

This weekend we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. What a wonderful time to reflect on our own reception of the Sacrament of Baptism!

As Catholic Christians we believe we are joined to Jesus Christ through baptism, for "through Baptism we are freed from sin and reborn as sons of God; we become members of Christ". (CCC,1213) At our baptism we are anointed with the sacred Chrism accompanied by the words "He now anoints you with the Chrism of salvation, so that you may remain as a member of Christ, Priest, Prophet and King, unto eternal life."



What then does this mean, what does it look like in our daily walks with Jesus and each other? "The faithful exercise their baptismal priesthood through their participation, each according to his own vocation, in Christ's mission of priest, prophet, and king." (CCC,1546)

- Through our common priesthood we pray to God our Father through our Lord Jesus Christ. We offer Him the gift of our love.

Renewal of Baptismal Promises


- Do you reject Satan? I do.

Surpassing our \$10 million goal offers a Catholic campaign to greater assurance and broadened opportunities

In order to expand Catholic education and strengthen the Catholic faith in the Oshkosh community for generations to come, Lourdes Academy and the Oshkosh parishes partnered together to raise \$10 million through the one by One campaign. Overwhelming community-wide support from alumni, parishioners, families and friends has brought us to our goal (more than \$10.1 million to date), and our vision will become a reality. But our work doesn't stop here. Surpassing our goal is essential to offer greater assurance and broadened opportunities.



While reaching our goal was paramount to our success, surpassing it will allow us to meet unforeseen obstacles, unanticipated needs, and unbudgeted improvements to the existing Lourdes building.

Unbudgeted improvements to the existing building remodel have already been identified, including LED lighting; updated HVAC controls for higher efficiency; updated fire alarm system; controlled access doors and cameras for heightened security; and improved WiFi, communication and phone systems. In addition, an expanded budget for playground equipment will enhance the outdoor space. The multi-purpose room in the elementary addition can also feature repurposed stained glass windows honoring Our Lady of Lourdes and featuring other images of our Catholic identity.


ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

"We are called to live our baptism every day, as new creatures, clothed in Christ."

Pope Francis

What reference point do you use when making decisions? Many times, impulse takes control and decisions are made based solely on emotion and desire. We all know that these types of decisions can often get us into trouble. When a person has a confident sense of who they are and a real understanding of what is important and of value, the likelihood of kneejerk impulsive choices diminishes. Baptism gives us what we need to make well informed and purposeful decisions. By this simple gesture, God claims us as His own and provides us with the identity and purpose we need to properly live life

It is tremendously reassuring, when we truly embrace this revelation and realize that we no longer have to wonder about the purpose of our lives or struggle to find our way. The answer of who we are in God has been given to us. We no longer have to fumble around, trip over ourselves or walk aimlessly about. Issues surrounding the sacredness of life, the meaning of death,



the protection of those most vulnerable, care for the weak and the poor, offering hospitality to those in search of a home, the purpose and proper place of work, how to create a just social order, caring for creation, and understanding our roles as heralds and stewards are just a few of the wonderful gifts baptism brings. When we make decisions based on things such as these core Gospel truths we really act as Christ himself, revealing to others the new creations that we are. This is how we live our baptism.

It is difficult to walk against the tide. Yet, that is precisely what

baptism calls us to do. Although we are sinners, in need of mercy and far from perfection we are called to order our life and make decisions based upon the wisdom and guidance of Almighty God. He alone is the one who can claim us as His sons and daughters. Standing up for our principles will not make us popular. But who ever said Christianity is a popularity contest? Baptism calls us to stand up for that which goes against the grain of secularism. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor to steady us in the tempests of life and God is very pleased. Forge ahead. There is nothing to fear.

WORKING WITH THE SCRIPTURES

Archbishop Desmond Tutu, Nobel Peace Prizewinning Anglican cleric, has died at the age of 90. His work for civil and human rights made him a revered leader during the struggle to end apartheid in his native South Africa. South African President Cyril Ramaphosa describes Tutu as "A man of extraordinary intellect, integrity and invincibility against the forces of apartheid tender and vulnerable in his compassion for those who had suffered oppression, injustice and violence under apartheid, and oppressed and downtrodden people around the world."

Apartheid. South Africa's official policy of racial segregation, ended in the early '90s. Nelson Mandela became president of the country and Tutu was named chair of South Africa's Truth and Reconciliation Commission. In 2012 he was recognized for "his lifelong commitment to speaking truth to power." The following year he received the Templeton Prize for his "work in advancing spiritual principles such as love and forgiveness..."

In today's readings from the Prophet Isaiah we hear the Lord say, "Here is my servant...he shall bring forth justice to the nations..." And in another place, "Comfort, give comfort to my people..." Certainly Archbishop Desmond Tutu did this. The current archbishop of Cape Town described Tutu's legacy as moral strength, moral courage and clarity, saying "He cried because he felt the people's pain. And he cackled with delight when he shared their joy." The current Archbishop of Canterbury has described Tutu as "a prophet and a priest, a man of words and action..."

The person or group of people addressed in Second Isaiah is often referred to as the Suffering Servant and assumed to be the Messiah. But perhaps there is more to it than that. In 2011 Episcopal Priest Robert V. Taylor wrote, "Desmond Tutu had no reason to act as he did other than his profound sense of our shared humanity in working for a world in which justice and the wellbeing of all is an expression of his ethical leadership of compassion." Isn't this what it means to be God's servant? This is what Archbishop Desmond Tutu dedicated his life to. Are we not called to do the same?

Father RRY's Believe It or Not!

As Catholics, along with the other mainstream Protestant communities, we believe that Baptism can only be done once in someone's lifetime. There is an indelible mark left on the soul, and the child or adult is permanently made an adopted child of God. The body is made a temple of the Holy Spirit. The stain of original sin is removed. Sanctifying grace is given. The list could go on.

When I was in college, a friend of mine who was baptized as a baby asked me whether or not it was okay to get rebaptized. I told him no, I think you can only receive it once. He explained that the church he attended was inviting him to do so as a way of making a public profession of his faith. I said that there are other ways you can do that, but baptism is effective it's something unearned and received, not a work that we accomplish. Babies have been baptized since the Acts of the Apostles.

When I was a student chaplain at the Cleveland Clinic, I was called upon during a night shift to attend to an actively dying man. The family asked that I Baptize him. This was my first night of being on call and my first situation where I could actually - as a layperson perform a Sacrament. Anyone can baptize in an emergency, so make sure you know the ritual! The thing I had to verify was whether or not he was already baptized, and they said (believe it or not) that their Evangelical church would not let him, since he was physically not able to climb up the stairs to the stage and get in the water. So, now at the end of his life, they gathered around, we found some water, and hopefully I did it right.

Catholicism 101:

Ever wish you knew more about your Catholic Faith? Then this One Is for You!

Many of us know our Catholic faith but don't really feel like we KNOW it, or understand it well enough to speak easily with others about it. Different topics will be offered. Some topics are only 4 sessions and some are only 1 or 2! The first one on what we believe, the Creed starts January 18. Three sessions: Jan. 18, 25 and Feb.1. **Tuesdays**, **6:15 – 7:45 pm**

Reflecting on the Scriptures

After all the people had been baptized and Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, heaven was opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son with you I am well pleased." --- Luke 3

November 23 is the most important date in my life. No, it's not my birthday. But a day much greater than that. It's the day I was baptized.

Luke gives the account of Jesus' baptism. First, it is clear who Jesus is: Jesus is the Son of God the Father. Then the depth of that relationship is expressed, "With you I am well pleased." I imagine how awesome it would be to hear God the Father say that to me. The awe and wonder in this account of Jesus' baptism is that the identity and depth of love the Father has for His son Jesus is the same identity, depth of love, and affirmation which I can claim, thanks to my Baptism. What Jesus possesses by nature, I possess by adoption, the incredible gift of God's mercy toward me. I am a beloved daughter; the Father is "well pleased" with me. But how difficult it is for me---and you---to accept this identity, this relationship, this love! What endless evasions I construct and conditions I place on that simple truth!

Today I am going to sit guietly with the phrase, "With you I am well pleased" and let it wash over me. I will pay attention to what comes up in my heart and then relate all of that to God. And then in that quiet encounter, overcoming objections and healing whatever obstacles may appear, the Lord will move me to embrace the truth of his generous love for me.

My baptism, November 23, was the beginning of my life as a child of God! I was welcomed into the family of God, and the relationship of all three persons in the Trinity. The meaning of "baptism "is plunging into the depths. It signifies dying and rising to new life. My old (sinful) life is put to death, and, through baptism, I rise to new life in Christ---which is pure grace and gift. I am no longer a child of the world, but a child of God, daughter/son of God. And, like Jesus, through my baptism, I, too, am commissioned. I am sent out to continue the mission of Jesus. I am called to be the body of Christ in the world after receiving Christ's body at communion, and to go forth loving and being present in kindness, patience, generosity as Jesus did. My mission is to live and proclaim the "good news" just as Jesus did.




