



THE GIFTS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

The American poet, Robert Frost, once wrote: "... that there is a congenital something in us that hates a wall." Well, I would suggest that there is also something in us that loves a list, especially in us who are cradle Catholics.

Our classical catechisms had lists for everything - sacraments, commandments, deadly sins, cardinal virtues, minor virtues and even types of angels. There are two such lists for the Holy Spirit, one listing the fruits and the other listing the gifts. These gifts are not simply lists arbitrarily created for teaching purposes; both have a solid biblical foundation.

THE SEVEN GIFTS Wisdom Understanding Counsel (Right Judgement) Fortitude (Courage) Knowledge Piety (Reverence) Fear of the Lord (Wonder & Awe)

The gifts ascribed to the Spirit are based upon two biblical lists; the first given by the prophet Isaiah (11:2) and the second revealed by Paul in 1 Corinthians (12:4-11) this Sunday's Second Reading. Our catechisms, both old and new, summarize these gifts in a list of seven: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of the Lord.

Fr. Ron Rolheiser, OMI asked an interesting question (at least to me): "How is the Holy Spirit generated within the Trinity and how do the gifts of the Spirit flow out of that?" And Fr. Ron also states; "It might seem daunting to try to describe, but we are not without help from divine revelation and human mirrors in doing so." Thus ...

The Holy Spirit has classically been defined in theology as "the love between the Father and the Son." This is not simply an abstract formula but a phrase that tries to express, however inadequately, what results anywhere, here or in heaven, whenever there is a genuine reciprocal flow of love.

Fr. Rolheiser points out that simply within the normal flow of human love, we can see the following dynamic:

- Someone, out of love and gratitude, gives a gift to another.
- That gift helps fire love and gratitude in that other who then, in gratitude, reciprocates.
- This reciprocation fires a deeper love and gratitude within the initial giver who can now give in an even deeper way to the other.
- This in turn fires a still deeper love and gratitude in that other who can then respond even more deeply in love and gratitude to the giver.

As this dynamic works, an energy, a fire, a certain palpable force, a spirit, begins to build which affects and infects for the good everything it comes into contact with, drawing it into its own joyous energy.

That is, by way of analogy, how the Holy Trinity works and how the Holy Spirit is generated.

The gifts of the Spirit flow from its fruits: When one's heart and mind are colored by love, joy, peace, patience, goodness, gentleness, fidelity and chastity (as opposed to anger, bitterness, fear and lust) one will also understand things and react to them from a different wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of the Lord.

The Holy Spirit is working and flowing now and forever ... tap into it!

January is the month dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus. Here are some ways your family can grow together in faith this month.

January 21 is the Feast of St. Agnes who is the patron of young girls. Her greatest desire was to give her life to Jesus. Below is a recipe for Agnesenplätzchen (St. Agnes Cookies) which are a jam filled cookie first made in Germany. After baking the cookies together as a family, say the St. Agnes prayer on this page before enjoying your treat!

Agnesenplätzchen (St. Agnes Cookies)

Ingredients:

- 1 1/3 cup butter, room temperature
- ½ cup sugar
- 3 cups flour
- 1 jar apricot jam

Directions

- Preheat your oven to 350 degrees.
- Cream the butter with the sugar. Gradually incorporate the flour until it becomes a smooth dough. Refrigerate for about 10 minutes.
- On a clean work surface, work in small batches and roll out the dough to ¼-inch thick.
- Using a 2-inch round cookie cutter, cut out an even number of circles. Place on a slightly greased baking sheet.
- Refrigerate for half an hour.
- Bake for 10-12 minutes or until golden brown.
- Remove from the oven, transfer the cookies to a wire rack and cool completely.
- Spread the jam on one side of a cookie and sandwich with another.
- Enjoy!




Care of Plants and Flowers – Someone to oversee and care for the flowers, especially during Christmas and Easter seasons, and green plants throughout the building year round.

Reflecting on the Scriptures

"Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." John 2:7-10

"We want to be sure to have enough" are familiar words in planning for guests. "Do we have an adequate amount of brats, burgers, hors d'oeuvres, drinks?" And how embarrassing it would be to run out! Whether or not there is embarrassment when running out of wine at the Cana wedding we do not know, but it was not sufficient.

So, in this familiar Gospel, the wedding couple in Cana has run out of wine at the reception/celebration. Jesus and his family are guests. And His mom believes that her son, in his divinity, can remedy the situation, "Do whatever He tells you." Jesus takes the ordinary, the water, and is able to transform water into the very best wine.

Jesus is still transforming in our lives today. He works in my ordinary life, transforming me in my response to life's challenges, and changing my heart to love lavishly like He does. How does this transformation take place? It begins with knowing Jesus intimately and trusting Him without reservation. Consider Jesus' mother, Mary. She trusts that he will remedy the situation, even instructing the servants to follow his instructions. I, too, must trust, unreservedly in Jesus.

Jesus is authentic, that which satisfies. Am I settling for that which holds no lasting value in my life? Am I investing more time in movies, TV, cell phone and internet than I am in my relationship with Jesus? Am I seeking out Jesus rather than settling for that which holds no value?

Only Jesus can supply the real thing. Only He can transform each of us into the "best wine." I encourage you to focus on offering yourself to our Lord Jesus for transformation. When the offertory occurs at Mass, we offer bread and wine, work of human hands, and also the offering we place in the basket, as a symbol of ourselves. In effect, we are saying, "Here I am, Lord. Change me". AT the point in the mass, pray for your own transformation to become like Jesus--loving, merciful, forgiving. In receiving Jesus at Mass, we become more Christ -like.

WORKING WITH THE SCRIPTURES

The waiters at the wedding only did what they were told to do. It was their job to keep the six stone water jars filled and that's what they did. They were just doing their job...yet water was turned into wine.

Bernice is a clerk in one of the stores at the mall. Her job is to handle returns. It's a difficult job, especially right after Christmas. All the things that are the wrong size or the wrong color or that someone just doesn't like come back. And even though they might not have any receipt or other proof that the items were purchased at her store, the people who bring them back fully expect Bernice to refund their money. Unfortunately, Bernice's job requires that she ask some tough questions. And sometimes she has to refuse to give someone a refund (like when the item has obviously been worn or when the store hasn't carried that brand in years!). But somehow, even when she says "No". Bernice says it in such a way that the customer leaves feeling like she said "Yes". Bernice is good at turning the 'water' of their frustration into the 'wine' of satisfaction.

On the other hand Joe, who works in the hardware section of the same store, rarely says "Yes". And even when he does it usually comes out sounding more like "No". He never has time to check an item number or to see if there's a replacement in stock. And he's far too busy to try to explain that the reason something doesn't work might simply be that it needs to be plugged in. "It's not my job" is his motto and turning 'wine' into 'water' is what he does best.

Like Joe and Bernice, the waiters probably had plenty to do without having to keep filling water jars. Most of the guests had already arrived and there would have been little need for water to bathe a traveler's feet. But they did what Jesus told them to do. They did their job...and water was changed into wine. Funny how that can happen sometimes...at a wedding...or even at the mall.

Father RIPLEY'S-Believe It or Not!

At the end of this week, January 22, I invite you to take part in the Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children. We are called to pray, fast, or give alms for the sake of the most vulnerable in our society: those in the womb.

When I lead discussions about abortion with youth who aren't well-aquainted with the issue, one question I like to ask is: "How many abortion clinics do you think there are in Wisconsin?" Very often the group will guess a number in the 20s or much higher, whereas as of 2017 there were only 6 places offering abortion in this state. and none in the Green Bay Diocese. The point we discuss is that if abortion were an essential part of keeping people healthy (as is often said), we would need thousands more of them in our state. However, that is not true.

The next question I like to ask is: "How many abortions do you think have taken place in this country since 1973?" To this question, the group usually guesses a low number. They tend to guess thousands, tens of thousands, or maybe a million at most. If someone is confident in the answer of 60 million, he or she might second-guess oneself based on the other answers. Yet, that high number is about right.

Thankfully, abortion numbers have come down significantly from their highest point in 1990 and are now about half that, which is still an unbelievably high 620k-840k children lost to abortion last year, depending upon your source.

Just before 1990, when St. John Paul II came to the US, in his 1987 farewell speech he said, "America, your deepest identity and truest character as a nation is revealed in the position you take towards the human person. The ultimate test of your greatness is the way you treat every human being, but especially the weakest and most defenseless ones. The best traditions of your land presume respect for those who cannot defend themselves. If you want equal justice for all, and true freedom and lasting peace, then, America, defend life!" Believe it or not, but perhaps his words began to change the tide. St. JPII, pray for us!


