More "Blah, Blah, Blah" from Msgr. Mark

I am relieved to have turned the calendar page to June. The City of Wausau's masking resolution has run out; we have

managed the transition out of the protocols our Bishop had asked us to follow when "public" Mass returned in May 2020 after the initial lockdown; the school year is behind us. Maybe I am projecting, but I sense a general easing of the strain we've all been living with. It has been a long year (well, fifteen months).

It's not, of course, that we are absolutely out of the woods. There continues to be news items about a spike in virus cases in one place or another, though (perhaps not to spoil our mood) the media outlets have evidently buried stories about the sad situation in places like Brazil and India where the virus is still ascendent. As much as I am tempted to burn my little basket of masks, there are still places in the community (hospitals, care facilities, and in the homes of folks with delicate health) where they will still be expected. It would be naïve to think that I can ditch them. Maybe I will at least move them to a closet.

On a distantly related front, the refinishing of the first section of pews at St. Michael's (an unforeseen consequence of the sanitizing of the pews as called for by the bishop during the last year) came off without a hitch. We pushed "pause" on that effort to make room in the calendar for Newman's Baccalaureate Mass and Saturday's wedding, but starting again tomorrow (June 7th) the workmen will be back to tackle the next section. The plan is to do one section a week going forward, completing the project before the month is over. Because of that work and the abiding fumes for a few days after, while St. Michael's Church will be available for Sundays, funerals and other big events will be redirected to Resurrection Church for the next three weeks. [Dare I dream that the Angel of Death will take a vacation?] In July, the refinishing shoppe will move to Resurrection, daily Masses (and any request for a funeral) will be heading over to St. Michael's. I agree it's disruptive, but it is sure handy to have a second church building ten blocks away.

There are other "orange cone" maintenance projects at the parishes this summer. The greenspace on the south (McClellan Street side) at Resurrection Church will get some plantings and a supportive ramp rail ... putting things back into shape there after the drainage project work that we did last fall. Back at St. Michael's, some stretches of sidewalk and curbing between the church and school entrances (and the rectory driveway) will be replaced.

As far as I am concerned, the BIG WORK of the summer will be personal: inviting back into active service our many liturgical ministers, calling forth new volunteers for training, and (now that Bishop Callahan has announced that he be lifting the dispensation from Sunday Mass obligation beginning June 26-27) inviting all our healthy members to return to Sunday worship. Watch your mail. He will be sending us all a letter in a week. I know, summer (after more than a year of being cooped up) may not seem the ideal time for all of this, but it's going to take a while to rev the parish machine back up. I am a firm believer in the truth of Aesop's Fable of the Tortoise and the Hare: "slow and steady wins the race" ... and the time for us turtles to start moving is now.

There's a bumper sticker you might have seen: "If 'God is your co-pilot' ... change seats." Our scriptures today are saying much the same thing, emphasizing that we are not self-made, and the work we do is ultimately not ours. The Gospel presents two parables that focus on God's work within us. In the first, Jesus compares the growth of God's Kingdom on earth to His creative power working mysteriously in the world of nature. In the second parable, Jesus compares the development of the Kingdom from a small seed that grows wondrously into the largest of plants. *How do these images of God working in nature help you understand His working in you?*

Current COVID procedures at Sunday Masses at the Eastside Parishes

As the expectations have changed considerably over the last few weeks, here's a rundown of our standard operating procedures at our worship due to COVID:

- Bishop Callahan has announced that beginning June 26-27 the dispensation from the obligation to worship will be lifted, and he welcomes all "who are able and well" to return to in-person participation.
- Anyone with fever or flu-like symptoms should not attend Mass.
- You no longer need to register. Seating is on a first-come, first-served basis.
- For the unvaccinated, the continued wearing of face coverings and social distancing is highly encouraged but not required; those who have been vaccinated are still welcome to mask but need not.
- Most of each church will be available for general seating, with a couple of exceptions: first, the pew at the front and the pew at the back of each section will continue to have an empty "buffer" row (behind or ahead of it) for those who would welcome more space between them and others.
- The second exception is that, for the near future, the 7:30 am Mass at Resurrection will continue to require 6' distancing and the wearing of masks by all.
- The worship area for families with young children at St. Michael's (aka "Cry Room") is again available.
- Taking the offering "passively" at the entrances of the church will continue for now.
- A procession at Communion will return to the three lines that was our pre-COVID practice.
- Our current Mass schedule (one on Saturday late afternoon and three on Sunday morning) is only for the time being, and we expect to adjust worship times again as we edge our way back to "normal."

Stay tuned. It all might change tomorrow. 😊




