


# Parish Life

### More "Blah, Blah, Blah" from Msgr. Mark

After my morning ablutions and prayer, I start my day in front of the computer checking first overnight email (!) and then reviewing the

world and local news from various internet services ... one being Minnesota Public Radio. I know from Marathon County Minnesota sounds like foreign territory, but I was born and raised in La Crosse, and looking through our living room picture window every night as a kid, the sun set behind the bluffs on the western (Minnesota) side of the river. Beyond that, I went to seminary at St. John's Abbey in the Gopher State, and for half of my priesthood served in parishes where MPR stations were "local."

And that's why on Friday morning, May 6, I caught the news piece on the MPR website that Governor Tim Walz was rolling out a plan to bring his state out of COVID lockdown. Minnesotans, in my experience, are thoughtful people, not generally given to fads (well, I'm thinking of Minnesotans who live outside the Twin Cities). So here was a reasonable fellow, and a Democrat at that, setting some marks for lifting the restrictions we have all been living with for the last fourteen months. He spoke about eliminating limits on indoor gatherings by the end of May and then (perhaps), if vaccination rates continue on course, making masking optional come July. Now Wisconsin is not Minnesota ... for example, their governor and state assembly talk to each other ... but we are on the same path as they are on vaccinations, suggesting-ready or not-it's time for the grand experiment of life with COVID to move in a new direction. This is a long, slow build-up that we are planning to take several small steps towards normalcy here at the Eastside Parishes ... beginning this week with no longer asking you to register for seats at Sunday Mass.

Now don't get ahead of me yet. Distancing and masking are still part of our life, but after more than a year of having to decide early and locking in a spot for yourselves via our website or by a phone message, at the four weekend Masses next Sunday, May 22-23, seating will be like "the old days" ... on a first-come, first-served basis.

While that will be dropping one annoying chore, it also means that until the rules on distancing change, at a given Mass on a given Sunday you <u>may</u> find yourself showing up only to discover "there is no room in the inn" in the pews. We will have extra spaces, but they may be "partially obstructed" ... chairs in Resurrection's Francis Hall sharing in the liturgy through the large TV screens or in St. Michael's Gathering Area, peering around the large pillar and through the open glass doors. It's a first step ... but I am anticipating some directives from the Bishop coming soon, telling us we will be allowed to loosen up a few more.

On a related front, a long summer of pew-refinishing in both churches will begin this week, starting at St. Michael's. We will close off one section at a time (a fifth or a quarter of the pews at a shot), taking a week off here and there to avoid messing up Newman's Baccalaureate Mass and long-scheduled weddings. We will find a way of regaining any seating lost on a given Sunday to a finish still too sticky to touch. All funerals during these weeks of work will be at Resurrection (so take care of your health). Come July, the process will switch to Resurrection with the daily 12:10 pm Mass and funerals coming over to St. Michael's. It's what the road construction people call "progress."

#### Readings for the Feast of Pentecost May 23, 2021 (Acts 2:1-11; Galatians 5:16-25; John 15:26-27; 16:12-15)

"And they were <u>all</u> filled with the Holy Spirit." As the Easter season comes to a close, we celebrate the fulfillment of the Lord's promise: an Advocate who would come after him, a guiding Spirit that is God's own. The "all" who were filled with the Spirit may well embrace not only the apostles, but those who Acts 1:12-14 mentions as gathered in prayer with them after the Lord's Ascension: women who had journeyed with Jesus from Galilee (see Luke 8:1-3); Mary, his mother; and a hundred-twenty others. As the Book of Genesis speaks of God's "spirit" or "breath" blowing over the watery chaos, so the Scriptures view the coming of the Spirit on Pentecost as, in effect, a new creation, a renewal of creation ... empowering the disciples to do what they could not do of their own accord as witnesses to Jesus. How is the gift of the Spirit a new creation in you? What gift of the Spirit are you most in need of now?

Mental Health Awareness Month has been observed in the U.S. since 1949. The goal is to raise awareness of trauma and the impact it can have on the physical, emotional, and mental well-being of children, families, and communities. This year the theme is **Tools to Thrive** and the goal is to increase resilience regardless of your personal situation.

Gov. Tony Evers has declared May as **Resilient Wisconsin Month.** This initiative is to help people in Wisconsin who have been affected by trauma in everyday life. This includes events like COVID-19. Taking care of yourself during the last year with COVID has been challenging. Serving and taking care of others is also a calling that can take its toll. We all have learned and tried to navigate the traumatic events and emotions experienced by others as well as our own.

Resilience is the ability to adapt and recover from adversity within ourselves and our relationships and our communities. To quote from Gov. Evers' May 2021 proclamation:

The challenges of the past year have required all Wisconsinites, from our youngest kids to our aging and older adults, to display remarkable resilience, and it is resilience that is going to carry our state forward in the coming year and beyond. The COVID-19 pandemic has presented unique and unprecedented challenges for all Wiscon-sinites, and especially for folks already affected by anxiety, depression, trauma, toxic stress, and those who have other mental and behavioral health needs. We recognize that resilience does not mean having to endure challenges alone, that the key to a stronger, more connected, and thriving Wisconsin lies in promoting supportive, healthy relationships and ensuring that every person knows it is okay to ask for help.

### Wisconsin is resilient, and resilience will move Wisconsin forward.




