More "Blah, Blah, Blah" from Msgr. Mark

Though my parents died some time ago (my Dad forty-five years back and my Mom a dozen years ago), with every

additional year I've become **more aware** of their presence, not less. I know that sounds odd, but when my Mom was just a phone call away, it was easy to assume she would always be available ... and so not make the call. I suspect this is a positive fruit of growing older. In my morning prayer, I find myself thinking about my folks, my uncles and aunts, and teachers. A line I remember from somewhere is that "for anyone to survive infancy they must be loved more than they deserve." It has taken me a while, but I now understand that better.

Memorial Day, of course, has its origins in our country's desire—after the enormous bloodletting of the Civil War—to honor the sacrifice of the soldierly dead in that conflict by decorating their graves. From that, it grew into a day to remember all who sacrificed their lives in defense of our nation, and since World War II it seems to have grown into something of a secular "All Souls Day"—that is, an occasion to remember all of our deceased family and friends. While Memorial Day has also become "the starting gun to summer," I hope it is more for you than a delightful three-day weekend or the occasion to go up north and open up the cabin.

It would be a good day, for example, to pull out old photo albums and reminisce ... to call a sibling or parent and reconnect ... or to walk through a cemetery, pause before one of the many flag-marked gravestones of veterans, and lift a word of gratitude on behalf of this someone who (while not knowing you or me) paid the highest price for us all. And here's a prayer you are invited to use:

In the quiet sanctuaries of my heart, let me name and call on the One whose power over us is great and gentle, firm and forgiving, holy and healing.

You who created me, who sustain me, who call me to live in peace with all, hear our prayer today.

Hear my prayer for all who have died, whose hearts and hopes are known to you alone.

Hear my prayer for those who put the welfare of others ahead of their own (and give me a heart as generous as theirs).

Hear my prayer for those who gave their lives in every kind of service for others, and accept the gift of their sacrifice.

Help us all to shape and make a world where we will lay down the arms of war and turn our swords into ploughshares for a harvest of justice and peace forever.

Comfort those who grieve, and let your healing be the hope in their hearts.

Hear my prayer today and in your mercy answer me in the name of all that is holy.

Readings for the Feast of the Body and Blood of the Lord June 6

Exodus 24:3-8; Hebrews 9:11-15; Mark 14:12-16,22-26

Covenant is at the heart of each of the Scriptures for this feast. We actually hear the word at every Mass as we are reminded in the account of the Last Supper as part of the Eucharistic Prayer (and today's Gospel). For the ancient Israelites, a covenant was an agreement between two parties, which entailed both responsibilities and benefits. The first reading tells of the event that sealed the covenant between God and the Israelites at Mt. Sinai; in the Gospel, it is set in the annual commemoration of the Exodus, many generations later, as Jesus celebrates a Passover meal with his disciples—with his own blood, rather than that of sacrificed animals. *What are our benefits in the New Covenant Jesus established at the Last Supper? What are our responsibilities?*

A 9:00 am Morning Mass for Memorial Day at the St. Joseph and St. Michael Cemeteries

What with Monday, the 31st, being a national day of remembrance, first for our military dead and then for all of our deceased, Fr. Mark was again thinking that holding out for our usual 5:30 pm Monday Mass time would be rather unhelpful. We had a good crowd at Memorial Day Mass in the parish cemeteries off Grand Avenue in 2019, while COVID concerns caused us to pass on it last year. Weather permitting, that's where we will be at **9:00 am on Monday, May 31**, this year. Please bring your own chair for seating. In case of snow, rain, or sleet, the Mass will relocate to the Church of the Resurrection.



And the Summer Wednesday Evening Bible Study will be on ... the Prophets

New people are still welcome to join the group, but the polls have closed for balloting for the Summer Bible Study ... and even without a recount, it's clear the winner will be the Old Testament prophets. The first meeting will be this Wednesday, June 2nd, at 6:30 pm. This will be a face-to-face, masking-welcomed-but-not-required event ... but to give people the space they need, the venue has moved from Resurrection Francis Hall to Krasowski Hall (cafeteria) at St. Michael's. Current COVID procedures at Sunday Masses at the Eastside Parishes

ACTION PLAN			
WHO	WHAT	WHEN	HOW

As the expectations have changed considerably over the last few weeks, here's a rundown of our standard operating procedures at our worship due to COVID:

- Anyone with fever or flu-like symptoms should not attend Mass; for the time being the dispensation from Sunday obligation extended by Bishop Callahan remains in place.
- You no longer need to register. Seating is on a first-come, first-served basis.
- As of June 1, for the unvaccinated, the continued wearing of face coverings and social distancing is highly encouraged but not required; those who have been vaccinated are still welcome to mask but need not.
- Most of each church will be available for general seating, with a couple of exceptions: first, the pew at the front and the pew at the back of each section will continue to have an empty "buffer" row (behind or ahead of it) for those who would welcome more space between them and others.
- The second exception is that, for the near future, the 7:30 am Mass at Resurrection will continue to require 6' distancing and the wearing of masks by all.
- The worship area for families with young children at St. Michael's (aka "Cry Room") is again available.
- Taking the offering "passively" at the entrances of the church will continue for now.
- A procession at Communion will return to the three lines that was our pre-COVID practice.
- Our current Mass schedule (one on Saturday late afternoon and three on Sunday morning) is only for the time being, and we expect to adjust worship times again as we edge our way back to "normal."

Stay tuned. It all might change tomorrow. 😊
