# Weekly Schedule

## More "Blah, Blah, Blah" from Msgr. Mark

committed parishioners who had been meeting with me for weeks on the matter, agreed that it was time to publicly announce an effort at tackling the parish's historic debt and, if possible, raising additional funds to replace the church's struggling HVAC system. Yes, the **We Believe Campaign** is now into its "terrible twos" ... but the story is just the opposite of terrible.

I made my own pledge that night in 2019, but as it took eight months for us to roll out the need and "the ask" to each of you in small groups, some of you are only sixteen months into your four-year commitment. That makes our progress so far all the more remarkable.

I have stashed the colorful pie-charts that we used to tell the story behind my office door, so whenever I close the door for an appointment, they wink at me. The one showed St. Michael's aggregate debt—a combination of the mortgage on our campus renovations twenty years ago, unpaid interest, school subsidy, unmet Annual Appeal targets, and miscellaneous bills—totaling \$2,374,013.

Our hope was to raise \$500,000 from the parish at large to match \$500,000 in monies that had been offered by special friends of the parish, which would earn an additional \$215,407 of forgiveness of unpaid interest from St. Ambrose Financial Services (the folks who have been "patiently" backing our debt). If we reached the goal to earn the second \$500,000, we agreed that extra monies would be used to replace St. Michael Church's HVAC system.

Well, your generosity has been outstanding! As of the second birthday of the Campaign, between "We Believe" contributions from folks both at St. Michael and Resurrection Parish and annual budget savings, we've paid down \$967,677 of principle on our debt and earned the write-off of \$129,161 of old interest. AND, having gone over the target in pledges, we moved ahead to replace the HVAC system at St. Michael's which was accomplished this fall. AND, thanks to some extraordinary late-arriving gifts specifically earmarked for that capital project, it too is already paid for. AND right now we continue to hold a little under \$400,000 in WB contributions in an interest-bearing account, so that when we transfer that to St. Ambrose Financial Services we will have reduced our debt to under \$1,000,000. Woo-hoo!

Now, if you think there is something wrong in my being giddy about being the pastor of a parish with a million-dollar debt, you just need to return to paragraph 3 above to consider where we started from. There are still two years (well, two years and eight months, for some) in the four-year life of the We Believe Campaign, some 106 parishioners are still working on paying down their pledges, and surprise contributions continue to come in.

It's time we replace the current (and outdated) WB progress board in the Gathering Area with something that reflects the continuing story of your generosity. In time, too, we will scrape the large script "We Believe" insignia off the entrance doors. But who's to say how far we may go? Happy Birthday, **We Believe Campaign**.

## Readings for the Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time (February 14)

(Leviticus 13:1-2,44-46; 1 Corinthians 10:31-11:1;  
Mark 1:40-45)

Today's portion from Leviticus is meant to help us appreciate first the needs of the leper and then Jesus' cleansing power. What Leviticus doesn't tell us, however, is that the category "leprosy" in biblical times was a lot broader than what we think of by the term today. Then, any kind of skin eruptions could ban you from fraternizing with the general population, leaving you generally "untouchable." Jesus displays a deep sensitivity here. First, he addresses the man's sense of isolation by touching him. Then, after curing the man of his sickness, he reminds him to follow the rules about getting checked out by a priest so he can be re-assimilated into life. *Have you experienced anything like this healing touch of Jesus?*

In the last two Lents, we have partnered with the folks at St. Anne Parish to offer a once-a-week opportunity for prayer and preaching for Lent. This year we are making a virtue out of necessity by venturing out on our own.

It will be a series of "live" Wednesday evenings at St. Michael's with a presentation on an aspect of Lenten practice nestled in some prayer that will be recorded and posted on the parish website to allow "virtual" viewing for the rest of the week. The presenters will be the parish clergy plus one special guest. So, be part of the live audience at 7:00 pm, or participate when you want ... or both. The first evening, February 24, will be hosted by Fr. Mark, and the title of the evening is *"One More Time, with Feeling: the Formula for a Having a Great Lent."*


