bread. What a wonderful reminder that was of our Savior.
